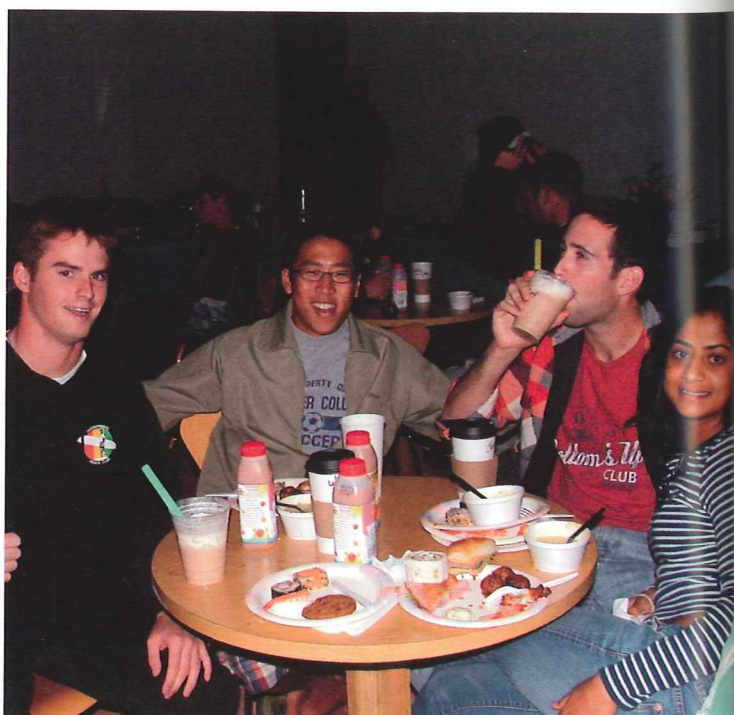
Charging the American River

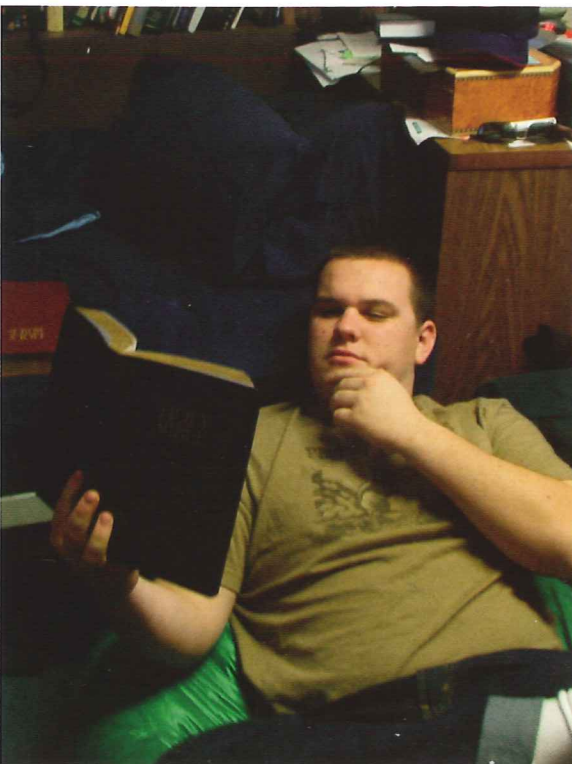


Bible Club
