Born in Oxnard, California, Michele Serros was a UCLA undergraduate when her first book of poetry and short stories, **Chicana Falsa**, was published. When Lalo Press, the original publisher of **Chicana Falsa**, went out of business, Michele sold copies of the book from her garage. Since then, **Chicana Falsa** has become required reading in high schools and universities across the country.

An award-winning poet and commentator for NPR, Serros has released a spoken-word CD on Mercury Records and toured with Lollapalooza as one of their "Road Poets." She was recently selected by the Getty Research Institute and the Poetry Society of America to have her poetry placed on MTA buses throughout Los Angeles County and is a featured contributor for the *Los Angeles Times*' children's fiction section.

Serros is currently writing a book of short stories, *How to be a Chicana Role Model*, that will be published by Riverhead Books.

Forced to sell copies of **CHICANA FALSA** out of her garage when the original publisher, Lalo Press, went out of business shortly after the book's publication, Michele Serros single-handedly managed to turn her collection into a word-of-mouth success. **CHICANA FALSA** is currently being taught at high schools and universities across the country, including UCLA, New York University and the University of Texas at Austin. Serros captured national attention with a Mouth Almighty/Mercury Records CD version of *Selected Stories from Chicana Falsa* and as a touring poet for Lollapalooza '94. Michele and **CHICANA FALSA** will be featured in upcoming issues of *Mademoiselle* and *Buzz*.
