
Dear Mrs. Tolmach:

As we enter the final stretch of the campaign, I want you to know that there is clear evidence that we have made great strides towards victory. Senator Kennedy's vigorous campaign on the critical issues has sparked enthusiasm for the kind of leadership our Party offers for the 1960's. Underlying the strength of the Kennedy-Johnson ticket is the great strength of the Democratic Party.

Registration statistics are coming in from all over the country. They are most encouraging. But there is no cause for complacency.
