

AMERICANS OF MEXICAN DESCENT, AWAKEN!

Awaken to an apparent lethargic inactivity. Now is the time to indulge in some
soul searching. The realization that despite our population in this county, in fact
throughout this state, that we have no representation in the political, economic
and industrial and social strata of the community, is lamentable. Why? the answer is
self-explanatory.

Ostensibly, the climate is ripe, the stage is set so to speak. And yet we ignore the significance and fail to take advantage of the situation open to us. Splinter groups the GI Forum, MAPA, Human Relations, Civil Liberties, etc. - have been formed and some of us have joined. But what do we accomplish? Nothing. However, it is indeed encouraging that some of us have realized the need to join whether it be for personal or ulterior motive. This is something which our people have simply failed to do in the past. And we must awaken from this lethargy. Commendable as the idea may be irregardless of whether or not no attainable goal is evident, now, it is the proper approach. Everyone must realize that in union there is strength. It would be wise for our people to observe the Negro of this country, their achievements; their progress; their pitfalls.

We have to concede that this has been done through organizing into a well-knit group known as the NAACP. Of course we do not have to condone their manner of attaining their goals; but it was done in unity.

This is a prime example; this is a specific case in point.

Some of us have seen fit to organize. These should endeavor to awaken others of our people to join; members should strive to be active but not dormant participants. This has been our common defect; we must cease to be "manana" members, and put our shoulders to the grindstone. We must perforce channel our efforts, through unification, to-

wards a common goal -- a betterment of our own people within the community; the complete elimination of bias or prejudice; the promotion of self-education in order to derive or establish the proper rapport between our ethnic group and those who insist that we are "inferior Mexicans". In this respect we are utter failures. And we fail simply because we sacrifice the common goal for personal gain or recognition. In other words those of us who join or organize do this simply for personal reasons rather than for the common interest, ignoring the fact that the group should take precedence over the individual; that if the group achieves it will reflect upon the individual if only indirectly. If we continue as in the past it behooves us all; it is best that "we give up the ghost."

Let us reflect. The colored people with their NAACP have joined for a purpose, and it is evident that they have achieved. Is it not feasible that we of Mexican descent that we can do likewise? Again, reflect on the recent political fiasco. You are aware that in the recent San Jose elections a citizen of Mexican descent was a candidate for the city council. His failure is indicative of our lack of organization. Or could it be that our people simply take no pride that one of us has the courage to represent us before the city? The results should have been overwhelmingly the opposite. With our majority of vote potential we should be able to put in office any person we want. Why do the local politicians cater to us. Because they know our vote potential, but we sit idly or our leaders (if we have any) simply ignore this. Remember, in unity there is strength. Other ethnic groups unite and accomplish their goals, so there is no reason why we cannot react likewise. And it must not be forgotten that there are many of us who are available and are sufficiently competent who could represent us. But we as a group must show, at least, a minimum of support, for if we care not to support our own kind, how can we expect others to show any interest to us? And only in showing others that we desire representation and that we do support our own people will be able to deal with others on their own terms. This is a logical analysis, pure and simple. Actually, by pretending to organize and failing so miserably as in the recent political event promotes degression rather than advancement; prestige-wise we suffer.

Why do we fail to progress; why do we fail so miserably? A critical analysis must be made for purposes of enlightenment. We must admit that we are a people who inherit all imaginable faults; our hearts are filled with envy, jealousy, hate, and avarice. We are a people who cannot stand to see one of his kind to prosper or to better himself.

Rather than complimenting or to giving him the "go" sign, there is a tendency to prejudge and condemn; and to trample him and grind him into the dirt. Under those circumstances, how can we or any of our group accomplish anything?

The council race is sufficient evidence. This was an incident where instead of supporting him, for we have sufficient vote, regardless of his qualifications or whether he had the actual potential of representing us when elected (this would have been revealed during his tenure) we failed to support him we did not vote; we proverbially ground him into the dirt.

In the San Jose Police Department, out of ten (10) cases brought before the police nine (9) involve persons of Mexican descent. Where is our pride, our lack of civic responsibility? Isn't it degrading to know that we have a majority on the police calendar but where a majority could be decisive we fail miserably.

Time is of the essence; now is the time for action. We all want to integrate into the community as bona fide citizens; we do not want to be second-class citizens.

Therefore we must funnel our efforts toward a common goal; we must cast aside our petty jealousies and antagonisms of the

past and endeavor in unison to strive forward rather than in reverse. Otherwise, we as a group must be content in the realization that we are actually second-class members of the community, and we must forever remain quiet whenever we are touched with bias or prejudice. For as our beloved President Kennedy so aptly stated "It's not what your country can do for you, it's what YOU can do for your country". If we do not do or care to do anything for ourselves, do not expect others to do it for us. AWAKEN AMERICANS OF MEXICAN DESCENT!

It is to be noted that reference is made to our group as Americans of Mexican descent rather than "Mexican Americans". This in itself is prejudicial. We actually oppose this and in fact condone and accept this stereotype placed upon us by ourselves or by others for purposes of differentiation or discrimination. We are Americans first irregardless of the fact that we are of Mexican extraction.

Nuestra Tragicomedia

Hace unos dias, mientras me ocupaba de poner en orden algunos papeles, sono el telefono. Una voz pregunto:

- Es usted el Sr. Saldaña?

- A sus ordenes, conteste.

- Quiero que tenga la bondad de decirme, (dijo la voz), cuales son las publicaciones en español que hay en San Jose?

Mentalmente recorri el panorama periodistico local y lo unico que pude contestar fue: EL EXCENTRICO.

- Cuales otras? (pregunto la voz)

Rebusque nuevamente, no solo en San Jose, sino en todo el Condado de Santa Clara y tuve que contestar: No hay otras.

- Digame (dijo la persona al otrolado de la linea) el Condado de Santa Clara es despues de Los Angeles el lugar donde hay mas personas que hablan español, no es asi?

- Segun las estadisticas, asi es.

- Muchas gracias.

- No hay de que.

Despues de esta breve conversacion, me quede pensando..... En realidad, la unica publicacion en que se escribe algo de español es EL EXCENTRICO; en una area donde se asegura que hay una poblacion de cien mil personas que hablan la lengua castellana. Trate de encontrar la razoñ por la que con esa cantidad de gente que habla español, no hay mas publicaciones que EL EXCENTRICO que va ya en sus 16 años de vida.

Hice memoria y pasaron como en una pantalla nebulosa los nombres de otras publicaciones, que han desaparecido en los ultimos años; pude recordar EL SOL DE SAN JOSE, PALADIN, REVISTA GRAFICA MEXICO AMERICANA y otras que murieron con su primer numero y que se han editado en San Jose.

De San Francisco vinieron AMERICA, EL GUIA y tal vez algunas otras que no dejaron ni siquiera la memoria de su nombre. Muchos intentos para conquistar al publico de habla hispana del condado, todos ellos fracasaron; pero a pesar de ello han dejado patente el interes de no dejar morir enteramente nuestra lengua en estas tierras, que los abnegados frailes franciscanos ganaron para la fe cristiana y los esforzados capitanes para la Corona de España.

Nuestros esfuerzos por mantener viva la romanza Cervantina, en donde la lengua de Shakespeare con sus grandes diarios y sus fantasticas rotativas, son como un gran incendio que lo abraza todo y dentro de ese incendio, una pequeña vela alimentando su propia llamita; que resulta a la vez que tragica, comica.

Sin embargo no apaga su luz ni se funde con el incendio.

Esta es la situación de nuestro periodismo; una pequeña llamita que quiere obstinadamente resplandecer independientemente del grandioso incendio.

Podemos ver por las lineas anteriores que no ha faltado iniciativa ni capacidad y habiendo esos dos factores, tenemos que llegar a la conclusion de que el tercer factor que nos ha faltado es el capital. Muchas veces se ha tratado de establecer el periodismo latino, pero no se ha contado con el capital. Se antoja imaginar a un puñado de hombres que se presentan en el campo de batalla, con su valor y sus armas, pero no llevan parque, sin embargo entran al combate en donde otro contendiente tiene, ade mas de armamento moderno, aprovisionamientos de parque casi ilimitados; asi es como estes luchadores valientes han sido derrotados una y otra vez, sin lograr ni siquiera inquietar el campo de batalla.

Lo comico de este estado de cosas, encierra una gran tragedia. Esta es la de la lucha que no busca una superioridad; sus miras con conseguir igualdad, tanto en deberes como en derechos, y se encuentra conque no tiene derechos pero si tiene deberes, sus obligaciones son iguales a las de todos, pero sus derechos estan limitados, a esto solo se le puede llamar injusto y todas las injusticias son tragicas. Su presencia en la lucha, sin parque, es lo que le da el aspecto comico.

Las publicaciones en español se han hecho a base de grandes esfuerzos y a veces hasta de sacrificios. En la mayoria de los casos los lectores no se dan cuenta que en esas mal formadas paginas que se ponen a su vista, estan representados grandes anhelos, que se traducen en tremendos desengaños; esfuerzos casi sobre humanos, en jornadas de trabajo agotador, sin mas re-




