

## ELECTION DAY INSTRUCTIONS FOR WALKERS

### 1. REPORT TO HEADQUARTERS

At that time you will receive your "get out the vote" kit. It includes:

- a. Index cards with the names of the registered Democrats in your precinct.
- b. A map of your precinct.
- c. Instructions on how to get out the vote.
- d. Reminder tags for people who are not at home.

### 2. OUT IN THE PRECINCT

a. The location of your polling place is listed on the front of your "get out the vote" kit. Immediately upon arriving at your precinct, go to your polling place. Posted in front of the polling place is a list of registered voters in the precinct. People who have voted have a line through their name. Remove the cards of all those who have voted.

b. Organize your remaining cards systematically by street and address.

### 3. TURNING OUT THE VOTE

- a. Plan the order of streets you will visit and begin walking.
- b. Knock on the door of each person listed on your cards.
- c. Remember your job is to remind people to vote and give assistance to those who need it.

### 4. WHAT DO YOU SAY

Hello, is Mrs. Jones home? How do you do, Mrs. Jones. I am a Democratic precinct worker. Do you know where your polling place is? (If she does not know, give her the information; if she says she does, continue your talk.) I hope you will vote today and cast your ballot for Governor Brown and the Democratic Ticket. Can we help you in any way? Do you need transportation? A babysitter? Thank you for your time. BE COURTEOUS. (This is only a suggested talk -- you may want to develop your own approach.)

### 5. WHAT DO YOU DO IF NO ONE IS HOME

Leave your voting reminder card hooked to the door and return later.

### 6. HOW OFTEN DO YOU RETURN TO THE POLLING PLACE

Return to the polling place every time you finish going through your cards. Check the cards of people who have not voted with the list posted at the polling place.

### 7. REPORTING TO HEADQUARTERS

Call headquarters ~~every hour and a half~~ <sup>if</sup>. Report voter turnout. Need for assistance such as transportation, babysitters, etc.

### 8. UNUSUAL PROBLEMS

Many households will have both Democrats and Republicans. Give your pitch only to the Democrats.

### 9. THE FINAL DRIVE

Check your polling place list at 6 o'clock. Discard the cards of those who have voted. Visit the homes of your remaining voters. This is the crucial hour. It is the last chance to turn out every voter.

### 10. IT'S ALL OVER

Return to your polling place and see how many Democrats voted. Report the results to headquarters.
