

Dossier and sabbatical leave deadlines announced

Dossier submission

In accordance with the Promotion, Tenure and Retention Policy and Procedures, the deadline dates for dossier submission by candidates for retention, tenure and promotion are announced as follows:

Tenure and promotion
October 1, 1993
Retention:
1st & 2nd year
November 10, 1993
3rd, 4th & 5th year
January 15, 1994

Section 3.8 provides: "A candidate who submits the dossier after the established deadline will not be considered for promotion that year, and the Department Chairperson shall so notify the School Dean in writing, with a

copy to the candidate. In the case of a candidate for retention or tenure who fails to comply with the obligation to provide within the established deadlines a dossier of materials in accordance with Article 15.12 of the Memorandum of Understanding, the evaluation will proceed on the basis of material deemed appropriate by the Department Chair after consultation with the School Dean."

Theorists gather to discuss changes in public administration

The Public Administration department will be hosting the sixth national Public Administration Theory Conference on campus from July 14 to 16.

The theme is "Prospective and Retrospective Visions of Public Administration Theory: a Time for Assessment; a Time for Change."

"We are very honored to have this conference here," said Jong Jun, professor of public administration. "Every year it is held at a different accredited school and this year we were chosen." This year's meeting precedes the National ASPA (American Society of Public Administration) Conference in San Francisco.

During the theory conference academics from around the world will hear colleagues give presentations on topics ranging from "Searching for the Best Structure for American Local Government" to "Madonna and Sex: Constitutional Stewardship vs. Administrative Fantasies."

Two CSUH faculty members will be presenting papers: Jun on "Understanding Hidden Dimensions of Administration: Japanese Culture and Its Impact," and Dvora Yanow on "Implementation As Interpretation."

Friend of campus dies
