





MARIA REYES

This happened a long time ago in the land of Truth.

People congregated to listen to a committee dedicated to end poverty. The poor were there too. They wanted to know more about their "illness." They were willing to listen to the experts.

The well to do were there out of social interest in their community, and to gawk at their neighbors. They were interested in the complacency of the middle class, and in the 'I don't care what anybody thinks of me' of the poor people.

The middle class, or the heads of the community were, soon after the meeting started, snoring away.

Perhaps congregated is the wrong word; they assembled. The poor were up front, since they were the most important. The middle class were in the middle, and the rich were in the last rows.

"Ladies and gentlemen. I am here, not to tell you something new, but to expose to you what has been hidden from view for so long. Poverty is a sickness. It must be treated as a sickness. The remedies are many but....

"I wonder how much they are going to pay him, just for giving this silly speech."

Thought N\_\_\_ as he scratched his unshaven face.

"It will not be easy. Nobody will get money for training right away. The money they will be getting will not just fall into their laps. They must work for it. By work I mean interest, willingness to learn more about the different programs offered. Some programs offer . . .

"Boy if they could just gimmi some money. I'd invest it and become rich in no time." Wishful thought, while he spit on the floor.

"..... I want to listen to your ideas.

I want this to be a community project, a
living idea for the community, not just a program of the imagination.

Mayor Grum: "The community has shown its interest by the attendance of almost 7% of the city population. We are very proud to have here tonight the leaders of our community."

"ZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZ

"Yes, but why don't we have more representation of the poor and less of the middle class? After all we are the ones with the problem not them. Is it because, those of us who are poor do not know what is best for us or what?"

In the first place, Mr. Wishful, nobody came forward when we asked for leaders from your side of town. Nobody. Out of fear of being turned down by us. I know that some of you wanted to come, and had in fact prepared yourselves to be turned down.

Some of you were going to tell everybody that we hadturned you down because we did not want you to find out what we were doing with the money. We are not afraid. The only one you will hurt is yourself. I get paid well for my work, but I could get as much money doing another job, that does not cost me as much time or headaches. I am here because I want to help and I assume you are here because you want to be helped. As I said before poverty is a sickness. It can breed lack of dignity, and the cry that others are robbing you of your dignity; lack of trust, among yourselves and with others; self discrimination, for woe to the person that accepts society's values, that wants something more from life than self-inflicted kicks. He wants a breath of fresh air, and not the foul odor of hate, revenge, and the smell of too many kids. What do you do to him? You ridicule him. Even if he escapes from your clutches, he still suffers ridicule from the middle class. But I got side-tracked. Please forgive me and give me your suggestions. The success of the program depends on you.

Ten years later there were no more poor people. Everybody lived unhappily ever after....they were all asleep, and having nightmares.





# It's All Over

The Los Angeles Dodgers compounded the frustration already evident in the lives of Giants fans everywhere by coming out of the runnerup slot with 16 wins in their last 17 games to edge the Frankfurters for the national league pennant.
