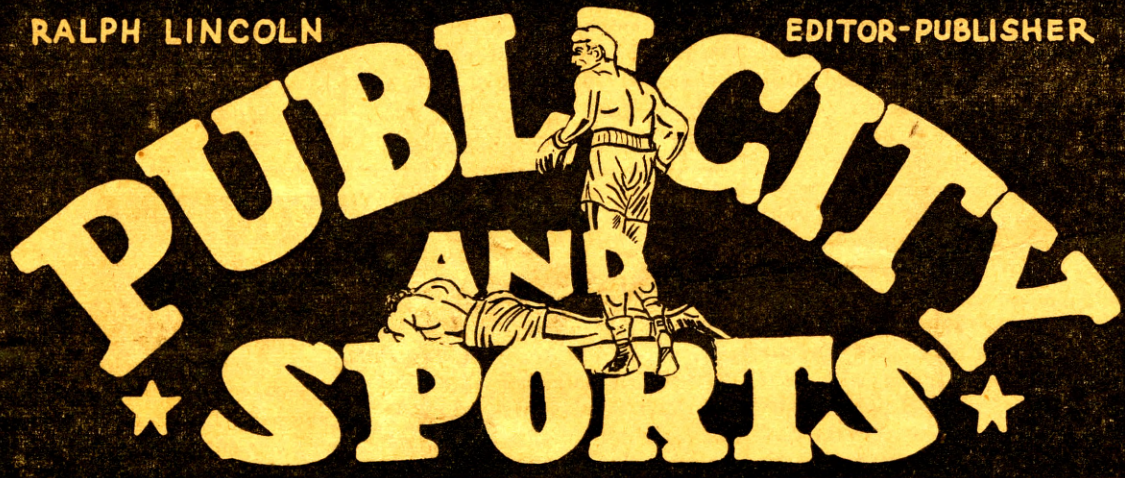

In their "Oscar winner" last September, this pair had the fight fans at the Olympic hoarse from hollering with excitement from first round until the final bell when Lauro earned the decision.

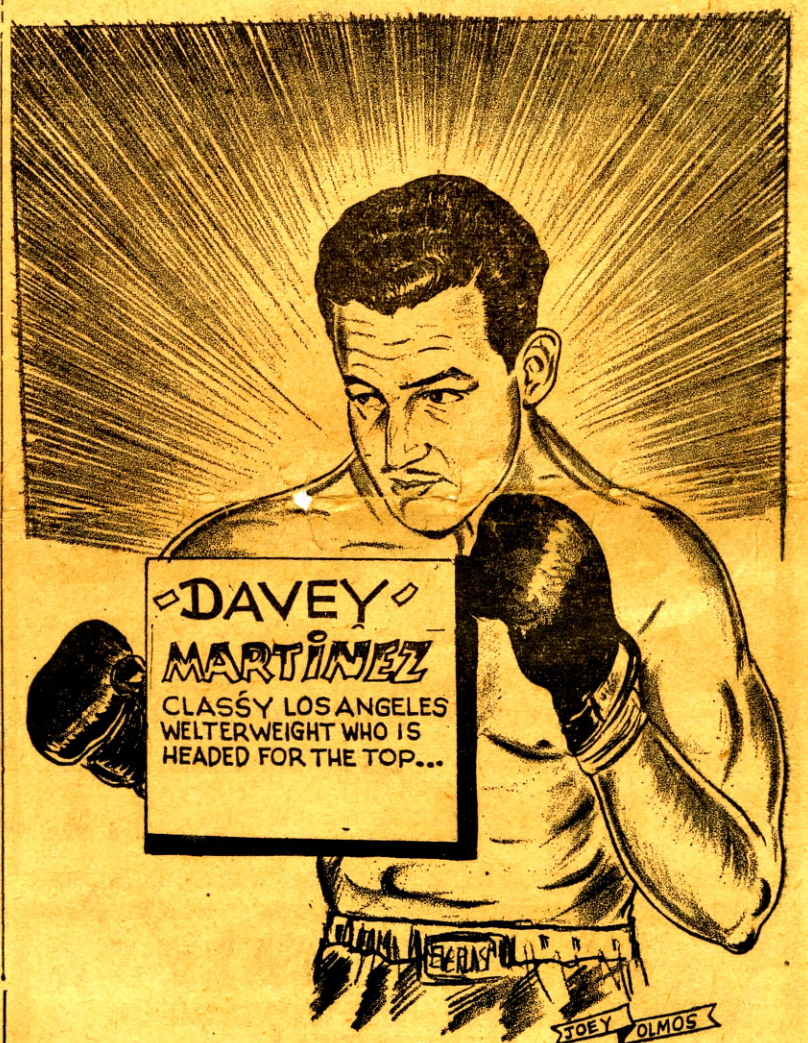
In the very first round Mr. Salas sat Mr. Ortiz on his pretty panties and although the champion took a count of nine, he got up

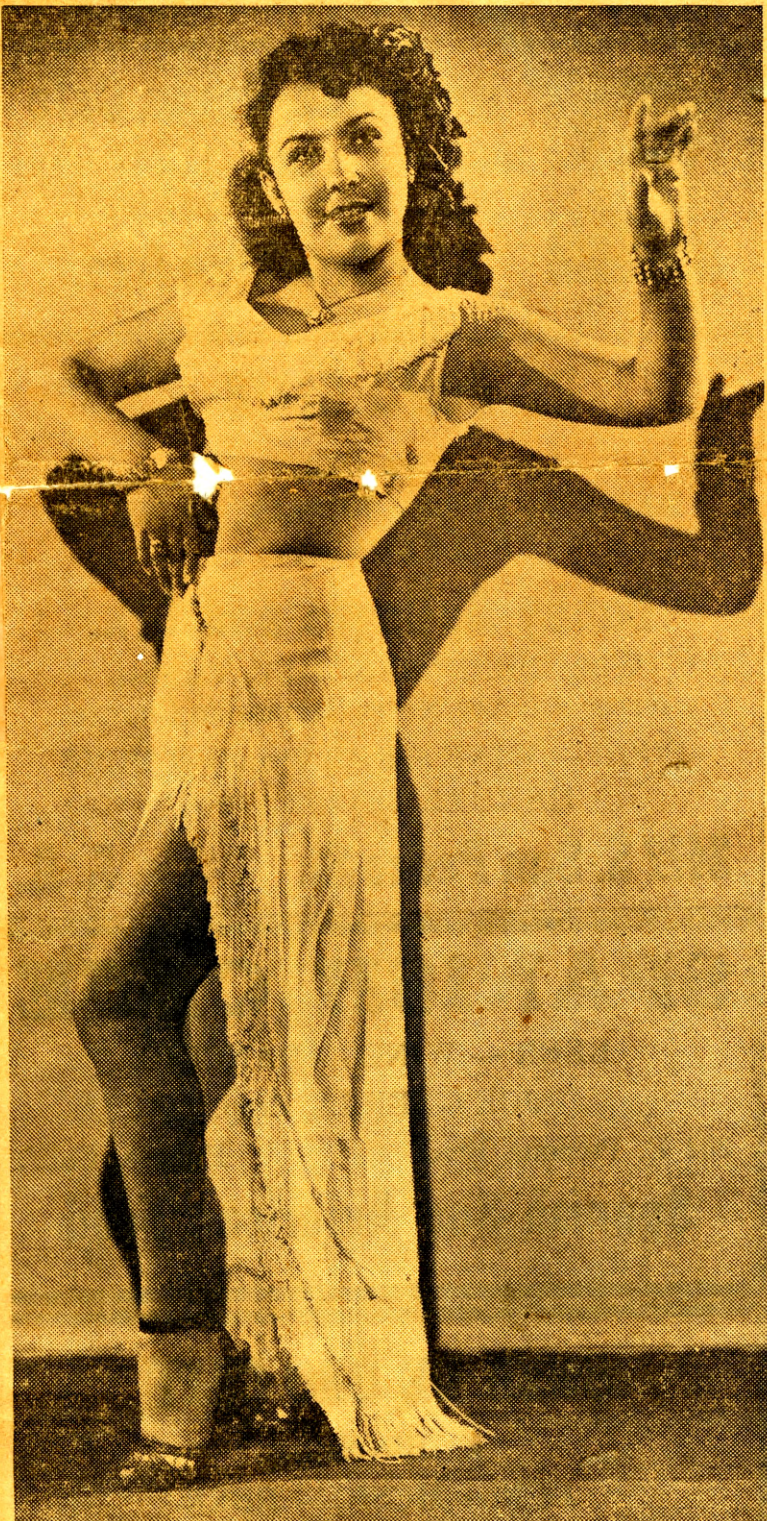
However, beginning this weekend (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) an orchestra will take the place of the mariachi as after taken up a vote between the Latin Post's
