Alternatives: Physics 2a-2aL or 4a-4aL may be substituted for Phys. Sci. 10a; Chem. 1a or 2a for Phys. Sci. 10b.

Electives from anthropology, economics, geography, or sociology.....	3
Electives in the Fine Arts, Foreign Language, or Mathematics.....	0-3
Majors in the biological sciences, social sciences, chemistry, physics, geology, or English, instead of duplicating major courses for general education will be permitted to count 3 units in the major area as meeting the general education content requirement and to complete the unit requirement with a minimum of 3 units in fine arts, foreign language, or mathematics. \* Students having had a health education course which did not include fire prevention, can meet the fire prevention requirement by special arrangement with the chairman of the Health Education Department (or by Hlth. Ed. 105). This should be arranged during the student's first semester at the college.

† The physical education requirement may be waived only on request for students who have a medical excuse from the college physician, or who are 25 years of age or older. Requests should be filed in the Counseling Office. Basic air science (4 semesters) may be substituted for physical education requirement.
