#### Coach Judi Garman

Judi Garman is in her third year as softball coach at Cal State Fullerton and this could be the season that elusive charm national championship trophy - finds its

way to her bulging trophy case.

The instantly successful Titans have come remarkably close to the title, finishing ninth in their maiden 1980 season and second in 1981, but their performance has been typical of Garman-coached teams. Championships have followed her across the continent from Canada to the University of California at Santa Barbara to Golden West College in Huntington Beach to Cal State Fullerton.

Building our own facility and winning a national title are our goals here at Fullerton," said Garman, who won four consecutive national junior college champion-ships at Golden West. "Hard work and enthusiasm are the keys, I guess. You've got to be willing to work harder than anyone

else.'

Garman built the Golden West program from the ground up and she is repeating the process at Fullerton.

"We started out with no facilities but eventually built a beautiful complex with two lighted fields, a snack bar and the whole works. It was difficult to leave that and start all over at Fullerton.

The Titans will charge admission for home games in 1982 at nearby Lions Field while plans are on the drawing board for two lighted fields on the Fullerton campus, where Garman's rise to prominence has been even faster than at Golden West.

At Golden West in 1971 she inherited a team which was winless the previous year and took it to a 9-8 showing. Two years later she had captured a conference crown and it took two more years for regional and national pennants.

Starting with nothing at Fullerton, she has taken the Titans to the national championship tournament in her first two years and in 1981 the Titans came within one run of the top prize, losing to Utah State, 4-3, in the final game of the nationals after dominating the Western Collegiate Athletic Association and the regional tournament.

Garman comes from a softball family. Her mother Ruth was a physical education teacher and softball coach at Messiah College in Pennsylvania and her aunt also coached. She grew up in Kindersley, Saskatchewan and by the eighth grade was playing on a senior women's team. She then joined the Saskatoon Imperials. Twice they were Canadian Champions and in 1970 Garman was a member of the National Team at the World Softball Tournament in Osaka, Japan. In 1967 she was an all-star Canadian outfielder.

In 1966 she graduated from the University of Saskatchewan and looked for a warmer climate.

"My sister took a vacation and went through Santa Barbara," Garman recalled. "She said it was about the prettiest place she could imagine going to school and that's how I ended up there.

While working on her master's degree, Garman started club softball and soon had a varsity team (1967-69). Upon completion of her studies she took the women's athletic directorship at Westmont College in Santa Barbara and coached volleyball. basketball and tennis in addition to soft-

"Then came budget cuts and I moved to Golden West as a P.E. instructor and coach," she said. "I inherited a team which lost one game 21-0 in five innings."

Garman also served as basketball (1973-76) and cross country (1977-79) coach at Golden West, but she always favored softball due to her competitive background in that sport. Twenty-one of her players received scholarships to four-year institutions, against whom she manufactured a 34-11-2 record over the years.

In great demand as a speaker and instructor at clinics, Garman has conducted her own sessions at Golden West and Fullerton, attracting hundreds of coaches and young softball players. She served as a consultant at a camp in Alaska in 1980 and last summer enjoyed a trip to Sweden with the Titan team for series of clinics and exhibitions.

Fishing and snow skiing occupy Garman's time away from the softball field. She also has been published in many physical education journals and even was a pioneer in the equality in sports movement.

"I played Little League baseball," Garman recalled. "I was starting second baseman, but when our team got to the regionals the other team objected and I couldn't play any more."

### ... Oh, So Close!

In their second trip to the College World Series in as many tries, the Titans' final rally came up one run short and they finished second to defending champion Utah State. Highlights of the Series in Oklahoma.

#### Game 1

Down to their final strike, the Titans rallied for a 7-6 win in eight innings over New Mexico State. Janet Lloyd's three-run home run on an 0-2 pitch with two out in the seventh inning sent the game into overtime, where catcher Tami Hart picked a judicious spot for her first homer of the season.

#### Game 2

Terry Keasling stole the spotlight when she pitched a two-hitter, struck out 13 and hit a two-run home run for a 15-inning 2-0 win over Western Michigan. Sue Lewis went four-forseven on her way to a Series record 14 hits and was on base for the game-winning blow.

#### Game 3

Terry Keasling came right back with another gem for a 10-inning 1-0 shutout victory over California. Tami Hart singled home Sue Lewis, who went three for three.

#### Game 4

Utah State captured the upper hand with a 2-0 victory. The Titans managed only two hits (Debi Jones and Chris Carns) and handed the Aggies a pair of unearned runs.

#### Game 5


Sue Lewis hit a pair of home runs and Pam Edde came on in relief to stop a seventh-inning rally as the Titans held on for a 5-4 victory over UCLA. Edde had to get out of a two on, nobody out situation for Fullerton to beat UCLA for the sixth time in a row.

#### Game 6

A six-run sixth inning carried the Titans to a 6-1 victory over Utah State to set up a showdown in game seven. Chris Carn's runscoring double triggered the explosion.

#### Game 7

In a contest befitting a national championship game, Utah State survived a seventhinning Cal State Fullerton rally for a 4-3 victory and the title. The Titans overcame an early 1-0 Utah State lead when Sue Lewis hit a two-run home run in the third inning but the Aggies came right back with two unearned runs in the fourth and added a tally in the fifth. Fullerton cut the lead to 4-3 in the seventh on Tami Hart's single and a Utah State error but the Aggies turned a double play and then got the final out on a long fly to center field.




Leaping Pam Edde: Above, she leaps in vain for an enemy home run.

California State University, Fullerton, is a relatively young institution, having opened only 22 years ago. However, it already has grown to more than 23,000 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 81 degree programs - 39 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A more recent development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 7,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has recently embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make the university the foremost bachelor's-master's degree institution in the nation.

#### Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980 to replace Dr. L. Donald Shields, who had resigned after a ten-year term to accept the presidency of Southern Methodist University.

Dr. Cobb had served as Dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of Professor of Biological Sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was Dean of Connecticut College and Professor of Biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the west coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree in 1944 from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University in 1947 and 1950, respectively. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a student in the Cornell University Medical School.







#### Acting Athletic Director Ed Carroll



Ed Carroll, a former Titan athlete, has become an integral part of the administration of the Cal State Fullerton athletic department. He has held as many as three positions at one time — athletic director, business manager and director of the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Carroll returned to his alma mater in November of 1980 to serve as business manager and assistant athletic director under Mike Mullally. In June of 1981, Mullally resigned and football coach Gene Murphy took the top job on an interim basis with Car-

roll moving up to an associate athletic director's post. In November, Murphy stepped down and Carroll was appointed acting athletic director by President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb.

A captain of the wrestling team during his undergraduate days, Carroll remained at Fullerton as an assistant coach (1973-75) and then as an assistant in the intramural department. He left Cal State in 1980 to pursue his doctorate at Indiana University but changed his plans when the business manager's role became available.

#### Associate Athletic Director Leanne Grotke



Leanne Grotke came to Fullerton in August of 1978 from Indiana University to serve as women's athletic director. When the department was centralized in early 1981 she was appointed to her current title.

Under Grotke's direction, three women's sports — golf, cross country and softball — have been added to the Fullerton program. She serves as president of the Western Collegiate Athletic Association.

The highly successful "Runnin' Rally" has been one of her many projects in the past few years.
