March 28, 1914.

OUTLINE OF BUSINESS.

1. Resigantion of James M. Duffy, dairyman, effective March 21.
Acceptance recommended.
2. Recommend promotion of G. F. Drummond, present assistant dairyman, to position of dairyman. Salary \$70.00 per month and cot-tage. Drummond's present salary is \$65.00. Duffy's present salary, \$80.00. Recommend that this transfer be effective April 1st.
3. E. Piercy, night watchman, transferred to grounds labor March 1st. A night patrol between nine and eleven P. M. now made by second engineer Graves. For financial reasons only, recommend that service of night watchman on full time be discontinued until such time as funds of the institution will permit.
4. Expenditure of Support fund for salary of regular employees, such as janitor, carpenter, matron, farm hands, and others.
5. General repair work, such as plumbing, pipe fitting, tire setting, gas engine repairs, machine repairing, etc. etc. Suggest employment of a mechanic on full time beginning July 1st.
6. The teaching staff for 1914-'15. Formal appointments regu-larly made at the April semi-annual meeting (This year Saturday, April 25th).
7. The Treasurer. Shall the Contingent fund be deposited in one bank and the money received from Sacramento from state appropria-tions in another bank?

8. Annual farmers' picnic Friday, May 15th. Dean T. F. Hune, of the State College of Agriculture, has promised to speak.

9. Annual graduation Friday evening, June 12th. Invitation extended to Judge M. T. Dooling of San Francisco to speak. No answer yet received. Place for holding exercises; Elmo Theater very desirable; high rental required; ask \$60.00 - difficult to secure.

10. Arrangement just being completed with the Woman's Board of the Panama Pacific Exposition Company whereby this institution secures opportunity to make oak furniture for one of the rooms of the California Host Building at the Exposition. Instructor J. M. Johnston will be in charge of the work. Recommend expenditure of from \$150.00 to \$175.00 from Furniture fund for materials.

11. Payrolls and financial statement.

12. Holstein bull loaned by University Farm valued by the University at \$350.00.
