He joined Gibson Publications in 1941 as city editor of the Times-Herald and became managing editor of both newspapers in 1945 upon return from naval service.

Newspaper activities include membership in Sigma Delta Chi, national honorary journalistic fraternity; California Associated Press News Executives Council of which he was chairman 1949-50; and the Associated Press Managing Editors Association.

Riley was the first chairman of the Vallejo Chamber of Commerce Maritime Academy Committee.
