CAL STATE FULLERTON CAMPUS



California State University, Fullerton, is a relatively young institution, having opened only 23 years ago. However, it already has grown to more than 24,000 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 81 degree programs — 39 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-

the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A more recent development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make the university the foremost bachelor's master's degree institution in the nation.

ADMINISTRATION

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Zoology for seven years. Previously, she was Professor of Biology at

Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community.

University and the community.

The foundation supports athletics by providing funds for scholarships that insure an effective recruiting program which attracts the best student-athletes available. The 1982 drive totaled nearly \$300,000.

The TAF was founded in January, 1973 and the initial 150 members raised approximately

\$30,000. Membership today totals more than 800.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president. He was succeeded by Don Karcher, president of Carl Karcher Enterprises; Buck Johns, president of Home Works; Larry Slagle, vice president of Yellow Cab of North Orange County; and current president Jim Woods, president and chairman of the board of Baker Oil Tools.

Coach Judi Garman

Judi Garman begins her fourth year as softball coach at Cal State Fullerton and the trail of championships that has marked her career continues to grow.

Since establishing the program in 1980, Garman's teams have won a pair of Western Collegiate Athletic Association titles and two regional crowns while coming ever so close to an elusive national championship trophy. The Titans finished ninth in their inaugural season, second in 1981 and came in third last year behind UCLA after besting the Bruins for the WCAA banner.

Garman's instant success at Fullerton is only the latest in her remarkable string of accomplishments which stretch across the continent from Canada to the University of California at Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

"Building our own facility and winning a national title are our goals here at Fullerton," said Garman, who won four consecutive national junior college championships at Golden West. "Hard work and enthusiasm are the keys, I guess. You've got to be willing to work harder than anyone else."

Garman built the Golden West program from the ground up and she is repeating the process at Fullerton.

"We started out with no facilities but eventually built a beautiful complex with two lighted fields, a snack bar and the whole works. It was difficult to leave that and start all over at Fullerton."

The Titans charge admission for home games at nearby Lions Field while plans are on the drawing board for two lighted fields on the Fullerton campus, where Garman's rise to prominence has been even faster than at Golden West.

At Golden West in 1971 she inherited a team which was winless the previous year and took it to a 9-8 showing. Two years later she had captured a conference crown and it took two more years for regional and national pennants.

Starting with nothing at Fullerton, she has taken the Titans to the national championship tournament in her first three years and in 1981 the Titans came within one run of the top prize, losing to Utah State, 4-3, in the final game of the nationals after dominating the Western Collegiate Athletic Association and the regional tournament.

Last year's team went undefeated through its first 27 games (one tie) and won 49 of its first 53 games (two ties) and won the WCAA championship with a 17-0-1 record as

Garman won Coach of the Year laurels. UCLA avenged three conference defeats (one tie) by knocking the Titans out of the national championship tournament in Omaha.

Garman comes from a softball family. Her mother Ruth was a physical education teacher and softball coach at Messiah College in Pennsylvania and her aunt also coached. She grew up in Kindersley, Saskatchewan and by the eighth grade was playing on a senior women's team. She then joined the Saskatoon Imperials. Twice they were Canadian Champions and in 1970 Garman was a member of the National Team at the World Softball Tournament in Osaka, Japan. In 1967 she was an all-star Canadian outfielder.

In 1966 she graduated from the University of Saskatchewan and looked for a warmer

climate.

"My sister took a vacation and went through Santa Barbara," Garman recalled. "She said it was about the prettiest place she could imagine going to school and that's how I

ended up there."

While working on her master's degree, Garman started club softball and soon had a varsity team (1967-69). Upon completion of her studies she took the women's athletic directorship at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached volleyball, basketball and tennis in addition to softball.

"Then came budget cuts and I moved to Golden West as a P.E. instructor and coach,"

she said. "I inherited a team which lost one game 21-0 in five innings."

Garman also served as basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79) coach at Golden West, but she always favored softball due to her competitive background in that sport. Twenty-one of her players received scholarships to four-year institutions, against whom she manufactured a 34-11-2 record over the years.

In great demand as a speaker and instructor at clinics, Garman has conducted her own sessions at Golden West and Fullerton, attracting hundreds of coaches and young softball players. She served as a consultant at a camp in Alaska in 1980 and one summer enjoyed a trip to Sweden with the Titan team for series of clinics and exhibitions.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has been published in many physical education journals and even was a pioneer in the

equality in sports movement.

"I played Little League baseball," Garman recalled. "I was starting second baseman, but when our team got to the regionals the other team objected and I couldn't play any more."

Van Wyk, 22, had a sensational one-year pitching career at Fullerton after transferring from Texas Women's University when its softball program was dropped. She compiled a 35-1 record with a microscopic earned run average of 0.18 and, combined with her excellence in the classroom, won the Broderick Award as the nation's outstanding player as well as an NCAA post-graduate scholarship.

"We're excited that Kathy could continue with the program," said head coach Judi Garman. "She did so much for it, particularly in terms of community relations and we are thrilled that that respect will continue."

The Orange County Sportswriters Association selected Van Wyk their county athlete of the year for sports other than football, basketball or baseball.

In addition to tutoring the inexperienced Titan pitching staff, Van Wyk is in charge of recruiting efforts and the conditioning program.

The Holland, Michigan native led Texas Women's University to the AIAW national championship in 1979 and was the Texas AIAW Player of the Year. In 1980 she posted a 40-6 record and earned her first nomination for the Broderick Award. A near-fatal auto accident threatened her pitching career as she posted an 11-9 record in 1981 before transferring to Fullerton.

Van Wyk still is a student at Cal State Fullerton and will graduate in June with a degree in physical education. She will avail herself of the NCAA post-graduate grant beginning next fall.

1982 Broderick Award Winner — Kathy Van Wyk



Kathy Van Wyk became the first Cal State Fullerton athlete to receive the prestigious Broderick Award as the top women's fast-pitch softball player in the nation in 1982.

The award is presented annually by the Broderick Company to the best performer in each of the women's intercollegiate sports. The Broderick Cup is presented to the Athlete of the Year from the field of Broderick Award winners.

Van Wyk's nomination was made on the basis of her off-the-field accomplishments as well as her pitching prowess, which was unequaled. In addition to her 35-1 record and 0.18 earned run average, 3.43 grade-point average proved an impressive number to the selection committee.

The Holland, Michigan native had been nominated in 1980 when she compiled a 40-6 record for Texas Women's University, which dropped its program after the 1981 season.

SEASON PREVIEW

The 1983 Cal State Fullerton softball team has a tough act to follow and several new faces must fill the vacated starring roles.

The loss of the entire pitching staff and an All-American power hitter didn't catch coach Judi Garman unprepared, however, and she has recruited plenty of new talent.

"We will be a totally different team than any of the previous three at Fullerton," says Garman. "In the past we relied on the long ball and one or two key players to hit it out. It will be more of a team effort this year with every spot in the lineup being productive. We'll do more things offensively and should be very exciting to watch.

"Basically, we lost our entire pitching staff since Lori Neff pitched only one game for us last year. But we're very excited about the new pitchers we have brought in."

Eight newcomers join seven veterans to provide a nice balance of youth and experience.

"We will have some growing pains with the new players learning to play together," says Garman. "They don't have collegiate experience but they have had national experience on Amateur Softball Association teams. I expect we will get stronger and better as the season progresses."

Last year's team roared out of the gate with a 27-game unbeaten streak behind the pitching of transfer Kathy Van Wyk and seniors Terry Keasling and Pam Edde, all of whom have graduated.

"I don't think our 1983 pitching staff should be underestimated," says Garman. "We brought in good pitchers and we've seen great improvement under the daily direction of a full time pitching coach in Kathy Van Wyk."

Defending national champion UCLA is the team to beat in the rugged Western Collegiate Athletic Association, which the Titans won last year. Arizona State, which also competed in the College World Series, must replace its pitching staff, too.

"People don't realize how tough the competition is now at the national level," says Garman. "Everyone is so good. Getting the breaks and so many other factors enter into it. We were disappointed to get that close (third place) and not reach our ultimate goal of the national championship, especially since we missed it by one run the year before. We played very well, we just didn't get the hits in the right places."

A breakdown by positions:

PITCHING — Gone are Van Wyk (35-1), Keasling (13-3) and Edde (6-2) and all the "old" Titan pitching records. Coach Van Wyk expects sophomore Lori Neff and freshman Susan LeFebvre to vie for the No. 1 spot. Neff served her apprenticeship and and has excellent command. LeFebvre is very determined and pushes herself and throws hard, getting a lot of strikeouts. Freshman JoAnn Ferrieri and Lisa Baker provide the depth.

CATCHING — Leslie King caught all but three of the Titans' 63 games in her first year behind the plate and the versatile sophomore should benefit from occasional rests in favor of newcomer Maridee Richards.

INFIELD — Nineteen eighty-one All-American Janet Lloyd has been shelved after knee surgery which frees first base for two-time All-American Sue Lewis (.311, 9 HR and 50 RBI in 1982) to move in from right field. Freshman Robin Goodin will back her up. Pam Newton (second base), Kim Kirk (shortstop) and Jan Pierini (third base) return to their starting spots with walk-on Stephanie Tanaka in relief along with catcher Leslie King and pitcher Jo Ann Ferrieri when they are not otherwise disposed.

OUTFIELD — Flanking senior centerfielder Tobi Perkins will be UNLV All-American Vera Bahr and Pasadena City College transfer Elise King. Pitcher Lisa Baker's strong bat also will earn her some outfield duty.

SUMMARY — Promising but unproven pitching in a sport dominated by the hurlers. Veteran defensive alignment with less raw power (Lloyd) but more punch and versatility in the batting order. Garman: "We won't have to pinch run for people like last year. The same people who can hit with power can lay down the bunt and the people who get on base can really run."

More than 3,500 fans attended.




