

Dear Alumnus:

We have completed the second year on our new campus. You might not recognize the place—the raw, newly constructed look of the first year is gone. The Science and Fine Arts buildings that were part of the original construction have lost their lonesome look and are blending into the greenery of the new landscaping.

Over 1200 freshmen registered for the fall term. With the freshman class of 1963, now sophomores, Cal State has become a four-year college. This summer CSCH will conduct a complete quarter program, the first for the State College system; so we are now on a full year-round operation.

Our first football team took to the field last fall and made an honorable showing, even though they did have to play on a borrowed field. This fall should see them playing in our own new stadium. The Cal-State Affiliates has undertaken construction of a 10,000 seat stadium as one of its projects, and the seating should be ready by the fall of 1966.

Each new development brings the total college complex closer to completion. In September the Carlos Bee Residence Hall opened with 120 resident students. The parking situation is improved, although still inadequate for our growing student body. Another dormitory, twin to Bee Hall, is on the drawing board, and living quarters for married students and a shopping center are in the talking stage.

The much publicized circular-shaped music building will be ready for classes this fall. This should especially please the music department faculty who, for the past two years, have had to teach amid the pipes and paraphernalia of the science labs.

Space in the two initial buildings has become more precious, but the college spirit has been so high the crowding hasn't bothered us. Instead of complaining, the students and faculty have reacted to this inconvenience with the Pioneer spirit. We have made maximum use of our facilities remembering that new buildings are on the way.


So many informal educational activities went on it would take pages just to list them. The Speech-Drama Department presented outstanding plays at the Highland Theatre. The Cal State Chorus, Orchestra and Band again displayed their considerable talents in a performance of "The Messiah" in December, and many other musical events during the year. One of the highlights of the year was the big formal ball held to celebrate the first anniversary of the new campus, complete with queen and court. And, of course, there was the traditional Homecoming celebration in February.

The only thing we didn't have was trouble, riots, sit ins, or some of the other forms of dissension found on many campuses. Possibly this was because of the high caliber of Cal-State students.

This letter can't possibly do justice to the wonderful changes and growth of the college. You will have to see for yourself. Do come for a visit to your Alma Mater soon.




May your memories of Cal State be warm and happy ones—and may your appetite for knowledge be so consuming that you will make it a lifelong pursuit.



DIVISION OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMICS

The Business and Economics Division is making a strong effort to provide future businessmen with a liberal education and is placing less emphasis on producing technicians and specialists.

The major aim of the Division is not to supply business with graduates trained to perform their first job, but to provide the student with a basic education that will serve him well during a long career.

The dynamics of adaptation and leadership, along with the acquisition of the newer tools and techniques used in business management, constitute a major element of the management major.

In the future the Division will rely more and more on computers and other scientific tools to assist business students in their roles as decision makers. There will be emphasis on the quantitative approach in marketing and management.

Major innovations will be made in the management and marketing curricula. Classes, for example, will be added in management science.

In an effort to become better acquainted with the commercial world, the Division's Association of Business and Economics Students hosted a number of meetings featuring speakers from Bay Area business firms.



EDUCATION



DIVISION OF EDUCATION

Basic to the Division of Education is the concept of a full partnership among college and public school personnel in developing competent teachers.

The Department of Education is pioneering an exciting avant-garde program in preparing teachers. Students are being trained in real classroom situations under constant supervision of the Cal-State teaching staff and the public classroom teacher. This arrangement offers the student many meaningful experiences prior to commencing the student teaching program. Theory and practice in this way are carefully integrated. This stimulating program is being conducted in elementary schools within the community. As one professor suggests, "Students cannot learn to teach while sitting in a college classroom."

At the graduate level, the Division of Education is concerned with the professional education of teachers and programs for specialists in selected areas of school service. The several programs prepare students for elementary school teaching, for secondary school teaching, for recreation leadership, and for assignments as specialists in health and physical education, pupil personnel services, and supervision.

A special feature offered in the Division of Education is the "in-service" program which provides many evening courses to credentialed teachers in the community who are concerned about self improvement, securing specialized credentials or advanced degrees.

DIVISION OF HUMANITIES

Humanities is the branch of learning concerned with human thought and relationships, especially through language, literature and philosophy. Through this humanistic study of man's ideas the student, in search of his personal freedom, explores the levels and kinds of meaning which shape his world of knowledge.

The four departments — English, Foreign Languages, Philosophy and History — are characterized by their distinguished faculty members.

Four of the Humanities Division faculty are serving on overseas assignments. Professor Arnold Biella, Head of the Division, is a Fulbright lecturer at the American University in Cairo, Egypt. Professor Morton Rosenbaum is at the University of Madrid serving as the resident director of the California State Colleges Overseas Study Program in Spain. Professor Theodore Roszak is on leave in London working as editor of the independent weekly, *Peace News*.

This was the first year for the Master of Arts Degree in English at Cal State. Next year a major in philosophy will be offered. Plans for the division include developing a program in Asian studies, as evidenced by the presence at Cal State this past year of visiting professor N. A. Nikam, former Vice-Chancellor of Mysore University, India. It was through the effort of Professor Nikam that the College was able to have our convocation speaker, His Highness, the Maharajah Jaya Wadihar of Mysore and Governor of the State of Madras, India.

DIVISION OF SCIENCE AND MATHEMATICS

In this day of expanding technology, many students are now attracted to the majors in the physical and biological sciences either as preparation for graduate study in technical and non-technical fields, or for teaching, or for employment in a variety of occupations in which a science background is needed.

The increasing importance of mathematics is reflected in the burgeoning demand for mathematicians and teachers of mathematics at all levels, and also in the revolutions occurring in mathematics in all fields of the business community. Cal-State's team of "mathematical missionaries" is anxious to spread the word through flexible, up-to-date programs, including the study of the "new mathematics," mathematical aspects of the social, biological and management sciences, in preparation for a position with industry or government. The program includes extensive training in the use of the college's IBM computer equipment in connection with computer programming, numerical analysis and other aspects of the computer services.















Junior Howard Foster broke the Cal-State single season scoring record netting 348 points in 22 games, and finished second in the conference scoring with a 20.7-point per game league average.



One of many sparkling outings was a double header sweep of UC at Davis. Cal State's bats exploded for 11-1, 6-4 bombings.






Cal State's wrestling squad had its ups and downs during the 1964-65 campaign, but Coach Dick Rivenes was pleased with the overall team performance.

"We were hit early by scholastic ineligibilities and injuries but we hung in there," remarked Rivenes.






Besides cracking several school records, the hilltoppers finished the dual meet season with a 2-3 record.
