On behalf of your Southern California party leadership, I welcome you to Los Angeles and the 1990 Mid-term Convention.



Dear Delegate,

Welcome to the 1990 Convention. This year's theme "Margin of Victory" is particularly appropriate since Democratic victory in 1990 depends to a large extent upon the work and efforts of the delegates to this Convention.

Also crucial to our victory is a financially strong party. Toward that goal for the first time in our Party's history we have developed a comprehensive budget for all operations, brought our accounting and reporting system in house and achieved phenomenal success in fundraising. Most importantly, our money has been spent effectively to assure a string of victories in three special elections.

As provided in our Party bylaws, the budget was a joint product of the Finance Committee, the Party Officers, and the Executive Board. After the budget left committee, we held an open hearing where input was taken from Executive Board members. The budget was modified, providing for additional funding for the Los Angeles office, Assembly District Committees and Regional Directors. This modified budget was then presented to the full Board and adopted unanimously.

This budget is a one year budget and is broken down into fourteen separate expense areas including voter education, administration, communications and Party services. The strength and the test of this budget will be its ability to serve as a tool for planning and analysis as our Party adapts to constant innovations from within our own structure and to changes in the field.

Beginning this year we moved our accounting operations from Sacramento to our Party's Headquarters in San Francisco. This decision was based on cost effectiveness and the need for up-to-the-minute financial data. Other changes this year included the manner in which I presented the Controller's report. As of September 1989, reports included not only the actual amounts of what was spent or received but the budgeted amount, and the variance between those two amounts. This provides a basis for evaluating our Party's accomplishments and encourages sound financial management.

On the income side the Finance team had an astounding year. Our three Party dinners were extremely successful, raising over \$1.4 million, and our telemarketing program has nearly tripled. I am confident that we can maintain this high level of success in the coming year.

Congratulations to all and I look forward to another great year.







South Africa:

The End Of Apartheid?


HE WINDS OF CHANGE are blowing across Southern Africa. After decades of colonial oppression the new nation of Nambia has launched itselfon an independent course.

Nelson Mandela is out of jail and the ANC that he inspired has become a legal political force within South Africa. The 23 million non-white South Africans still imprisoned in the land of their birth by the pervasive evils of the apartheid system will soon achieve democracy and self-rule.

As has been the case throughout the struggle to establish a non-racial democracy in South Africa, the question remains as to whether this goal will be achieved through non-violent struggle or through armed insurrection.

This was the stark reality that I confronted on a recent trip to Zambia, South Africa and Nambia. Sent by House Speaker Foley, our nine-member Congressional delegation had more than twenty meetings with the leaders and representatives of every racial, political, economic and religious segment of South African society.

Our responsibility was to assess the process of change

in the region, in order to perfect U.S. policy in the area.

Sanctions: Two Decades of Struggle

As some of you will recall, when I first entered the House of Representatives in 1971 I introduced legislation to provide for a complete embargo of, and to require divestment from South Africa. I felt then as I do now that our nation had no business allowing commerce to continue with the only nation in the world that organized its society on the principle of racial supremacy. For fifteen years I pressed this cause. Finally, in the mid-80's, students commenced demonstrations, longshoreworkers refused to unload South African cargo, and church groups elevated this issue to the top of their moral concerns. Cities, pension funds, churches and corporations began to voluntarily divest their funds from institutions doing business with South Africa.

Many of us were arrested at the South African embassy while demonstrating to highlight the campaign for sanctions. At that time, our sanctions bill became the legislative focus for this movement. In a stunning blow against the apartheid system, the bill passed the House in 1986. For the first time, an organ of the U.S. government had gone on record in favor of total divestment and economic embargo against South Africa.

dominated Senate did not pass our bill. Instead they passed weaker version and threatened to resort to a filibuster if the House did not accept their policy in toto. Two years later we were back at it, this time with a Democratic Senate. Yet, as with the previous attempt, it was the threat of a Republican-led filibuster at the end of the session that kept us from passing more stringent sanctions.

Finding the Pressure Point

Throughout my travels in South Africa, it became clear to me that the imposition of sanctions in 1986 and the threat of the total embargo and divestment that loomed with the possible passage of our bill has brought the de Klerk government to this moment. The ANC and UDF claimed, and others in both the Black and White communities agreed, that the imposition of the 1986 sanctions "helped very substantially" in making inevitable the need for negotiations. They also argued that sanctions be kept in place as a "necessary bargaining chip" to expedite the process leading to a post-apartheid society that guarantees full human and political rights and equal economic opportunity for all.

Additionally, in my judgement Mr. de Klerk needs the retention of U.S. sanctions as a protective shield against the more racist, reactionary segments of the apartheid system who are unalterably opposed to any accommodation with the non-white majority.

Mr. de Klerk struck me as a responsible politician who seems seriously interested in adjusting to the realities of a changing world. His view is held among many of the more important white business leaders with whom we met. They have accepted the inevitability of majority rule in South Africa and are now committed to achieving that reality through negotiations.

In this vein, I made Mr. de Klerk an offer: I am prepared to pause in the push for even more stringent sanctions. I will do so in order to determine whether the process just started will indeed lead to serious negotiations. I suggested that he must demonstrate in the next 90 days that he is truly committed to eradicating the vestiges of the apartheid system.

Expectations are running very high in South Africa at this point. Both Mr. Mandela and Mr. de Klerk will need to prove to their respective constituents that negotiations will work, and that these negotiations are proceeding in a deliberate and straightforward fashion. If these expectations become frustrated, I fear for the cataclysm that will result.

Our delegation came home with the unified view—including our Republican colleagues—that our current sanctions must be maintained. We felt that the factual circumstances in South Africa did not allow for the suspension or modification of the sanctions at this time. In addition, we felt that sanctions could continue to play a positive role, as I have tried to outline above.

Thus, in our meeting with the President we pressed that point. In addition, we urged the President, and we will continue to urge the Congress, to make a serious effort to provide financial assistance to the political process in South Africa and the region. The Congressional Black Caucus, working in coalition with other Members of the House concerned about foreign affairs issues, will be leading an effort to expand our foreign assistance program to meet the needs of these emerging democracies in Southern Africa.

Many South Africans will be watching events unfold in Nambia, in order to acquire a gauge as to how change might occur in their nation. In this context, as well as on simple moral grounds, it is embarrassing that the Administration has provided a paltry \$500,000 to Nambia. We should elevate our concern for the development of stable democratic institutions in this nation to the level that other nations in Europe, Asia, and Latin America have come to enjoy.

In addition, we must provide resources to aid in the strengthening of the political infrastructure of non-white South Africa. Too many years of jail, banning, and suppression have conspired to stunt the growth of these mechanisms. We must step quickly in order to facilitate the process of negotiation.

I was very impressed by the political sophistication evidenced by both the older and younger generation of ANC and UDF leadership. Their collective determination to reach out in reconciliation rather than revenge to their apartheid oppressors, to help create a truly non-racial South Africa, made an indelible impression on me.

It is a demonstration of compassionate statesmanship that the political leadership of this country would do well to emulate in trying to resolve the racial, social, and economic problems that afflict our own society. It is a statesmanship that we will fail to support at our peril, and at the peril of all citizens of conscience in South Africa who are struggling to recreate their land.

An Uncertain Trumpet:

The Administration's Tepid Response to Change in Eastern Europe

E HAVE ALL WATCHED WITH AMAZEMENT and awe the mind-boggling changes the have unfolded in Central and Eastern Europe over the past year. The year 1989 will go down with 1776 and 1492 as a major turning point in history. Six months after, even the most optimistic among us could not have anticipated the breathtaking spread of transformation that has occurred in this complex part of the world.

For 40 years we have dreamed about the lifting of the Iron Curtain. Now it has become a reality. Communist parties throughout Eastern Europe have collapsed as the Soviet Union has made clear that it would no longer use its military forces to maintain control of these states. Free elections have already

been held in Poland, East Germany and Hungary, and free elections will be held elsewhere soon.

This is the greatest historic moment in half a century as we have the opportunity to see Poland, Hungary, East Germany, Czechoslovakia, Bulgaria, and Romania move towards democratic governments, pluralistic societies, and market economies. At the same time, we have an opportunity to place our relations with the Soviet Union on a whole new basis. While the Soviet Union is still not a democratic society, it is dramatically less threatening today than it was five or even two years ago.

We have an historic opportunity before us to influence the course of democracy and freedom in Eastern Europe, but it requires bold leadership and imagination. Unfortunately the Administration has shown timidity, inertia and the unwillingness to take the very minor risks that are entailed.

American leadership is needed to support these peoples who are taking great risks. The support I am talking about is not just money. I'm talking princi-


pally about political leadership. American help is needed, but a relatively small amount of assistance now will pay off in a substantially reduced military threat and a substantially reduced American defense budget in the very near future. Furthermore, successful economies and democratic governments will bring stability and progress to this important part of the world, and that will benefit all of us.

Assistance does not have to come only, or even primarily, form the United States. Funds are available in Japan and Taiwan and Western Europe. The fact remains, however, that a Foreign Minister of Ireland or a Finance Minster of Taiwan is not in a position to offer international leadership. That must come from the President of the United States.

American business can and must plat a key role in encouraging and strengthening the forces of positive change in Eastern Europe. The greatest support for democratic reform comes form a strong market economy, and Western investment as well as Western management skills are essential for economic progress. General Electric, for example, has invested \$150 million in a Hungarian light bulb factory and General Motors invested \$100 million in a Hungarian automobile factory. This is what is needed, but it is only the beginning.

The President should take the initiative by calling together the heads of the Fortune-500 corporations and urging them to invest in Eastern Europe. The moral force the President commands can do much to hasten the move in that direction, but only he can mobilize the enthusiasm and support needed form American firms. Thus far he has not done even this.

The people of Eastern Europe are watching, trying to read our lips, but they can barely understand our mumbling. We surely can do better. We clearly must do better, unless we want to see this fleeting moment of opportunity pass us by. the trumpet is giving an uncertain should, but is is now critical that we and our allied in Europe and Asia hear a clear call. Now is the time for bold and innovative leadership form the President and his Administration, not the timidity and vacillation which we have seen form the White House.

non-partisan and Democratic officials in the national Democratic Party structure, with three seats on the Democratic National Committee and representation on the executive committee.


