


## Cal State Fullerton Campus Profile

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies, such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959, and the first commencement (for five students) was in 1960.

The University's 22,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Many students commute each day to and from classes;

some come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 700-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, communications, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told there are 94 degree programs — 44 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours



without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationallyknown professional artists to Cal State Fullerton for residencies and public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups.

Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

The Ruby Gerontology Center serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the opening of a Marriott hotel on campus in 1989, the University and the city of Fullerton opened the Titan Sports Complex in 1992. A 10,000-seat multipurpose stadium, an adjoining baseball stadium and a separate track facility are newly completed features of the complex.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State Fullerton has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.

The National Softball Coaches Association annually honors the top collegiate softball players with the selection of the NSCA All-America teams. Head coaches choose three teams with 13 athletes on the first and second teams and 15 athletes on the third team. The teams are announced each year in conjunction with the College Softball World Series in May in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. Cal State Fullerton's All-America history is deep, with at least one selection on every team except


two since the program was launched in 1980. Nineteen different Titan players have been selected to

a total of 25 All-America berths. First baseman Sue Lewis is the only three-time winner among the Titans. Tiffany Boyd, Denise DeWalt, Susan LeFebvre and Chenita Rogers are two-time winners.


Long regarded as one of the top softball coaches in the nation, Judi Garman saw that reputation permanently acknowledged on Dec. 4, 1993, when she was elected to the National Softball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

The nation's winningest collegiate coach with 940 victories -- 211 at Golden West Junior College in Huntington Beach and 729 at Cal State Fullerton -- was enshrined at a banquet in Atlantic City, New Jersey. Her career record is 729-247-4 (.746) at the Division I level and 940-287-4 (.765) including eight seasons at Golden West.

The induction is only the latest in a seemingly endless

stream of honors and accomplishments for Garman, who established the CSUF softball program in 1980 and never has placed lower than ninth in the nation in her 15 seasons. Her inaugural team finished third in the conference, second in the region and ninth in the AIAW Tournament. Since then, Garman's teams have won or shared eight conference titles and six regional championships while finishing second in the College World Series in 1981, 1983 and 1985; third in 1982 and 1987 and winning the 1986 NCAA Championship.

Garman's accomplishments stretch across the continent from Canada to Santa Barbara to Golden West College to Cal









State Fullerton. She earned her bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1966 and moved to California where she began working on her master's degree at UCSB. While at Santa Barbara, she started club softball and soon had a varsity team. Upon completion of her studies, she took the women's athletic director position at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached the volleyball, basketball and tennis programs in addition to softball.

Garman moved to Golden West College where, along with softball, she coached basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79). Garman coached the Rustlers' softball team to an unprecedented four consecutive national championships (1975-78) while compiling a record of 211-40 (1972-79). Twenty-one of her softball players received scholarships to four-year institutions. Due to those outstanding feats at GWC she was

named to the California Community College Hall of Fame in 1992.

When she came to Fullerton there was no on-campus diamond. Her first five teams called a municipal facility at Lions Field their home diamond until an outstanding two-diamond complex with lights was constructed as part of a joint venture with the city of Fullerton.

Very involved professionally, Garman served a two-year reign as president of the National Softball Coaches Association from 1990-1991. Each year she hosts clinics which bring over 200 coaches and 1,500 players to the campus. Additionally, she has produced highly successful pitching video tapes with acclaimed pitching coach Don Sarno.

In February, 1991, Garman was honored at the Fifth Annual National Girls and Women in Sports Luncheon sponsored by the Amateur Athletic Founda-

tion of Los Angeles for her contribution to collegiate athletics in Southern California.

A popular speaker at clinics around the country, Garman has also made numerous trips abroad to Holland, Italy, Czechoslovakia and Japan. She runs a camp each summer in Italy. Many Titans have had the opportunity to play overseas because of these contacts including pitcher Tiffany Boyd, who played professionally in Italy in 1993.

Fishing and snow skiing in Aspen occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has numerous business interests and is actually involved in running a family business in Canada that manufactures moccasins. Her sister, Lorraine Garman Klippel, was named the LPGA professional of the year for her accomplishments as the head pro at Bumble Bee Hollow golf club in Mechanicsburg, Pennsylvania.

## Assistant Coach Michelle Gromacki

Michelle Gromacki, a former all-conference catcher at Cal State Fullerton and a current playing member of Team USA, joins the Titan coaching staff for 1995.

"Michelle brings a lot of positive energy to our program and as a current player she pro-

vides a great working example," said Garman. "Her experiences on both the national and international level mean that she will bring the latest techniques and a winning attitude to our program."

After playing the 1984 season at Butte Community College in her native northern California, Gromacki was a reserve for the Titans in 1985 and then the starter the next two years as Fullerton won the national championship in 1986 and placed third in 1987. She won All-Pacific Coast Athletic Association hon-



ors in 1987 and received a large share of the credit for the development of pitcher Connie Clark, the 1987 Honda Broderick Award winner who posted a 53-7 career record. Gromacki also caught the 1986 Broderick winner in the Titans' Susan

LeFebvre. Gromacki batted .288 her senior year and had a career average of .223.

Gromacki, 30, has won Amateur Softball Association All-America honors three times in the past seven seasons and was a member of the 1993 national champion and Canada Cup champion Redding Rebels. She also was reunited with Clark on a team that won the national championship of New Zealand. Other softball trips have taken her to Japan, China and Australia, and, this past summer, Guatemala.

## Assistant Coach Melanie Roche

Melanie Roche, a former All-American at Oklahoma State and most recently a pitcher on the Australian women's softball team, joins the Cal State Fullerton staff for 1995.



Roche, 23, assumes the pitching

coach duties previously held by Kathy Van Wyk. An All-American at Oklahoma State in 1993, Roche made the World All-Star team at the South Pacific Classic in Sydney.

"Melanie is an extremely enthusiastic individual who will bring new energy and vigor to the Titan softball program," said Garman. "Like Michelle, she is young and a current player on the international level who can relate well to today's studentathletes. We are thrilled to have her."

Roche graduated from Oklahoma State in 1993 after leading the Cowgirls to a fourth-place finish at the College World Series in Oklahoma City.

## Season Preview

After 15 seasons and 729 victories at Cal State Fullerton, softball coach Judi Garman finds herself as excited as ever about the Titans' 1995 season.

"I'm very optimistic," says the person who launched the Titan program in 1980. "We have a majority of the players back from last year's team which ended the season so strong. They really came together and I think they will continue to play that kind of ball."

Fullerton lost only three position players -- one to injury -- and one pitcher from a 35-29 team that was runnerup in the NCAA Regional Tournament and won 18

of its final 22 games.

"And with our newcomers, we have added the power hitting we have been lacking," says Garman. "Senetha Thomas is going to bat in the No. 4 or 5 spot and will hit a lot of home runs. She is so strong, defenses will be backing up. We still will have good speed, but we will be running the bases by choice, not out of necessity.

"The only real question mark we have is our pitching, in that it's unproven at this level. But we have two new pitchers -- freshman Brandi Isgar from San Dimas High School and junior Gabby Guerrero from College of the Sequoias JC -- who have contributed 'big time' to their previous programs and we have no doubts that they will continue to be successful here."

Returning to lead the pitching staff is senior Jennifer Mortensen, a two-year veteran and a second-team All-Big West Conference selection in 1994. She was 20-16 last season with a 1.96 earned run average with seven shutouts among her 27 complete games. Freshman Trinity Johnson, 15-12, transferred to South Carolina to be closer to family.

"Brandi has great potential and throws hard," says Garman. "With Gabby, it's a little more difficult to pinpoint the source of her success. She's not impressive to look at, but the results are there. Our hitters don't like to face her in batting practice. She moves the ball around and hits her spots She's smart, and doesn't make the same mistake twice."

The senior position players lost were centerfielder Jstone Vines and designated hitter Melissa Hadfield. The Titans also will be without the services of third baseman Laurie LoForti, who suffered a career-ending knee injury.

The strength of the team appears to be in the infield. Shortstop Traci Fischer is among the returnees, but she will move over to third to replace LoForti and make room for Julie Williams at shortstop.

"Julie has a great bat with good power and she has a great arm," says Garman of the freshman from Dublin High School in northern California. "With Julie at short and Traci at third, the left side of our infield is stronger offensively and defensively."

The right side features All-Big West Conference selection Monica Bagalayos at second base and three-year letterwinner Rose Garces at first base. Bagalayos hit .327 in her sophomore year and stole 26 bases. Garces had an

off-year, hitting .280, but Garman thinks she will bounce back to her 1993 form when she batted .324 with 24 runs batted in.

The Titans split the catching duties between junior Shannon Dolan and sophomore Teresa Stippey in 1994. Dolan hit .294 in 60 games with a team leading 12 doubles and she shared the lead with 3 home runs. Stippey batted .222 in 24 games. Another candidate is Rocky Medina, a redshirt freshman from Mt. Whitney High School. One or more of these players could see time at one of the infield corners.

The outfield will be very competitive. Thomas will be in the lineup somewhere. Veterans Heidi Robertson and Tracie Noggle boast the most experience but Christina Wagy, Melissa Wong and Beth Queypo figure to see action, too. Robertson was a second-team All-Big West selection, batting .294 with 18 stolen bases. She also is a three-year letterwinner on the Titans' volleyball squad. Noggle batted .245 and drove in 18 runs.

"If there is one player who may make a surprising impact, it may be Queypo," says Garman. "She has had a year to get comfortable since transferring from Washington. She has won a role and could play center for us.

"We have better depth this season and it should be interesting," says Garman. "In the Big West, you have to make UNLV and Hawai'i the favorites. Hawai'i has the strongest pitching."

Garman is excited about her new coaching staff of Michelle Gromacki and Melanie Roche. ## Titan Softball Complex



The Titan Softball Complex encompasses two lighted and fenced softball fields which are utilized at capacity during the annual 16-team PONY-Louisville Slugger Tournament as well as year-round by the City of Fullerton.

The primary diamond features elevated grandstand seating, individual chairbacks on the third-base side, an electronic scoreboard and multiple batting cages and warm-up mounds. Improvements constantly are being made. Last year's additions included concrete pavement around

both backstops for added fan comfort and safety and expanded batting cages and bullpens. Construction on additional seating, improved press facilities and a bigger and better electronic scoreboard have been approved and funded.

The softball complex is part of a unique joint partnership among the city of Fullerton, the University and the Marriott Hotel Corp., that was responsible for the \$14 million multi-venue complex that also includes a 1,500-seat basball pavilion and a multi-purpose 10,000 seat stadium.
