

Shultz celebrates his 95th

I'm pretty much a cynic when it comes to myths, but I'm convinced. that if there is such a thing as the Fountain of Youth, it is right here in Leisure Village. All I need do is look around at our vibrant residents here in the Village as they absolutely defy age.

A perfect example is Manny Shultz, who celebrated his 95th birthday.

You'd insist he take a lie detector test if you met him for the first time and he told you his age. But what a history Manny has!

Born July 25, 1912, in Russia, Manny and his mother, two sisters and younger brother attempted to escape the countless pogroms and join their father, who had managed to emigrate to the United States earlier to avoid conscription into the Russian army. But it was an arduous journey, the family having to bribe their way through Poland.

After a tortuous three years of exhausting all their worldly goods, including a wealth of silver, they managed to make their way through Belgium and board a ship to Ellis Island and the United States. But even then, tragedy dogged the family, as one of Manny's sisters was refused entry because of a physical malady. Sent back to Russia, she became a victim of the Nazi atrocities against Russian civilians.

During the Depression, Manny drove a laundry truck for a linen company and delivered in Bel Air and Beverly Hills, the wealthiest neighborhoods of Los Angeles.

Manny joined the U.S. Coast Guard in 1943 and served until the end of World War II. His younger brother, also serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, was killed in action.

Manny's family moved to Los Angeles in 1946, and on a blind date. Manny met his future wife. Myrtle. They were married six months later.

In 1949, Manny took a partner and went into the furniture manufacturing business until he retired in 1974 — but not for long. In 1975, Manny decided to become a dental technician and graduated from

dental college two years later. That career lasted only a short time, and the jack-of-all-trades finally took over a jewelry business until his final retirement in 1981.

That year also brought Manny and Myrtle to Leisure Village.

Myrtle passed away in August 2006, but Manny still remains active, defying age and astounding his many friends with his boundless energy.

We encourage all Villagers to review their homeowners insurance policies. We've been made aware of a few cases recently where Village homeowners have had problems and needed to make a claim, only to find out they didn't have the coverage they thought they did.

Here is where the biggest problem may be: The association has made changes to the Master Policy over the years, and if your policy, which is a complementary policy to the master, has not been updated since those changes were made, then you may not have the coverage you need or want.

This means that even if your policy was written just a few years ago, you should still check.

Also, if you rent, don't assume everything is covered by your landlord. It is not! You need a renters policy to cover your personal property.

We are not insurance experts, so we don't have all the answers, but we know people who do. Call our office if you need a recommendation for someone to help you with

Another thing you might do while talking to an insurance expert is to educate yourself on when to make a claim on your policy and when to maybe not. Remember, most homes, even here in the Village, are purchased





This is why more Village Coordinators and volunteers are needed for disaster preparedness and the Emergency Services Organization:

- Some of our villages are underserved in the event of a disaster because no one has volunteered to serve as an ESO Village Coordinator or phone helper (assistant to the Village Coordinator).
- · Traditional community resources — for example, fire-rescue personnel, paramedics, Red Cross — could become overwhelmed in a greater emergency or have access to Leisure Village blocked by damaged freeways and roads and thereby be unable to provide services on a timely basis.
- The mission of ESO is to provide immediate emergency response in the event of a disaster. In order to best accomplish its mission, the ESO must be fully staffed and as well trained and rehearsed as possible.
- · Playing a key role in disaster preparedness and emergency response, **ESO** Coordinators meet with residents, especially new ones, attend monthly meetings and take part in radio checks and periodic Disaster Preparedness Exercises (DPX).
- Participation in ESO requires only a very few hours each month. In addition to providing a very important service, there are many opportunities for meeting people and for making new friends!

On September 27, we play at Mountain View Golf Course. The greens fee is \$23, and you pay for the cart at the course.




Lindy's watercolor painting on display, "Sad Song," was a first-place winner for Peoples Choice Award.
