

Employment Opportunity

Would you like to learn how to prune fruit trees and secure a job where you could work winter time when work is usually hard to find?

Perhaps you can qualify for a four week training course to be given in San Jose which will begin on November 22nd. Afterwards you probably will be able to begin work immediately, earning a good salary, on one of the orchards in the area.

Sixty people are to be selected by the San Jose Farm Labor Office to attend classes which will be conducted by the San Jose School District. Part of the training will be in a classroom, but most of it will be out in the orchards by experienced teachers.

To qualify for this training you would be interested in working outdoors and should be able to understand some English.

You will receive a training allowance for living expenses and you will be asked to attend classes each day, five days a week, for four weeks. By the time you have finished your training, which is being paid for by the State of California, you should be thoroughly qualified as a pruner and be able to go to work immediately.

VETERANS DAY - 1965

A Tribute to M/S Clifford R. Rodriguez

We thought it appropriate this Veterans Day to pay tribute to one of the members of the armed forces of the United States who gave his life for his country.

Master Sergeant Clifford R. Rodriguez was in the United States Army for 14 years and served as a paratrooper in World War II. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross and Purple Heart Medal.

In December 1950 he was wounded in Korea and returned to the United States for rest and treatment. After recovery, he was again assigned to duty in Korea, serving with the 187th Airborne Division.

On May 28, 1951 Master Sergeant Clifford R. Rodriguez was killed in action.

American Legion Post 809 in San Jose was named after him.

El Sr. Presidente Lyndon B. Johnson ha declarado la GUERRA A LA POBREZA.

En agosto de 1964, el congreso paso la legislacion, creando la Oficina de Oportunidad Economica; con la autoridad y respaldo de la Casa Blanca, para dirigir y coordinar los esfuerzos del gobierno y las empresas privadas.

En Octubre de 1964, el Congreso autorizo \$800 millones de dolares, para empezar el ataque en contra de la pobreza.

La Comision de Oportunidad Economica del Condado de Santa Clara, Inc. se incorporo el 22 de Diciembre de 1964, como Corporacion no lucrativa, siguiendo a esto una serie de reuniones y platicas por un comite apropiado, nombrado por los Supervisores del Condado de Santa Clara.

En Febrero de 1965 se aprobo un programa de desarrollo y se nombro un Director Ejecutivo. En los dos meses siguientes se empezaron a formular programas, basados en conferencias con los grupos representativos locales, incluyendo personas de los vecindarios pobres.

El 29 de Abril se sometio a la Comision de Oportunidad Economica, un plan para llevar a cabo 9 programas; ocho de ellos fueron aprobados, agregando a ellos el proyecto Head Start.

En los meses siguientes, el Director de Economic Opportunity Commission del Condado; ha empleado personal para el desarrollo del programa. Se han establecido las Oficinas Generales apropiadas, con el mobilario y equipo necesarios y ha continuado trabajando en el nuevo programa, con los grupos y personas de mayor presentacion en la comunidad.

La Comision de Oportunidad Economica tiene sus Oficinas Generales en 40 N. Fourth Street, San Jose. Ademas de las oficinas generales ya establecidas, se abriran 9 Centros de Servicios en diferentes area

del Condado, estos han sido propuestos en la forma siguiente:

GILROY, EOC Centro de Servicio, situado en la Calle Martin No. 34.

MORGAN HILL (San Martin, Coyote)

EAST VALLEY (Milpitas, Berryessa, Alum Rock, Evergreen)

WEST VALLEY (Los Gatos, Saratoga, Campbell, Cupertino, Monte Sereno, Lexington)

SANTA CLARA (Agnew)

SUNNYVALE (Alviso)

NORTH COUNTY (Mountain View, Los Altos, Palo Alto).

Los servicios que la Comision de Oportunidad Economica prestara a las familias con ingresos anuales menores a \$4,000 seran los siguientes:

HEAD START

El programa HEAD START esta relacionado con la enseñanza para niños de cuatro a cinco años de edad, para que al empezar sus estudios a los seis años, esten familiarizados con el idioma Ingles (en casos en que no lo hablen) y sepan como comportarse al empezar su primer año escolar. Se formaran grupos de doce a quince niños que seran atendidos por cuatro personas, debidamente capacitadas, para guiarlos y enseñarles la preparacion que necesitan.

EL PROYECTO PREP

PREP se encargara de llevar a cabo un programa de educación practica, para adultos y jovenes que esten dedicados a trabajos agricolas o en ocupaciones relativas a los trabajos del campo. Se dara instrucción para que aprendan a hablar, escribir y leer el idioma Ingles, educación en aspectos higienicos, enseñanza de lo que debe de hacer como consumidor, clases de ciudadania para que conozcan sus deberes y derechos como ciudadanos, orientación en la forma en que deben manejar su dinero y preparación en algun oficio. Se formaran grupos de 15 personas y seran atendidos por un profesor y un ayudante.

The War on Poverty

Why Mexican - American Organizations

Are Fighting Back

by bob rodriguez

On November 4, 1965 the local television station KNTV Channel 11 chose sides in the War on Poverty battle between an alliance of Mexican American organizations and the Economic Opportunity Commission of Santa Clara County.

In a stinging editorial delivered by Don McGaffin on the 6 PM and 11 PM news KNTV put its arms around Arthur W. Potts, Executive Director of the local Economic Opportunity Commission and maligned the M-A organizations, and the Mexican American community in general.

The editorial said, in part, "Potts and the EOC Commission has found itself in the delicate position of needing and demanding trained, experienced people on one hand and being unable to find such people who are also Spanish-speaking." "Potts has said many times that he'd give his right arm in exchange for job applications from Spanishspeaking people with the necessary training or experience for such work." "It should be clearly understood that politics is involved here. There are people clamoring for jobs who are neither trained nor experienced for such work. A person without talent, training or experience in a top EOC post easily could become a powerful political figure. But on the other hand, he could do enormous harm to EOC programs which are aimed at assisting the poor." "But doling out flashy titles and fat salaries to people who simply do not qualify for them is foolish."

The editorial was concluded by saying that it was doubtful the poor would be getting much help from the War on Poverty Program "while the EOC finds itself involved in something that is, in a large and silly way, a battle for political patronage."

WE SUBMIT THAT KNTV WAS MIS-INFORMED OR UNINFORMED. They have a right to editorialize, it is their responsibility. They also have a responsibility to check THE OTHER SIDE IF IT IS TO BE RESPON-SIBLE REPORTING.

Where they got their information is unknown to us.....but it doesn't take a Sherlock Holmes to see that it was one-sided..... on the side of the EOC and Arthur W. Potts, the Executive Director.



"The Association has been in existence for 15 years in this area," Mr. Hernandez told El Excentrico. "We seek to improve our quality, learn new techniques, with the end result being better service to our customers. Photography is a very technical field and we must always strive to keep abreast of new developments in our profession by continuously attending meetings, going to schools and reading, reading, reading. This field is so broad, there is always something new to learn, some new technique to be mastered," he concluded.

Maclovio Hernandez lives with his wife Edna in San Jose. They have three sons, Gene, Kenneth and Mark and two daughters, Adele and Phyllis. in allegations from the power structure that these grass-roots organizations are capriciously trying to halt the entire EOC program. It is alleged that these organizations have initiated a "battle for political patronage."

It is too bad that rather than being invited to genuine participation in the development of the EOC program these organizations and others in the county have been excluded.

The insistence that these groups of concerned citizens be kept at a 'safe distance' is completely contrary to the purpose of the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964.

It is a matter of record that from the beginning these Mexican American organizations have asked to be included in the War on Poverty. It is a matter of record that the Commission has systematically made difficult any realistic action leading to this involvement. It is a matter of record that no person on the senior staff level of the Santa Clara EOC has "first-hand knowledge of the culture, the language, and the problems of the target people."

It is a matter of record that the major staff positions were filled before a management study was called to decide the question of a deputy director appointment.

This study was started by one firm and COMPLETED BY ANOTHER!

Honest questions were raised over this matter.

The truth is that the Mexican Americans of Santa Clara County as a group have the greatest stake in seeing the development of the right kind of War on Poverty program. It is the sincere wish of these organizations that this program be carried out in a way consistent with the intent of the federal legislation. This calls for maximum community involvement. There should be no manipulation without representation.

It is the American way to protest injustices, to appeal to constituted authority, to seek redress; it is in the American way to sit down as partners and plan together in this War on Poverty.

This, the Mexican American organizations want and are willing to do. These organizations invite the executive director and the Economic Opportunity Commission to join them in the American way of working together.

There can be no manipulation without representation.

WAR ON POVERTY BATTLE HEADS FOR CLIMAX

On Thursday, NOVEMBER 18, the Economic Opportunity Commission will hold its monthly meeting at the County Welfare Building auditorium.

YOU ARE INVITED TO ATTEND AND SUPPORT THE POSITION OF THE MEXICAN AMERICAN ORGANIZATIONS FOR MORE REPRESENTATION ON THE COMMISSION and high level employment for qualified Mexican Americans.

The battle is reaching a climax. The organizations may resort to peaceful picketing at the next meeting of the Commission. Whatever is necessary will be done until such time as the grievances and demands presented by the organizations are resolved. The organizations have pledged to fight down to the last man.

THE SURGICAL APPROACH TO REVERT THE MEXICAN AMERICAN BACK TO STATUS QUO

The strategy being used against the Mexican American organizations is clearly visible. Malign the Mexican American organizations, question their responsibility, question who they represent, separate them from the Mexican American people, say they are out for politics and are only worried about themselves.....repeat these things over and over till people start believing it. Once the people lose faith in the organizations they are through.....destroyed. Once they are destroyed there will be no organized voice to speak out. If there is no organized voice to speak out the battle is over.

The organizations and the Mexican American people know better.

We have learned the hard way how we have been put down and ignored in the past. Those days have come to an end. We will no longer be spoon fed. We will no longer stay in our proper place as is expected. We will no longer remain quiet. We will no longer be satisfied with double talk and a pat on the back. 

UNIFICATION:

There is a State Mandate that all school districts must be revamped and to unify the present numerous districts so that there may be a more up-to-date system and efficient operation. Well, all seems well and good so long as there is a sensible approach to the problems now existing and providing that we are increasing the efficiency or at least maintain the present level.

The Alviso, Jefferson, and Santa Clara unification will undoubtedly work out real fine, for their area and districts are well within reason.

However, the scheduled unification plan for our East Valley Area is totally unacceptable. First of all in number of districts which will include Milpitas, Airpoint, Berryessa, Alum Rock, Mt. Pleasant, Franklin McKinley, Evergreen, Orchard and Oak Grove.

Second is the size in area covered, which will be approximately 25 miles in length.

How, may I ask you, can we possibly get representation from all the outlying districts at a meeting place that will be up to 25 miles away, when it is sometimes a chore to attend those in the local area?

Also, what about the problems in which some of the districts are now confronted with and in which others have already solved or are not likely to encounter. It seems to me that discouragement will come fast after listening to other district's problems and operation and there being insufficient time allowed for everyone to air their own problems and views.

Therefore it seems that it will be only a matter of time before attendance and productivity will sharply decline. Also it seems to me that there has always been a problem in distribution of school supplies. There has always been a time element involved in requisitioning and delivery with the present set-up, so how could this possibly be overcome with the supply store being centered further away?

Also it is quite obvious that while trying to plan ahead for certain supplies that one may need, and to requisition them ahead of time in order so as to have them when it is needed isn't always going to work out for the best.

Therefore, as I see it the disadvantages will surely outweight the advantages.

We must get together and try to support a much more realistic and acceptable solution. One of which could possibly be to unify no more than three school districts (of their present size) and of reasonable proximity. I would like to urge each and everyone to attend the meetings now being held in your district, to promote a more satisfactory unification program in order that we may be taking a stride forward instead of backward, when the issue comes before the voters in the first part of next year.


