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Program Description

Summer College is a special program sponsored by the Oxnard Union High School District Migrant Education program designed to encourage high school students to attend college. The unique summer program combines language skills, study skills, and career exploration in addition to a three-credit unit college course. To enhance the experience, field trips to local sites give students a lively hands-on way to interact with the course content. The Summer College program aligns with the CSUCI mission to provide educational opportunity for traditionally underserved populations in our local community.



Partners In Student Success

Oxnard Union High School District Migrant Education obtained a grant to open higher education access to this population and has partnered with CSUCI to accomplish this goal. OUHSD Migrant Education staffs each high school with a migrant education counselor to identify and encourage these students to apply for the program.



Parents of selected students are important partners. As this is often the first child to attend college for these parents, an introductory parent meeting is held to explain what an honor it is for their child to be selected, the amount of study and homework their child will experience, the significance of a permanent record, and the importance of attendance. This meeting also covers the benefits and goals of the Summer College program. The month-long program ends with a Summer College Awards Banquet for the families and guests to celebrate the accomplishments of the students.

CSUCI professors and prominent local professionals give of their time to share knowledge of their profession. Graduate students have been invited to share their story of education and their career with the students. When the students first arrive, many say they could never attend such a wonderful school. However, CSUCI Admission and Financial Aid staff provides essential information of the admission process that inspires a path for future success.

Program History

CSUCI – Extended Education has offered a college preparatory program for children of migrant workers from local high schools for the last 5 years. The program course attendance averages 33 students each year with total of 166 students who have participated. Courses are chosen to help students meet undergraduate entry requirements when they are ready to transfer.
