Now that puzzle may be a thing of the past.


The LV Box Office is open for business. On Tuesdays and Thursdays from 9 to 11 a.m., this one-stop service is selling tickets for most of the plays, musical performances and

dances presented for residents. It's easy to spot in the Rec Center lobby: There's a Box Office banner plus a large white board, which lists all the events with dates and times. Pairs of volunteers accept cash or checks and can specify reserved seats when needed.

The Box Office is the creation of homeowner Sharon Loney.



Surviving spouse must take steps for financial security

Many times after the death of a spouse, the surviving spouse may decide to sell the couple's home in order to scale down or begin some new memories with the purchase of a new home.

If there is to be a loan on the new purchase, personal events can affect credit. In the event of a spouse's death, credit and debt issues may arise. Stabilizing your credit in the event of a death can be difficult, especially if your spouse held all the credit in his or her name.

While resolving your financial affairs, keep in mind that credit accounts opened during marriage are automatically held jointly in California. Paying bills is critical. On-time bill payments during the next 18 to 24 months are important

in order to maintain your credit. Even one late payment can affect your ability to get a new loan or credit card.

By law, a creditor cannot automatically close a joint account or change the terms because of the death of one spouse. Generally, the creditor will ask the survivor to file a new credit application in his or her own name. After reviewing the new information, the creditor will then decide to continue to extend credit or alter the credit limit. It's a good idea to open a new credit card in the surviving spouse's name only.

The Preparedness Corner

Wow! Thank you, Leisure Village! Your response to our new monthly feature, "The Preparedness Corner," has been exciting. We received 93 emails in our first month.

This column is intended to educate our Villagers on how to prepare for a major emergency or disaster.

The answer to last month's question

— Why should you never store water
in plastic containers on concrete?

— is: Because the water leaches up
through the plastic potentially harmful
chemicals from the concrete.

J.S. of Village 33 writes: In the event of a disaster and we don't have enough water, can we drink the reclaimed water used to water our lawns?

No! Humans should never drink our reclaimed water. However, pets, which have different digestive systems, have been known to drink this water out of the gutters with no ill effects. We suggest you contact the Camarillo Water District for complete details on reclaimed water. You should have enough water to last at least three days but preferably a week, at a rate of one gallon a day per resident.
