

CSUCI shares data with the campus community in multiple forums. Some more formal than others, there is an appropriate venue for each member of the campus to engage in providing feedback and input to ongoing strategic planning. This allows for breadth of engagement as well as depth. See selection of examples below:

<b>Strategic Resources Planning Committee:</b> Goals include creating a balanced and sustainable ongoing budget, including strategic investments, assessing capacity, and reallocating existing resources to align with divisional and university priorities. <b>Critical Learning Collective:</b> Related to campus climate surveys, (1) reviews existing recommendations and tracks progress, (2) studies the most recent survey findings, and (3) makes recommendations to the President and senior leadership for new, revised, and/or continued actions for improvement.	Annual open call for participants in year long discussion groups with qualified facilitators
<b>Graduation 2025:</b> Ensuring that all students have the necessary skills and academic supports to complete a degree pathway at CSUCI is the role of the GI 2025 Taskforce within the Division of Academic Affairs. Assesses progress towards GI 2025 goals and reports to Chancellor's Office and campus leadership.	Appointed committee with representative from Division of Student Affairs
<b>Academic Master Planning:</b> Charting Our Course was a six-month campus-wide, strategic planning exercise to identify which degrees and academic programs we will prioritize creating through the rest of this decade.	Faculty-driven but inclusive of CSUCI community participation at various stages of planning and implementation.
<b>President's CI2030 Select Committee:</b> advises President on how to actualize the CI2030 strategy and organizing principles for how to achieve the University's mission in our third decade of institutional development	Appointed committee for initial consultation, plans to engage campus community forthcoming.
<b>Inclusive Excellence Action Planning:</b> Select themes to advance racial and social justice at CSUCI in these six action areas to facilitate student success and understand and address campus climate pain points.	Campus-wide engagement, see <a href="#">methodology</a> for more details.
<b>Reaffirmation Steering Committee:</b> Responsible for developing and facilitating the campus self-study related to Thematic Pathway for Reaffirmation to demonstrate consistent evidence of a healthy fiscal condition, strong student achievement indicators, and sustained quality performance.
