INFORMATION LITERACY INSTRUCTION

The Library offers a multi-layered approach to information literacy (IL) instruction to advance students' abilities to find, evaluate, synthesize and present a rich array of information.

At the freshman level, we are integrated with ENG 101, LIBS 101 and UNIV 150. At the major level, our librarians work closely with discipline faculty to determine which courses are best suited for hands-on IL instruction. In the past year, Librarians taught 111 course-integrated sessions for freshmen and 100 sessions for upper division students.

Supporting faculty, supporting students

Last year, the Library, Center for Teaching and Professional Development, and the IT Web Office collaborated to offer more than 70 workshops in the Library Teaching Center for faculty to support technology and information literacy in the classroom.

Topics included integrating critical thinking and information literacy, making accessible Word and Powerpoint documents, WebCT trainings, LecShare, and trainings on how to design effective multimedia assignments.

Every four years, the Library hosts the very popular It Matters Program, in which the SSU community explores the "hot" issues during election years. This year was as successful as ever with


