

Because of the growth expected for Oxnard during the coming decade, the City Council faces critical decisions.

I wish to serve on the City Council because I want those decisions to be correct -- that I will still want to live in Oxnard in ten years.

The major decisions facing the council if it is to create and maintain a balanced, truly great city relate to:

1. Public Service:

~~which includes~~ Quality water, ~~roads~~ and reapportionment of UWCD

Sewer treatment and disposal ~~up to date~~

Further flood control

2. Pollution

Of air water and noise

3. Residential, commercial and Industrial zoning

4. Airport location and utilization

5. Community recreation and the need to keep/neighborhood ^{the} park up with the population needs.

6. Double taxation -- the elimination of taxes city people pay for services not received.

We have adopted a General Plan. To insure that we use this tool of planning to have a balanced city, we need intelligent, informed and courageous councilmen whose decisions are not unaffected by ~~commercial developer, industrial polluters and~~ special interests. A balanced city is one with accepted percentages of industrial, commercial and residential zoning, compatibly located.

To protect this balance we will need to be aggressive in seeking good clean industries. We are fortunate that we are a rare coastal city and, even more, that we have an ideal climate. We can attract the best. We should guard against bad industries, ones that cause air, water or noise pollution. These industries instead of benefiting the community would drive people and good industries from the city making it unpleasant for those who

who have to remain. This would also be entirely harmful to retail business, a vital source of support for any city.

For the same reasons I am against the expansion of the Ventura County Airport into a jet airport. If the County should acquire Oxnard Air Force Base I would oppose its use as a jet airport. Besides the problems of pollution there is the danger of an accident in heavily populated areas.

As a councilman I will not engage in personal vendettas nor allow them to influence my decisions. We need to unite as a city under the leadership of the council to solve the problems ~~with us and ahead of~~ of this growing city.
