In addition to the displays in the AR, the Stoners' Jewelry Club





Client Privilege, thereby allowing these decisions to stand with no explanations to the members of the Association, nor has homeowner access been granted to the documents (or process) that purportedly influenced these decisions.

Specifically, the removal of drawings of nudes by a member of the Village Arts Club in our library was allegedly due to an employee, or employees, complaining that they found these drawings offensive. Given an explanation that our legal representative advised that allowing the drawings to remain on view would constitute a "hostile work environment" or even "sexual harassment" is trampling on our First Amendment rights, and is compounded by classifying it as privileged, thereby allowing no public discussion of a legal opinion. A small group of employees (number unknown) can dictate what 3,000-plus residents may view in their library?

The second issue is of golf carts being allowed on our course. This is contrary to our Rules and Regulations, but the explanation has been that this considers ADA (American with Disabilities Act) rules. We are also advised that this decision is to be on a six-month trial basis. Does this mean that an ADA regulation could be ignored if the BOD determines that it is dissatisfied after the trial period? Does it also mean the Board can ignore the Rules as they are written, forbidding carts?

The third issue is that the Board members, without any prior warning or input from either homeowners or committee members, and with little discussion, unanimously voted to eliminate the Purchase Research Committee, a volunteer group of homeowners that has during the past couple of years saved the Association money.

This kind of behavior tends to create an uneasiness about what has happened to the openness and trust we expect from those we elected to represent us. Our confidence needs to be restored.



"We've done a show on three ways to make chicken breast that is delicious not dull," he says. "Last month, we did a meatloaf competition. This summer Villager Ann Wolfson joined me to show us how to make matzo ball soup."

He looks forward to more feedback, questions and suggestions for the show.

Larry's love of cooking began when he became a single parent. His son, Brian - now with a Ph.D. from UC Berkeley — was 10, and Dad quickly realized how important eating healthy foods was for a growing child.

"Teenage boy equals junk food, if we're not careful. So I learned real fast how to make fresh food tempting, but not without a bit of complaining from the kid, 'Is this that fake cheese again?"" he recalls.

That commitment to changing young eating habits also led him to volunteer at Casa Pacifica, Camarillo's residential center for abused children. He called them one day and asked if he could teach a cooking class to the

youngsters. Of course, they said yes.

For eight weeks, Larry was chef and mentor to two groups of kids, vounésters under age 11, and a teenage class — who were much more skeptical at first, Larry recalls. He prepared green, locally grown veggies that they liked! The kids took a blind hot dog test - sampling soy, turkey, chicken, and beef wieners - and surprised themselves when they loved the turkey version. At the end of class, the kids created a giant thank you poster for their chef and filled it with loving messages.

"The experience was heartwrenching, but great," says Larry.

The world of work sometimes interrupts Larry Swartz's busy LV schedule. He owns a corporate event planning company, which can divert him to prepare glamorous banquets and awards ceremonies.

But more and more, his heart and energy is focused on Camarillo, Leisure Village and good food.

"I love to cook and share ideas on how people can eat healthy. This is a great place to do that. The community feeling feeds my soul."

with their congressman.

A medical doctor and three nurses will attend to assist the needs of the veterans.

Virginia worked in a defense plant before she joined the Navy in 1943 and became a WAVE. She said she joined the Navy because she looked better in blue than in khaki. In February 1956, while working in other fields, she started racing automobiles. Then, in 1957, she and a friend, Mary Davis, were picked to be the first women to drive in the Economy Run. They drove a V8 Plymouth from Los Angeles to Sun Valley, Ind., and they won in their class. In 1959, she received a trophy as the fastest woman of the year, 163.34 mph, at Riverside Raceway. She drove Economy Runs for 12 years and in 1968, the last year of the Economy Runs, she won her class.

So guess what Virginia did on her 90th birthday? She jumped out of an airplane.

Josette Wingo, at 20 years of age, full of patriotis and bravado, joined

the WAVES during World War II. Eleanor Roosevelt was their heroine for insisting that women should be allowed to volunteer for the Navy. On Treasure Island in the San Francisco Bay, Josette taught men how to shoot an ACK gun and how to hit real planes using a new ring site. The sailors were not thrilled to find women as their teachers.

Kenney Nelson, in 1938 at the age of 16, joined the California National Guard. He served in the Army Air Force in World War II, and was trained as a gunner instructor and photo interpreter. He flew as a member of the first deployed B-29 overseas. Kenney served in North Africa, India, China and Tinian Island. He completed nine combat missions.

After the war, Kenney served seven years in Japan as a Joint Criminal investigator and counterintelligence agent for northern Japan. He was the only American engaged in the Ethiopian/Somalia War to receive their highest award, the Golden Medallion. Kenney also received a medal from the Chinese government for his service in China, along with a medal given by the United Nations for his service during the Korean War.


