I think it advisable to grade and put in colonnade foundation and terrace on each side of pool up to the long steps.

2. Also desirable to move oak.

3. While upper esplanade is torn up for moving oak we should proceed with south terrace and esplanade changes.

4. Please use your judgment about elevator, interior towers, interior service wing, etc.

5. I hesitate to start new roof over Gothic study at present. It means such complete demolition and demoralization during summer months.

6. I would prefer to build the north wing.

7. The cloister gallery can be done when we do the new roof.

8. Let the barn wait. Parks can get along with his present equipment for awhile and the chicken houses can wait until I get back June first.
