

Rec Manager suits up in U.S. Navy Reserves; returns from England

Mention the name Susan Rockwell and we picture a smiling Recreation Manager who supervises all the activities at the Recreation Center. But then mention the name Yeoman Chief Petty Officer Susan Rockwell and a different picture emerges, one of a professional Naval Reservist who recently returned from an assignment in West Ruislip, just outside of London, England. In that capacity, Susan still maintains the same smiling countenance but in a Naval uniform.

Susan joined the Naval Reserve in 1995 and is assigned to the Non-Prior Service Training Unit at Point Mugu, where she serves one weekend a month and a two-week assignment. The role of the unit is to take new enlisted mature adults who have a background in administra-

tion and make them into sailors.

In England, her role was different. For 19 days she worked in the Fleet and Family Support Center to support active duty and mobilized Reservist families in the Fleet who have been newly assigned to London and may not have home essentials they need. These essentials include sheets, towels, cooking utensils, potato peelers and all items to set up house. In addition, she was there to help Naval personnel who were returning to civilian life.

In a prior assignment in Naples, Italy, Susan wrote the "Force Protection Manual" for whole Mediterranean area. When 9/11 hit, she helped to deploy all over the world 55 people in the Law Enforcement and Physical Security Unit. As you can see, her assignments are varied, reflecting the rich

Sandy Okum, ILV founder, dies at 89



A humanitarian and philanthropist and a man with a heart of gold — these were some of the words used by friends and family to describe Leisure Village resident Sanford "Sandy" Okum, who died Oct. 20 of cardiac arrest. He was 89.

In the over 25 years he lived at the senior community in Camarillo, Okum was instrumental in spearheading several health-care programs for more than 3,000 Leisure Village residents.

It was his 35 years of experience as a pharmacist in Los Angeles where he honed his passion of helping others, said Okum's older brother Maurice, 95.

"He was such a kindhearted person ... he

always smiled, was friendly, cheerful and always tried to help people," Maurice said. "He felt that he was on this earth strictly to help others. He's going to be missed quite a bit by a lot of people because he did a lot of good for many people here."

Chorus performs at LV on Jan. 9



Santa Paula-Ojai Loop makes an ideal day trip

One of the many great one-day trips for Villagers is the "Santa Paula-Ojai Loop."

Santa Paula features the Unocal Oil Museum at Main and Tenth Streets. On display are historical items and a pictorial history of the early oil days in Ventura County. The nearby aging railroad station is a memory shaker, and you might even see it being used as a movie set.

As you proceed, vintage homes border your route on Highway 150, the Ojai Road. You'll pass Thomas Aquinas College and Sulphur Springs. Note the seeping oil in spots on the uphill side of the road.

Upper Ojai Valley can be a surprise, with its schools, ranches and mountains. Proceeding downhill from the East, you get a sense of what Ojai, "The Nest," is all about. Use vista parking

pulloffs; visit Libbey Park and the downtown areade as well as the Ojai Valley Inn.

Between Ojai and Ventura on Highway 33, you'll have an opportunity to view Lake Casitas and travel through several small communities. Slow down throughout and enjoy. Beautiful scenery and good food abound.

This entertaining tour involves about 80 miles of driving from Camarillo to Camarillo around the "Loop." It's memorable.



Group, which brought local doctors and nurses who offered free blood pressure clinics, flu shots and medical advice to the Villagers.

Okum's contribution to Village residents didn't stop there. He donated medical equipment such as wheelchairs, walkers and shower benches, sometimes paying for them out of his own pocket.

Okum also served as an unofficial driver for those who were unable to find transportation to and from medical appointments.

"If somebody was in a fix to get to a doctor's office, he took care of them personally and saw that they would

get to the drugstore or the doctor's office," recreation center administration assistant Debra McAdams said.

Under his direction, Okum also pushed for all residents to participate in the "Vial of Life" program, which is a tube kept in a resident's refrigerator that contains doctor's names and a medicine list.

Okum also was the founder and editor-in-chief of Inside Leisure Village, the senior community's newspa-

Okum is survived by his brother and sister-in-law, Maurice and Shirley; numerous nephews and nieces, and his companion for about three years, Ruth Frankenberg.






Imagine... This is a Map of Leisure Village
