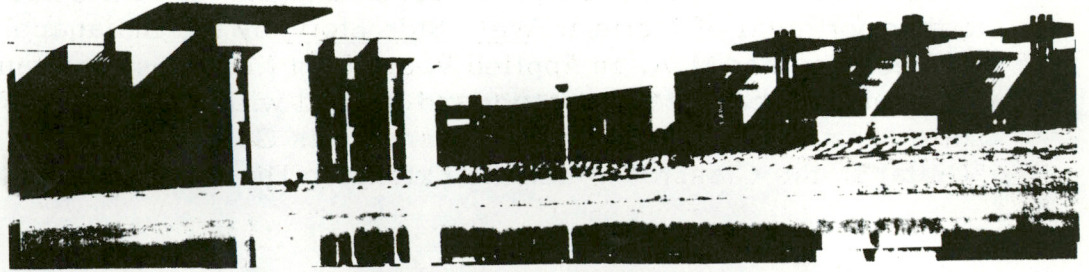
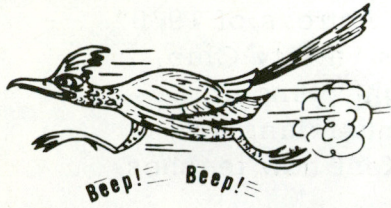

ANNOUNCEMENTS

The students and faculty invite all members of the campus community to attend a special benefit for Peter Ford, the Cal State student who was critically injured in a bicycle-automobile accident last week. The benefit, which is jointly sponsored by the Fine Arts Department and the Draft Information Club, will be held on Thursday, February 25, at 12:00 noon in the Courtyard. Students will circulate in the crowd asking for donations to help offset Peter's medical expenses. Collection boxes will also be placed in various campus locations during the next few days. We urge you to be as generous as possible in your donations.

She received her M.A. in Applied Vocie from Northwestern, taught piano and voice in a Chicago conservatory and worked with such notable musicians as Lotte Lehmann, William Browning, and Boris Godovsky. Mrs. Keet now teaches "Guitar in the Classroom" for the Extension Division at CSB.

PRE-REGISTRATION

Academic advising and pre-registration for spring quarter courses are presently under way.

Pre-registration began on February 17, and will continue through March 2 for students currently enrolled at Cal State Bakersfield. Continuing students are asked to meet with their faculty advisors at a mutually convenient time within the two-week period to discuss their spring program and fill out a course request card for the coming quarter.

Students who did not go through regular advisement during the winter quarter should meet with their school dean or division chairman to secure assignment to an advisor. Lower division students are assigned to an advisory through the office of the Academic Vice President. Students who have transferred to CSB after taking any college courses elsewhere are asked to bring course evaluation sheets to their advising sessions.

Students not enrolled at Cal State Bakersfield this quarter who have received admission for the spring quarter are also asked to contact the chairman of the department to which they were admitted to make arrangements for academic advising during this same period of time.
