

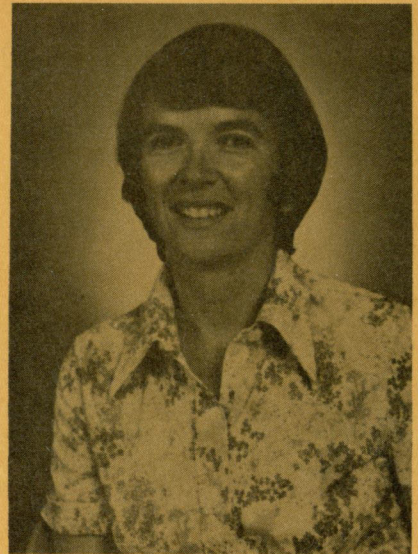

COACH

JUDI GARMAN received her B.A. from the University of Saskatchewan, Saskatoon (Canada) in 1966 and her M.A. from UC Santa Barbara in 1969. While at Golden West College, Judi coached her teams to four straight junior college national championships (1975-1978), three WIAW regional championships (1975-77), a California State championship (1979), four Southern California championships (1973, 1975, 1976, 1979) and six conference championships (1973, 1975-1979). She was a member of the Pan American coaching staff (1979). She has been tournament director of state, regional and national championships. Judy was published in Coaching: Women's Athletics and has received the Sports Illustrated Award of Merit (1976), California Coach of the Year (1977) and is listed in Outstanding Young Women in America (1976) and World's Who's Who of Women in Education (1977). As a player, she was on two Canadian championship teams (1969, 1970) and was named to two world tournament teams (1966, 1970). Her overall coaching record in eight years is 211-40, for a winning percentage of .841.



ASSISTANTS



JOHN CAMPBELL received his B.A. from San Jose State in 1955 and his M.B.A. from Cal State Fullerton in 1970. For the last five years he has been coaching with Judi Garman at Golden West College. During those years, the teams won four straight national championships, the final year winning the state championship. While at Golden West, all of the pitchers he has coached received scholarships to major four year schools. He has been pitching softball since 1948.



LINDA SHAFOR received her B.S. from Ohio State University in 1966 and her M.A. from Long Beach State in 1971. She coached the California Blues (ASA Triple A) to the state championship in 1975. They also came second in the region that year. She coached the Blues from 1968 through 1978. She was also coach at Los Angeles Harbor College, 1971-1978. As a player, she was on the Ohio State and Regional championship team in fast pitch for three years and slow pitch for two. She was named to the Ohio State and Regional All-Tournament teams (both fast and slow pitch) for five years. She was also named to the national All-Tournament slow pitch team and received the high batting award.

THERESA ABPLANALP #14 SOPHOMORE BORN 9/21/60
4'11" RELIEF PITCHER MONTE VISTE HIGH SCHOOL

Theresa's talent is as evident during a home stand as it is behind a music stand. Named as the most valuable freshman, sophomore and junior in high school, she also received the John Philip Sousa Band Award. She was a member of the All-Southern Honor Band in 1978 and is attending CSUF on a music scholarship. This right-hander pitched for the Whittier Ballhawks for four years. She has a 3.47 GPA. The Titans hope she will be as good striking out the batters as striking up the band.

JULIE ANDERSON #12 SOPHOMORE BORN 12/30/60
5'5" PITCHER/1st BASE GOLDEN WEST JUNIOR COLLEGE

Julie was named to the All-CIF 2nd team in 76, 77, 78 while at Los Amigos High School and was named to all-conference teams eight times in three sports (four times in softball, three times in volleyball and once in basketball). She was second team all-conference while at Golden West. In high school she was her senior class president and scholar of the year in 1975. She is a Business Administration major and has a 3.54 GPA.

CHRIS CARNS #6 JUNIOR BORN 6/24/57
5'4" 3rd BASE MT. SAN ANTONIO COLLEGE

Any umpire will think twice before calling Chris out. The right-handed Criminal Justice major holds a second degree brown belt in judo. She played for the 1976 state champion Norco Mavericks. At Covina High School she was named outstanding freshman, sophomore, junior athlete in softball, volleyball and basketball. She was named Athlete of the Year in all three sports her senior year. At Mt. SAC she received the the distinguished athlete award, softball MVP and was named to the South Coast Conference first team.

While at Samuel Ayer High School (San Jose), Carol was named League MVP in 1976 with a .933 fielding average. She was a member of the 1976 CIF champion basketball team and 75-76 state champion track team. She played IGS softball for two years. She was 1975 and 1977 most inspirational in softball and basketball. She is a Physical Education major.

She was 15-7 with six shut-outs while playing with the Palo Alto Bandits (AAA). She was 1977 All-Tournament pitcher and MVP in Fresno Metro. She is a Physical Education major with a 3.2 GPA.

TITAN COACH SPEAKS ON UPCOMING SEASON

"The talent on this team is better than on any Golden West College team I've had," said Judi Garman in what must be considered the ultimate complement.

Garman, who coached Golden West College to four straight junior college national championships, comes to Cal State Fullerton to start the softball program .

Garman's goal is for the team to be "very competitive" in the WCAA. That won't be something that is easy to do.

UCLA was second in the country last year and Arizona and Arizona State are often in the top 15.

"The conference is very strong," she said. "A lot of what happens will depend on who gets the breaks. I think we can be a contender. We have the talent."

Looking at the talent, Garman cites the pitching staff and the depth of the team as its major strengths.

"We have more depth than any team we'll face this year," she said. "I was panicing last July because we didn't have a pitching staff. Now we have a better team than I ever dreamed we'd have."

Garman feels that the biggest strengths of the outfield are their experience and anticipation.

"They can read the balls off the bat. There's not going to be a lot of balls falling in the outfield," she said.

Garman cites Pam Knox as the key to the infield.

"Pam is one of the most underrated players around. She has one of the best gloves I've seen on an athlete," she said. "I hope everyone hits the ball to her."

Garman continued, "At first base, Janet Lloyd is going to surprise a lot of people. She can hit the ball as far as any

woman can."

With a pitching staff of five, Garman plans to have three carry the load: Pamela Edde, Michelle Dunn and Julie Anderson.

"Laurie Jakemer is our ace in the hole. She looked good in our last scrimmage."

Rounding out the pitching staff will be Theresa Abplanalp coming in as a relief pitcher

"We don't know how good we are," said Garman. "We may be very, very good. We beat Cal Poly Pomona in a scrimmage and they were the third in the country last year."

One of Garman's priorities is to get an on-campus playing facility.

"We want to be on campus where we have exposure," she said.

She cites the fact that at Golden West her softball team drew more than any other sport. She feels that playing on campus had a lot to do with that.

The Fullerton City Council is meeting later this month to decide whether or not to light two diamonds on campus. The diamonds would be used during the summer for girls softball sponsored by the city.

Can Garman lead the Titans to a string of national championships as she did at Golden West?

"Our goal is to win one championship. Competition gets tougher and tougher each year, so it will be hard to duplicate that record," she said.

Summing things up, Garman said, "This is an ideal coaching situation. Everyone is new and learning together. It's the most enjoyable season for me ever. I think the players feel that way too." When it comes right down to it, isn't that what softball's all about?
