As a member of the CSUH community you may want to become involved with an activity or a group of particular interest to you, or if it does not exist, start one of your own. The University encourages the establishment of clubs, organizations, and other groups that are of interest to students. There is a wide variety of organizations ranging from academically related, pre-professional organizations, recreational clubs, religious oriented clubs, ethnic interests, plus many, many more. If you wish to get in touch with an already existing organization, check over the following list, then contact the Activities Office for further information. If what you want is not listed, then you may want to continue reading on . . . "How to Start a Club or Organization."

Your first step is to contact the Activities Office. It's found on the 4th floor of the Administration Building. First, you'll see an advisor to begin the "chartering" process; the advisor will explain this process and start you off with a form called "Intent to Organize". Once approved by the Associate Dean of Students (usually within 1-2 days) you will be entitled to some extra privileges, including use of University rooms for meetings, use of University equipment, and allowed space on bulletin boards to publicize your club. All of these privileges can be arranged through the Activities Office. Next comes the forming of the basic structure of your club, consisting of an "Application for Charter" and a constitution. The application will need the names of 12 students who would like to see the organization on campus and would consider joining.

The constitution is a bit more involved. It will have a statement of purpose, plus guidelines on how the club will conduct its business. The Activities Office will help you accomplish this by supplying you with a model constitution to use as a guide. Once these two items are completed then you and your advisor will check over the application and constitution. If all is in order, the Associate Dean will sign the application and then send it to the subcommittee on club chartering of the Student Affairs Committee for final approval. Don't panic — it's not as long and involved as it sounds. The time line is usually about 2 weeks from the time the constitution is returned to the Activities Office to charter approval. Once all of this is accomplished you are free to conduct your activity at Cal State.
