Cal State Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement, for five students, took place in 1960.

# **Cal State Fullerton Campus**

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 25,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes; some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 87 degree programs - 41 of them at the graduate level plus several credential programs and five certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally-known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded lighted softball fields. The latest addition was the 1989 opening of the on-campus Marriott Hotel.

The long awaited reality of an on campus football/soccer complex and baseball and softball stadium, track and tennis courts is drawing near. The nationally ranked Titan baseball team opens at its new stadium this April and the football team will play all of its home games in the sports complex this upcoming season.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.



# **1992 SEASON PREVIEW**

Winning has become a tradition for the Cal State Fullerton softball team. In Head Coach Judi Garman's 12 years at the helm, the Titans are 612-175-4 (.778). Last season Fullerton finished 52-16-1 overall and 25-9-1 (third place) in the nationally prominent Big West Conference. The 1991 season was outstanding on paper with winning records and a final national ranking of third, but it ended in disappointment. The Titans fell in three games, 3-2 (10 innings), 1-2, and 1-5 to Long Beach State in the NCAA Regionals.

Garman sets high goals for her teams and she expects nothing

but the best effort from her players.

"We've been disappointed in the last few seasons by not getting out of regionals," said Garman. "The goal this year is to get out of regionals and make it back to Oklahoma City."

The attempt to reach the College World Series will be led by nine returning players, five of whom were starters, including one 1991 First-

Team All-America.

Junior pitcher Tiffany Boyd is expected to be a big factor in the success of this year's team. Last season, aside from being an All-America, Boyd was named Co-Big West Pitcher of the Year, First-Team All-Conference and First-Team All-West Region. She finished the season with a 33-8 record and a 0.68 ERA. She was twice named conference Pitcher of the Week and pitched her first collegiate perfect game against Cal. Boyd led the conference in wins and strikeouts (246). Her 33 wins tied for second in the NCAA. In November Boyd underwent arthroscopic surgery on her right knee, but she is expected to completely recover before the regular season.

"Tiffany may be even more motivated this year than she was after red-shirting her sophomore year," said Garman. "Due to her injury,

I think she feels that she has something to prove."

Next up in the Titan pitching rotation is senior Ann Van Dortrecht. She hopes to return to her 1990 form when she was named a Second-Team All-America and finished 29-12 with a 0.43 ERA. If that happens, the Titan pitching staff could dominate a very competitive Big West Conference. Last year, Van Dortrecht was named Second-Team All-Big West Conference and finished with a record of 17-4 and 1.00 ERA with 163 strikeouts.

Other returning starters who will play a big part in a successful season are seniors Kim Powers and KC Clark and sophomore Kelly Hunt.

Powers, a catcher, hit .253 and led the team in putouts last year with 393. She is a strong hitter as she tallied 19 RBI and was second on the squad in home runs with two.

"Kim does a great job handling the pitchers," Garman said.
"Her leadership on the infield is going to be very important this year."

Hunt, a first baseman, hit .242 last year with 52 hits and 20 RBI and led the team in home runs with three and game-winning hits with eight. She was honored as Second-Team All-Big West Conference and Second-Team All-West Region.

"Kelly was a clutch hitter for us last year, and I am looking

forward to more of the same this season," said Garman.

Powers and Hunt will be the glue that holds together a young infield that graduated three starters in Diana Forman, Joy Tiner and Jill Matyuch.

The outfield will be anchored by 1991 Second-Team All-West Region centerfielder Clark, who last season hit .206 with 39 hits, 18 runs, eight RBI and a perfect stolen base percentage (7 for 7).

Other returnees are outfielders Jennifer Shuey, Jstone Vines and

Melissa Hadfield and utility player Karin Knoop.

Shuey batted .273 last year, fourth best on the team, and led the team with a perfect 1.000 fielding percentage. In 40 games, she had 21 hits, 9 RBI and 3 doubles. Shuey had the game-winning hit over conference rival Long Beach State at regionals. Shuey, along with Hadfield, ended the season with a team-high five-game hitting streak.

Vines saw most of her action last year as the designated player and as a pinch runner. With her speed, she led the team with 17 (for 21) stolen bases - sixth best in the Big West. In 63 games and 94 at bats, she had

20 hits and 21 runs.

Hadfield's .297 batting average last year leads all returning players. As a part-time starter in 42 games with 74 at bats, she tallied 22 hits, 7 runs and 6 RBI.

Recovering from a broken jaw sustained during fall practice, Knoop looks forward to playing again. Last year, starting 33 games, she hit .161 with 10 hits and 11 runs.

There are going to be plenty of new faces this year, as nearly half of the team are either true freshmen or red-shirts.

"This is the biggest turnover we've ever had," said Garman. "Basically, we have a new infield. I am excited about the talent and depth of this team, but it is going to take some time for them to gel."

Two key newcomers will be shortstop Denise DeWalt from Bakersfield, a junior transfer from Cedarville College in Ohio, and freshman pitcher

Cheryl Longeway of Cypress.

DeWalt was a 1990 Second-Team NAIA All-America, All-NAIA District 22 and All-Western Buckeye Collegiate Conference selection. She was the NAIA batting champion with a .615 average and led the nation in hits (2.21) and doubles (0.62) per game, plus she finished second in runs (1.47) and 13th in RBI (1.00).

Longeway was named First-Team All-CIF, The <u>Register</u> and <u>L.A. Times</u> First-Team All-Orange County, and First-Team All-Garden Grove League all four years at Kennedy High School. She was 20-4 with 268 strikeouts and an ERA of 0.23 in her senior year. In her four-year career, she was 83-15 with 890 strikeouts.

"We have high expectations of how well Cheryl is going to do," says Garman. "With Tiffany just coming off of surgery, Cheryl will have

to do a lot of pitching for us in February."

Other freshmen newcomers are Marci White from Long Beach, Traci Fischer from Arcadia, Shannon Dolan from Fountain Valley, Rose Garces from La Mirada, Tracie Noggle from Yorba Linda, Heidi Robertson from Bakersfield and Kari Escobedo from Buena Park.

White, a third baseman from Millikan High School, batted .472 with 10 home runs and was named First-Team All-Moore League in her senior year and the team's Outstanding Offensive Player of the Year.

Fischer, an infielder, earned varsity letters in both softball and soccer her three years at Arcadia High School. Her senior year she was named First-Team All-Pacific league and First-Team All-CIF.

A catcher from Fountain Valley High School, Dolan was named first-team all-league and First-Team All-CIF all four years. She was honored as league MVP her senior year and played on the Orange County Batbusters. The Batbusters were national champions four years and finished second last year.

Garces will be a utility player for the Titans. In her senior year at La Mirada High School she hit .416 with four home runs and 14 RBI in leading her team to the CIF championship. She was named All-CIF and

all-league her senior year.

Another infielder is Noggle from Esperanza High School. Her honors include being twice named First-Team All-Empire League and team MVP her senior year. Last season she batted .452 and was voted E.H.S. Women's Athletics Award Honoree.

A transfer from Boise State, Robertson will add depth to the outfield and speed to the basepaths. She did not play softball at BSU. In her senior year at North High School, she batted .592 with 24 RBI and 32 stolen bases and was named first-team all-league, first-team all-area and All-Central Section MVP.

Escobedo red-shirted last season and was involved with the team as a manager. She was named first-team all-league in her three years at Buena Park High School. Her senior year, she was named First-Team All-CIF and was voted Best Offensive Player with a .382 batting average.

The last new face may be a familiar one to fans of the women's basketball team. Senior Joey Ray, a starting guard on Coach Dr. Maryalyce Jeremiah's team, will be a walk-on infielder this year. Her last time in a softball uniform was her senior year at Lodi High School. Ray played basketball, softball and volleyball earning Athlete of the Year accolades.

With all of the returnees and newcomers mentioned above coupled with the outstanding coaching staff of Garman, seventh-year Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk and eighth-year Assistant Coach Linda

Shafor, the Titans are looking forward to the 1992 season.

The new season begins February 13 through 16 as the Titans travel to Tucson to compete in the 16-team Arizona Tournament and then travel to Las Vegas for the 11-team UNLV Spring Fling. The Titans also host the annual PONY Tournament on March 25 through 29. This year's 16-team PONY features the best softball competition in the country. The regular season ends in the beginning of May and the NCAA Regionals are May 15 and 16 with the College World Series being held May 20 through 25.



# Head Coach Judi Garman, 13th Year

Inher twelve seasons at Cal State Fullerton, Judi Garman has led the Titans to no worse than a ninth-place national finish, an NCAA National Championship (1986) and 612 victories. Garman is the only coach in the program's history and has accumulated 823 career victories, which is more wins than any other collegiate coach.

Garman established the program in 1980 and finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth nationally. Since then, Garman's teams have won eight conference titles and six out of nine regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987, and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Since the conference became the PCAA in 1986 and Big West in 1989, Garman has tallied an impressive overall record of 312-93-2 (.770) and 152-50-2 (.752) record in conference games. During those six years, the PCAA and Big West have been among the nation's elite.

Garman's tremendous success at Fullerton is only the latest in a remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Garman earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211-40.

Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions.

Very involved professionally, Garman last year completed a two-year reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association. Each year, she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

In February, 1991, Garman was honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles for her contribution to collegiate athletics in Southern California.

Apopular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. She runs a camp each summer in Italy. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins.





# SUPPORT STAFF



Assistant Coach Kathy Van Wyk

Returning to Cal State Fullerton last season was Kathy Van Wyk, a former softball player and assistant coach at Fullerton.

Van Wyk, 31, was the Titans' assistant coach from 1983 to 1987 and was a part of the 1986 national championship team. After coaching at Fullerton, Van Wyk became a private pitching instructor at Rod Carew's Baseball School from 1987 to 1989. Then she went to Azzano Decimo, Italy, to be head coach of the Azzanase Softball Club. Recently, she completed production on four instructional video tapes on pitching and catching. From January through March she was the pitching coach for the Walkerville Softball Club in Adelaide, South Australia.

A Titan pitcher in 1982, Van Wyk finished 35-1 (35 wins is still a school record) with an ERA of 0.18 and earned AIAW and NCAA All-America honors and won the Broderick Award, which honors the most outstanding collegiate softball player. She also was named WCAA All-Conference, Orange County Athlete of the Month, PONY All-Tournament pitcher and she was awarded an NCAA post-graduate scholarship with a 3.43 grade point average. Her 1982 stats include 4 no-hitters, back-to-back perfect games, 27 shutouts, 278 innings pitched, 270 strikeouts and 6 one-hitters.

Van Wyk began her collegiate softball career at Texas Women's University before transferring to Fullerton. At TWU, she was named Texas AIAW Player of the Year in 1979, along with many other honors. She transferred to Fullerton in 1981 after TWU dropped softball.

A 1983 graduate from Fullerton with a Bachelor of Science in physical education, Van Wyk is currently working on her Master's Degree in PE at Azusa Pacific. She is single and resides in Anaheim Hills.



Assistant Coach Linda Shafor

An integral part of the Titan coaching staff, Linda Shafor returns to the Titans for her eighth season as a part-time assistant coach with a direct responsibility in overseeing Fullerton's outfield. Shafor had worked with Garman in the latter's rookie season and returned to the program in 1986 in time to help the Titans win the NCAA Championship.

Coach Shafor possesses a wide and varied softball background from her playing days with the Sun City Saints (1966-67) to serving as the player-coach for the Huntington Park Blues in 1970. Shafor was head coach at LA Harbor College from 1971 until 1979. She was an assistant coach at the University of Arizona for one season prior to joining the Titans in 1980.

Shereturned to Harbor College and is currently a physical education and math professor.

Shafor is a 1966 graduate of Ohio State with a bachelor's degree in physical education. She received her master's degree in PE at Long Beach State.

She is single and resides in Cerritos.



Women's Trainer Julie Max

Now entering her thirteenth year with her alma mater, women's trainer Julie Max plays a major role in the CSUF women's softball program as well as all eight of the university's women's sports programs.

In June of 1990, Julie was elected to the office of district director -representing California, Nevada and Hawaii in the National Athletic Trainers Association. Currently, Max is serving as vice-president of NATA. It is the third highest position in NATA behind executive director and president and she is the first woman to hold the position.

Max has been recognized in the past on the national level for her outstanding abilities including serving as the administrative coordinator for volleyball and fencing at the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles.

She earned her Bachelors of Science degree from Cal State Fullerton in 1978 and received a Masters of Education with an emphasis in PE at Azusa Pacific University. Max became a Certified Athletic Trainer following graduation in 1979 and is also a Certified Emergency Medical Technician.

Max is single and resides in Placentia.

# **1991 SEASON IN REVIEW**



In 12 seasons at Cal State Fullerton, Head Coach Judi Garman has led the Titans to never worse than a ninth place national finish, an NCAA national championship in 1986 and 612 victories. The 1991 season was another strong campaign for Cal State Fullerton. The Titans finished 52-16-1 overall, 25-9-1 in the nationally prominent Big West Conference (3rd place), and earned a final national ranking of third.

Highlights from the 1991 season included 18-game and 11-game win streaks plus come-from-behind victories in extra innings over nationally ranked Oklahoma State (2-1) in the PONY Tournament and Long Beach State (7-4). The Titans defeated Big West rival UNLV, 5-0, in the championship game of the PONY Invitational to take the title for the first time in four years. In a two game sweep of Cal, sophomore pitcher Tiffany Boyd threw one perfect game (her second no-hitter of the season) and six and a third more innings of perfection before surrendering two hits to the Golden Bears. The perfect game came against All-American Michelle Granger and resulted in a 1-0 Titan win. Cal State Fullerton pitchers were 13th in the country in team ERA (0.88) and defensively the Titans were sixth nationally with a fielding percentage of .970.

Individually, Boyd and outfielder Mich DeBree took the top honors in being named First-Team and Third-Team All-Americans, respectively. Boyd finished 1991 with a 33-8 record with a 0.68 ERA and she finished second in the nation in most victories. DeBree led the Titans in batting with a .313 batting average and team-high 70 hits, 33 runs, 9 doubles, 4 triples and 87 total bases. Boyd and pitcher Ann Van Dortrecht, shortstop Jill Matyuch, DeBree, first baseman Kelly Hunt and third baseman Joy Tiner (honorable mention) were named to the Big West All-Conference softball team. Named to the All-West Region team were Boyd, Van Dortrecht, Matyuch and DeBree.

In the classroom and on the field, Matyuch excelled. She was honored as a Second-Team Academic All-America with a 3.71 grade point average. As the squad's starting shortstop, Matyuch had a .299 batting average and team-high 22 RBI and 8 game winning hits.

For the 12th consecutive year, Cal State Fullerton qualified for the NCAA post-season tournament. The Titans lost the best of three series, at Titan Softball Complex, to conference rival Long Beach State. The Titans won game one by the score of 3-2 in 10 innings but dropped two close games on Saturday. The 49ers, along with UNLV and Fresno State, advanced to the 1991 College World Series in Oklahoma City.




