FIRE AFTERMATH-ARE YOU READY FOR THE NEXT ONE?

Massive blazes raise many questions.

The fires that burned so close to LV's perimeter and across Ventura and LA Counties last month were frightening and motivational. As fire trucks from as far away as Long Beach formed a protective line at the eastern end of Leisure Village Drive, Villagers responded in different ways. Some watched the flames from their patios or on TV. Some drove out of the Village "just to be safe," and others huddled with neighbors in their cul de sacs. Thankfully, the wildfires moved on, and the question for many residents was "How ready were we if we had been ordered to evacuate?"

Officials who deal regularly with emergencies (such as FEMA and The Red Cross) say that often



Villager says Teaching **Actors Was No Act**

As a Villager, Warren Robertson plays golf, practices yoga, enjoys Happy Hour with his neighbors and regular visits with his daughter. It's a different tempo from preceding decades when he was the one of the most highly regarded acting teachers in the nation. "It was so much fun for me," Warren says modestly. His students describe it differently; "I don't think I really understood what it meant to be an actor until I began studying with Warren," said the late movie star Patrick Swayze.

For more than thirty years, Warren Robertson and his Theatre Workshop were synonymous with excellence at teaching actors how to "find their emotional life and let it out," he says. He and the teachers at his school trained nearly 35,000 students over the years, familiar names like Jessica Lange and Viggo Mortenson.

"I had a gift, an instinct," Warren explains, that developed from his childhood in tiny Archer City, Texas, where he grew up often living with relatives because his mother was too ill to care for him. "People didn't always want me. So I learned that it was important to get in touch with what they were thinking

and feeling; I'd watch their eyes and hands," he recalls. He also learned how to dance - his aunts practiced the tango with their little nephew. That skill led to 20-year-old Warren winning a national contest, "The Campus Casanova." on the Bob Hope Radio Show. It brought him to

Hollywood and show business for the first time.

Soon after, Warren was drafted during the Korean War and sent to Japan. Due to an army mix-up, he was assigned to play football there, not go into combat. One day as he strolled in a park, he saw another American approach. It was Marlon Brando, who struck up a conversation. "I couldn't believe it," Warren laughs. "I was a nobody." But

when Brando (who was filming "Sayonara" there) asked if Warren knew a good bar, a friendship ensued, including a walk-on part in the movie for Warren.

In 1957, his army service ended, he returned to New York, got a job as a bartender and enrolled as a student in Lee Strasberg's Actors' Studio. When classmates got together outside the Studio to work on scenes, they - and Warren - realized he was good at teaching acting. His Theatre Workshop was born, and the rest is history. "We all have a life force. I helped students find it and express it," he says emphatically.

He says he "just got tired," after decades of teaching and retired, first to a ranch in Washington and now in Leisure Village. He doesn't watch acting - in movies or plays - much anymore. But his teaching principle still stands: "Let everyone see your humanity."

Another category of emergency preparation is personal: a list of family/friend contact numbers, cell phone and charger, important photos (if they are not saved online). Make sure the car is never very low on gas. There are dozens of websites that offer suggestions for emergency situations. The fires last month were our signal to be "Ready."

Being ready to go is the resident's responsibility. Giving the order for a mandatory evacuation is the



sole responsibility of the Ventura County Fire Department. If such an order becomes necessary, residents will be notified by a public

address system announcing that order throughout the Village. No Leisure Village security officers or staff can make that order.

EMERGENCY PREPARATION LIST

- Water, one gallon per person per day
- Food, non-perishable supply
- Battery-powered radio and extra batteries
- Flashlight, extra batteries, matches, paper cups & plates. Moist towelettes & garbage bags
- Prescription medicine and glasses
- Copies of important documents: insurance cards, bankcard, passport

- Pet food and extra water
- Cash in small bills and change
- First Aid kit and a whistle to signal for help
- (for personal sanitation)
- Sleeping bag or warm blanket
- A complete change of clothes

So You Want to Replace Your Windows?

Please don't add, subtract, change, or demolish anything on the exterior of your house without 1) Reading this, and then 2) Following LV'S Architectural Guidelines to get a permit. It is a process that can save time, money, and homeowner headaches.

The rules are simple; just ask an Architectural Counselor. When a homeowner wants to make any repair, modification, or addition to the exterior of the home, an Architectural Permit must be obtained.

Your first step in this process is to get a copy of the Architectural Guidelines from the Association Office. This booklet will help guide you through what needs be done to get a permit. Blank permit forms are available in the Recreation Center lobby or Association Office. Fill out the top portion of the permit, read the CONDITIONS section, sign your name, and bring all supporting documents for your project to the next Architecture Committee meeting.

Permit sessions are held in the Garden Room between 8:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. on the first and third Friday of each month. A counselor will review the permit and answer any questions. Typically, you get the signed permit at that session, but there are times when a site inspection is required before the permit will be processed.

Any contractor doing work on a project must meet all LVA requirements for insurance and licenses. A list of contractors meeting these requirements is available in the Recreation Center lobby, Association Office or at a permit session.

Once your project is done, call 1-805-484-2861 and request the LVA Compliance Inspector come out and confirm the project was completed as approved on the Architectural Permit.

Holiday Serendipity Garden Musings

Gardening is America's most popular (non-sports) outdoor activity. Indoor gardening is popular globally.

The holiday giving-season is upon us. Thus, the perpetual question once again is pondering possible gift giving and also gift receiving choices.

Thinking a bit out of the box maybe, consider horticulture & gardening gift ideas. Garden gifts are perhaps an ultimate "gift that keeps on giving." YOU may have a botanical gift suggestion. Folks on your holiday list might easily connect to their own hobby horticulture desires. Possibilities: unique or exotic plants, quality garden tools or residential landscape equipment; also, supplies and consumables might be things to consider.

Perhaps a trip to a retail plant nursery or garden center (especially after the Christmas crunch) will allow your gift recipient a wider variety of choices. There is the fun and wonderment of searching for a very A personal check is an easy special New Year's plant or choosing from seed packets and bulbs. During early winter there is an opportunity to select seasonally available bare-root trees/shrubs and packaged roses, plus dormant herbaceous perennial offerings. Cool-season color bedding plants in the Village can be added to Red Stake garden beds and generally grown in LV patio planted containers. How about a very special plant container or pot?

Not all plant varieties or store inventories are available on the day a person visits a garden center. If you have an exact plant-cultivar and no other plant will suffice, ask a nursery professional to special order the exact plant (no substitutes).

It is preferable to buy plant materials locally, but some plants or, even more so, precise garden tools, garden equipment and special gardening supply preferences should be ordered online or by mail-order. It can be an eye-opening adventure to surf the Net for worldwide gift possibilities.

gift solution. Gift card/ certificates connected to a Garden/Seed Catalog is an option. Consider horticulture internet sources (perhaps working in tandem with your gift recipient). Botanical books or subscriptions to horticulture magazines or gift computer gardening programs are ideal for some folks.

Expand your gifting possibilities, comfortable for your budget limitations. Consider these suggestions, perhaps: sponsor a public or private Gardens sojourn or a botanical stay-cation. Sponsor

a family or friend's landscaping remake or yard renovation by a professional landscaper. Gift a home growing station or portable greenhouse. Indoor/Outdoor atypical gardening ideas can include: A gift of Outdoor Lighting, a Landscape





It is at this point in a Spotlight piece that your humble reporter will often insert a horrible pun. But this time, I thought I'd spare you.









We residents of Leisure Village are devastated by the shootings, fire and wind. So much emotion! I was visiting my family in the San Francisco Bay area when this all occurred and I felt so vulnerable, realizing that I wasn't home to pack up my personal belongings if

Leisure Village occupants had to evacuate.

Conversations with friends here in our village include questions about insurance policies and what to take when and if evacuation becomes necessary. Certainly, you will want to make sure you have your important papers including driver's license, social security card, proof of health, homeowner & auto insurance, passport, trust/will, health care direc-



tive, power of attorney, copy of mortgage statement, 3 years tax returns if possible. The Grant Deed for your home is available from a title company and County records if required in the future. Of course you will want to make sure too that you have a full tank of gas for your car and contact information for your insurance agent, lawyer, accountant, physicians, etc.

If you want a little variety, you can add bacon (pork or turkey) crumbles or a small piece of sausage. It is a great accompaniment to a Holiday Dinner as it resembles Yorkshire pudding. I'd definitely try it instead of rolls with Turkey, Prime Rib or Roast Chicken Dinner. Oh yea, and it's gluten free. Hope you enjoy!

Bud's Brazilian Cheese Bread

- 1 Egg (Room Temp)
- 1/3 C Olive Oil
- ²/₃ C Milk (use Almond Milk)
- Scant 1 ½ C Tapioca Flour (available at Lassen's Whole Foods)
- ½ C (packed) Shredded or Grated Parmesan

Put all ingredients in blender, blend until smooth. Preheat Oven 400°. Lightly grease 12 cup mini-muffin pan. Fill each cup ¾ full. Bake 18 to 20 minutes, until puffy and lightly browned. Cool on rack for 2 minutes. Enjoy - (Note) Rolls will be chewy like Japanese Mochi.


