

# Relief Vessel's Departure To Be Colorfully Feted

Governor Earl Warren, California's leading supporter of the good will mission of the California Maritime Academy training ship Golden Bear, will be in Vallejo tomorrow to give his personal "God speed" message to the vessel as it leaves the dock at Morrow Cove. Governor Warren last

night informed the local Friend Ship committee that he will be able to attend the ceremonies marking the Golden Bear's departure on its mission of relief.

Accompanying the state's chief executive to Vallejo will be his son, Earl, Jr., who will make the four-month cruise to Europe as an honorary "cadet."

A committee of prominent Vallejoans, who have directed the drive to stock the CMA Friend Ship with tons of good will gifts to hungry Europe, will welcome Governor Warren and will take part in the pre-sailing ceremonies.

## VALLEJOANS INVITED

The group, headed by Ernest D. Wichels and Hollis Gray, has invited every resident of Vallejo to attend the program, which will start at 11:30 a.m. tomorrow.

A colorful farewell ceremony has been planned to send the Golden Bear on its way to Europe stocked with food and clothing for destitute families in France, Italy and Greece. Bands from Vallejo high school and junior college will be at the CMA pier to provide music for the program.

The training ship Golden Bear will be decorated from stem to stern with banners and posters proclaiming the good wishes of Vallejo and Solano county.

Cameramen from three major newsreel companies—Movietone, MGM and Universal—will record the loading and departure of the Golden Bear in film for distribution throughout the United States.

# Rescue Ships Save Crew of Burning Vessel

Less than an hour later, the General Callan radioed Coast Guard that it had picked up the Connolly on its radar screen at a distance of 22 miles and was moving in for the rescue. Its wireless crackled the location to the Union Victory.

Both rescue ships apparently reached the scene at the same time—about 2 p.m. They flashed back the good news that lifeboats with survivors had been sighted.

For an hour, there was no word and then the Coast Guard announced that three, then four boatloads of survivors had been saved. Finally, came the bulletin that all 46 who had been on the Connolly were safe and that except for a "few" who suffered bruises, none had been injured.
