## Men's Gym Used For Evacuation Of Local Japanese

For the duration of this week the Men's gym will be utilized as a Japanese evacuation center for the north and northwest portion of Santa Clara county.

Under the direction of Mr. Hillis Hooper, manager of the San Jose branch of the United States Em-

Hooper, manager of the San Jose branch of the United States Employment Service, and Mr. Robert Baker, assistant manager, facilities have been set up in the gymnasium to register the Japanese prior to their evacuation to assembly centers.

According to Mr. Hooper, 600 Japanese will be evacuated Tuesday, 600 Wednesday, 600 Thursday, and 650 Friday. This will clear the surrounding area of the Japanese population entirely. Tables have been set up in the

gym similar to the campus registration set-up. At one table there

will be social workers to assist the evacuees with any family problems they may have. Another table has been set up for the United States Public Health Service. Problems concerning real estate will be taken care of by the Federal Farm Security Agency. Representatives of the Federal

Reserve Bank will be on hand to

take care of questions of storage and automobiles.

Miss Helen Mineta, secretary of the Speech department, and Phil Matsumura, a former student, are acting as receptionists. David Sakai, president of the campus Japanese club, and Sud Sadayuki are

assisting with traffic.
