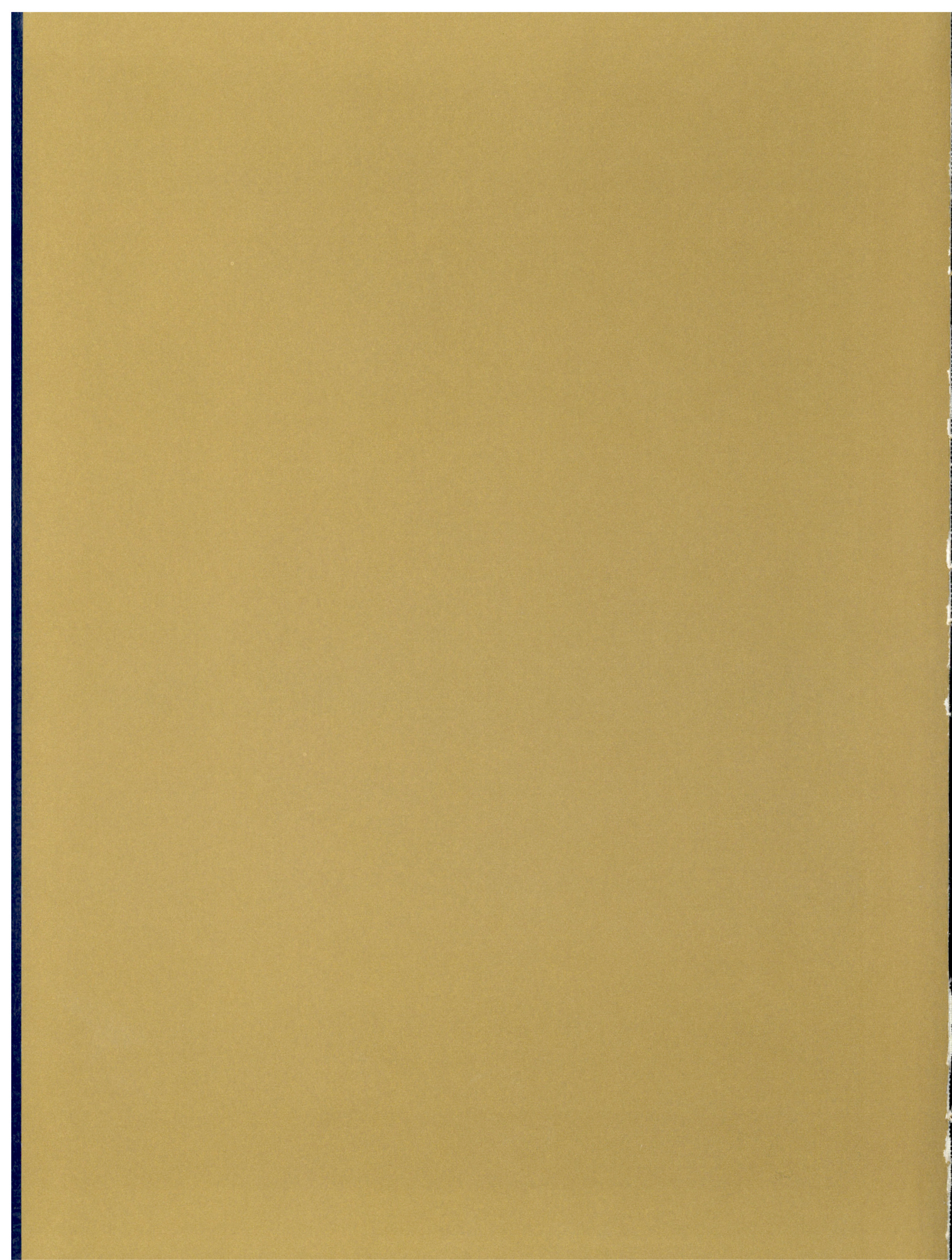


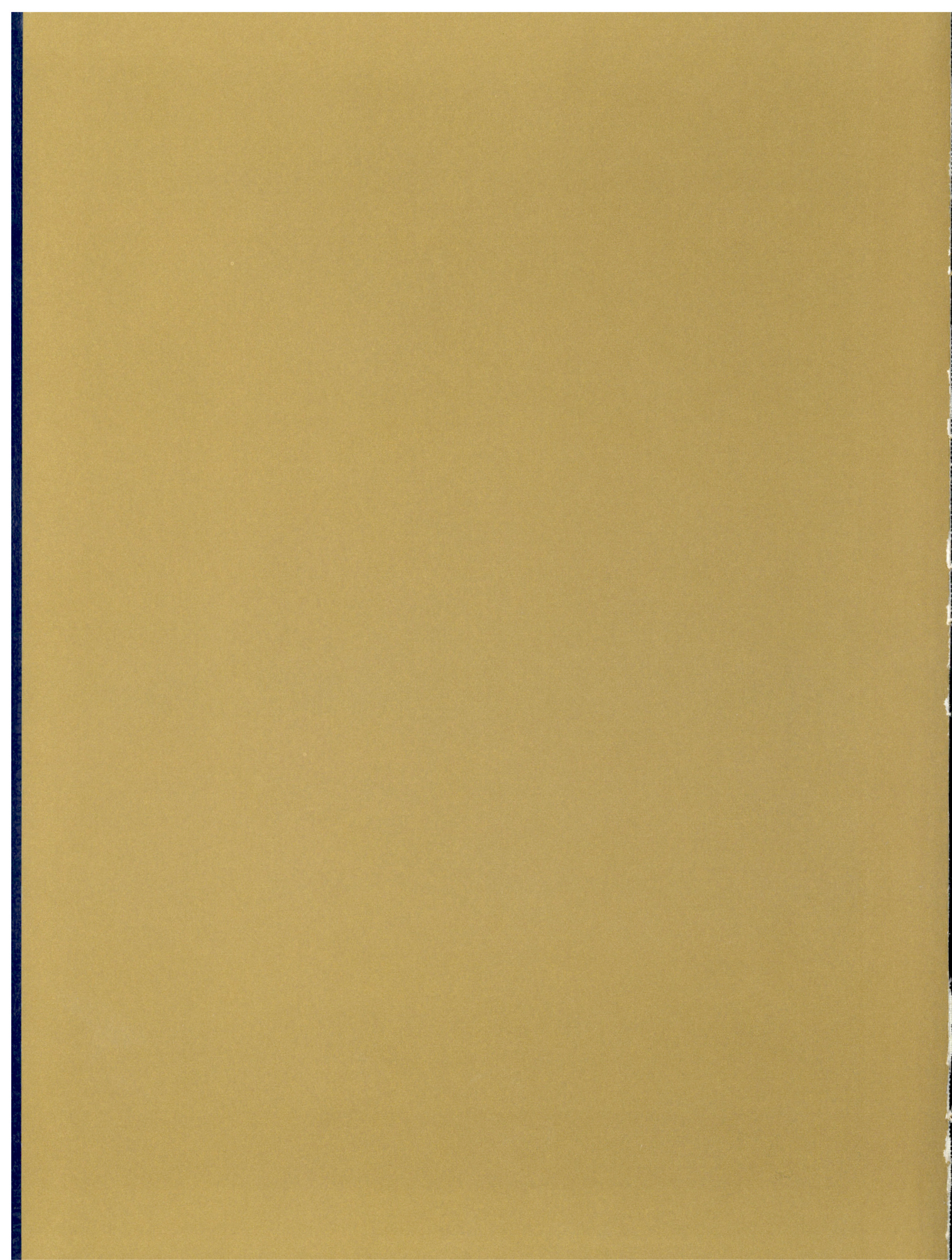

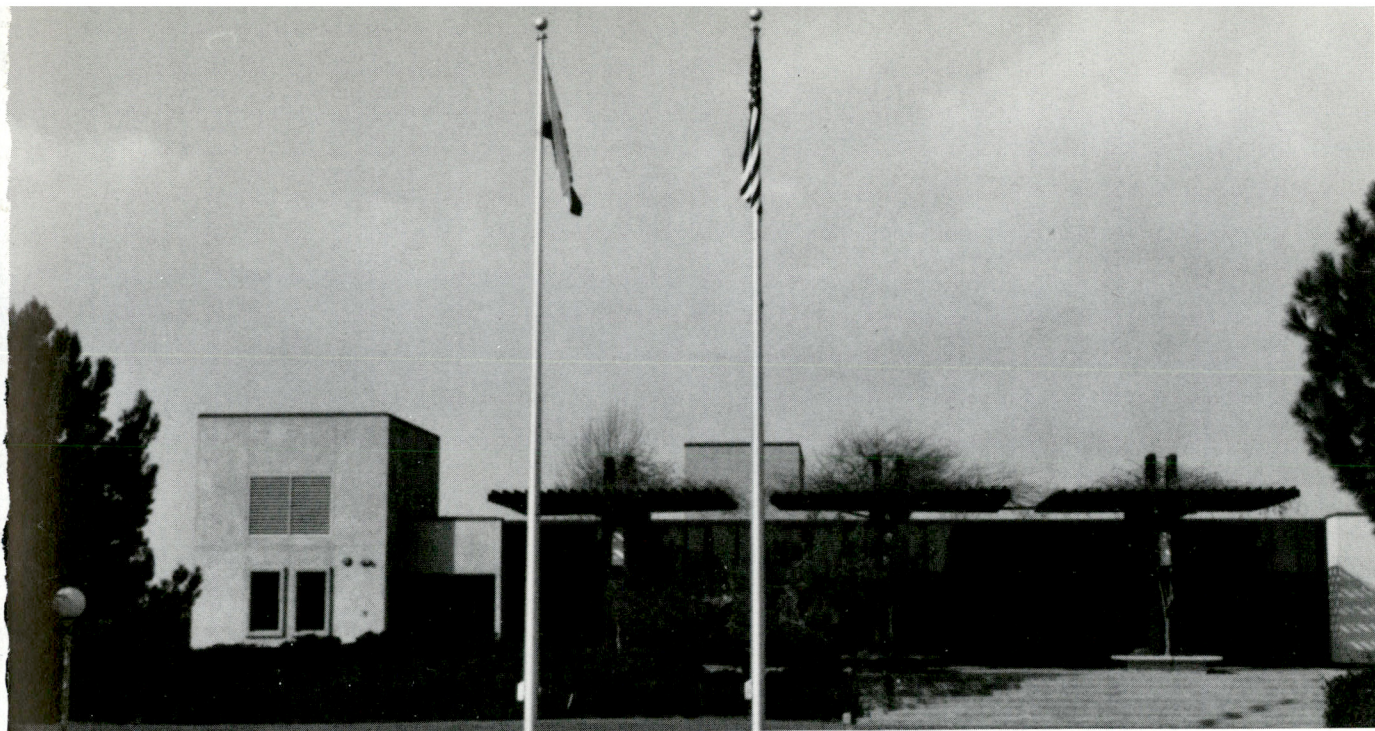

I hope this yearbook will provide a valuable record of your experiences at CSB. May the years to come be productive and satisfying for you.

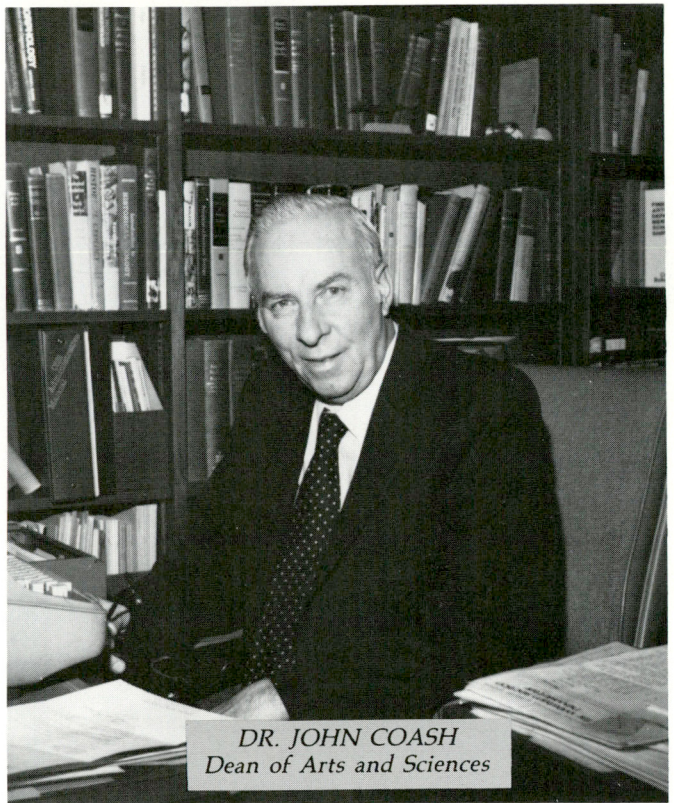

At this time we would like to thank all of those who have participated in making this the best year ever in student government at Cal State Bakersfield.

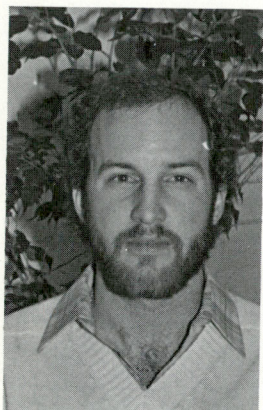

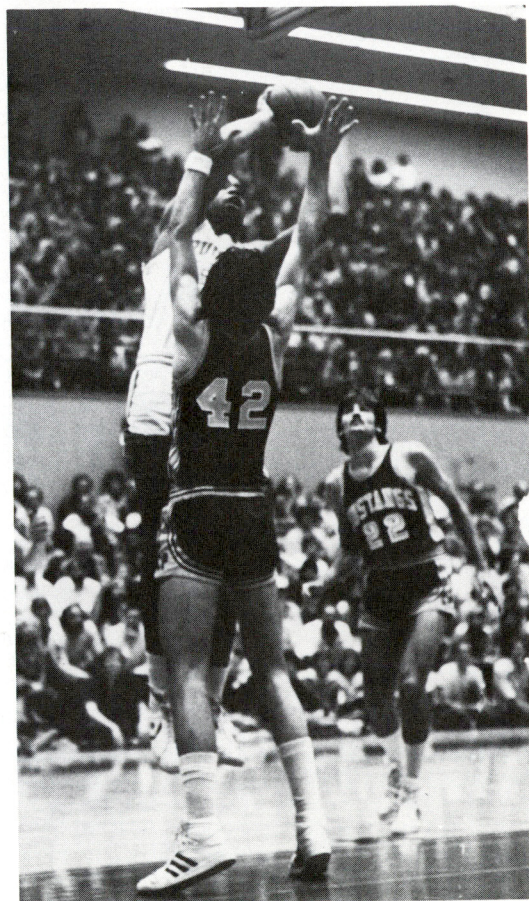
The CSB wrestling team broke its own Division II national tournament record with a score of 166 ½ points at the University of Wisconsin at Parkside. (A) Danny Cuestas (126) became CSB's first two-time Division I National Champion alongside (B) Perry Shea (158) who took second place in Division I. The team finished unofficially in sixth place in Division I.



Congratulations to Bobby Dye, CCAA, NCAA II Western Regional, and Kodak NCAA Division II Coach of the Year.



Sam Barnett, the Western Regional Tournament's Most Valuable Player, led the CSB basketball team to first place honors in both the NCAA Division II Western Regional Tournament and Western Quarter Finals, both held in Bakersfield, and to Springfield, Massachusetts, where they captured fourth place in the NCAA Division II Championships.



This year, CSB's track men outdid themselves by capturing their first CCAA conference title, defeating Cal State Northridge by one point in the decisive mile relay. They were also ranked among the top ten teams at CSU Sacramento in the NCAA Division II Nationals. Seven CSB All Americans emerged from this competition.



This year, the CSB men's tennis team was awarded its second straight CCAA Championship, in addition to having five players named CCAA champions. It also placed second at Florida International University at Tamiami in the NCAA Division II Championships, and a record four players were named Division II All Americans:

Phyllis Blunston, first CSB Track Division I All American. Second place, NCAA Division I Nationals, High Jump.

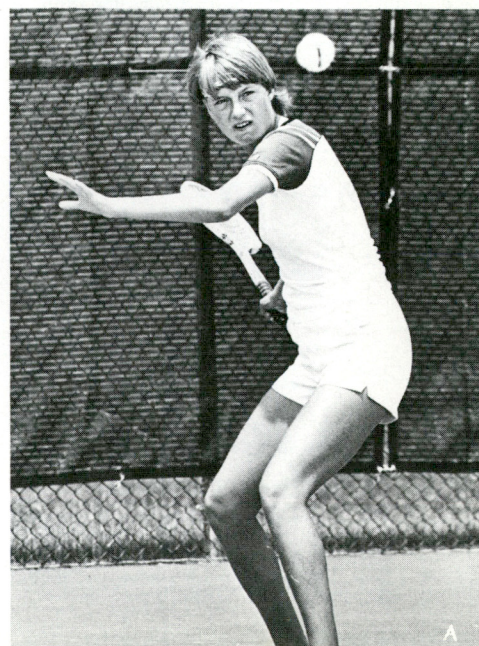

The CSB women's tennis team was proud to place second in both the CCAA Championships and the NCAA Division II Nationals held at Edwardsville, Illinois. Cari Garfield teamed up with Iwona to gain All American recognition by being named in the top four doubles teams at the NCAA Division II.

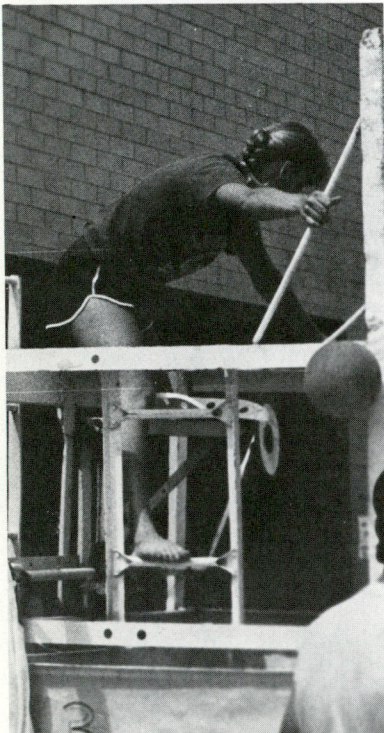

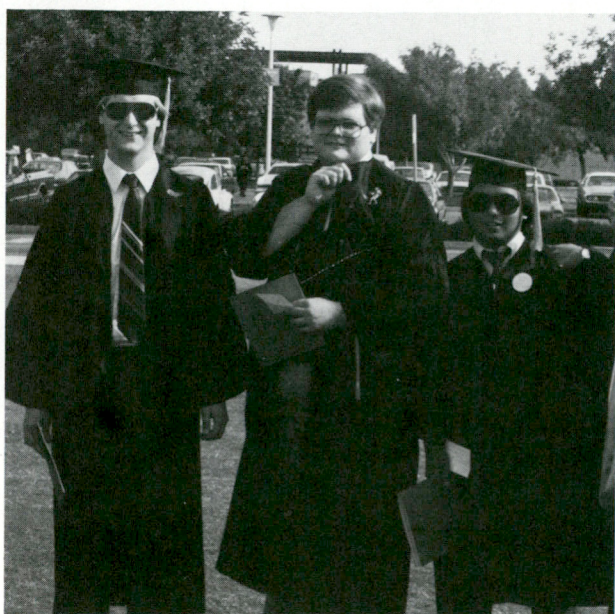
Graduation 1982

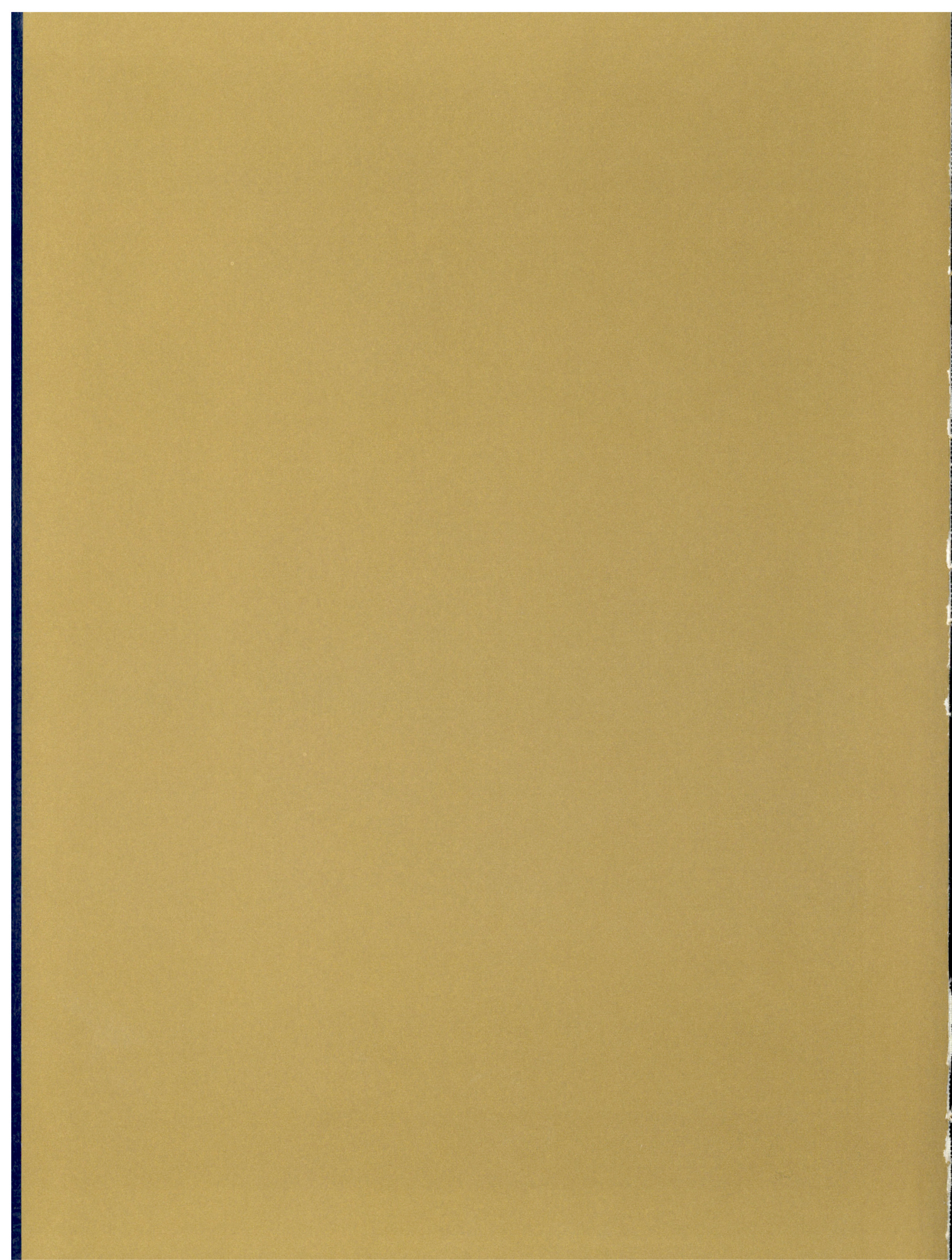
