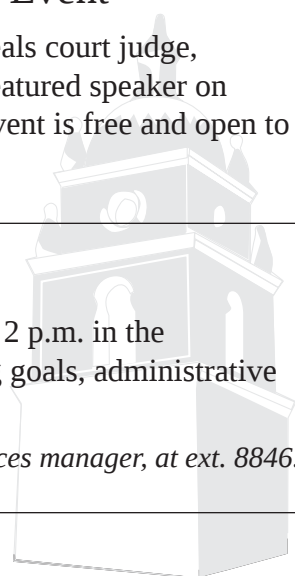
Kenneth Starr to Speak at September 19 Constitution Day Campus Event

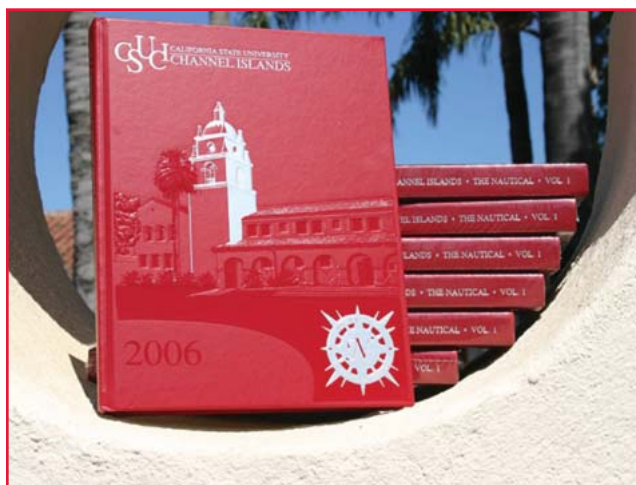

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Construction Report

- **New Projects:** CSUCI is planning several new projects to meet projected campus growth, including classrooms and offices in North Hall (north of University Hall), a nursing simulation lab for the new nursing program in 2007, laboratories, offices, support space in Westside Labs (located west of University Hall and in-filling Chaparral Hall)
- **Master Plan Implementation:** A series of small workshops are scheduled the week of September 18 to discuss ideas relating to campus development. The “charettes” will be presented Monday, September 18, 10 a.m. to noon; Tuesday, September 19, 10 a.m. to noon; Wednesday, September 20, from 1 to 3 p.m.; Thursday, September 21, from 1 to 3 p.m.; and Friday, September 22, from 10 a.m. to noon. Each session is limited to 12 participants and will be held in the second floor OPC conference room, Arroyo Hall. - **Infrastructure Upgrade:** After successfully completing the major upgrade of the campus electrical distribution system over the summer, OPC is now beginning the design to upgrade the infrastructure system of the campus that is more than 50 years old. Details will be announced in future *wavelength* editions.
- **More Summer Projects Completed:** Several summer projects have been completed to meet the needs of the academic and student community for the fall semester:
 - A new nuclear magnetic resonance laboratory was completed in Aliso Hall.
 - Several classrooms in the Bell Tower have received new projectors and A/V setups.
 - Several classrooms/labs in the Bell Tower were re-configured to gain 76 teaching stations this summer.
 - New computer-managed locks that enhance security and minimize the need for door keys have been installed in several buildings and classrooms.
 - New exterior signs have been installed on all University buildings.
 - Interior room signs have been upgraded in Topanga Hall and Malibu Hall.
 - The remodeled Hub now provides new offices for Associated Students, Incorporated.
- **More Parking Spaces:** To meet the demand for parking spaces, parking lot A-10 now provides 300 parking spaces for use by the entire campus community. In addition, another 300-space parking lot behind the Hub building is planned, with completion expected in fall 2007.
- **More Work on Islands Café:** After completing ADA access to Islands Café and improving the courtyard, building two public accessible restrooms, adding acoustic treatment, and other summer projects, OPC is now in the process of designing an expansion of the Dining Commons area, to be ready for service by fall 2007.
- **Green Campus Projects:** OPC has upgraded the lighting controls in the Bell Tower building to conserve energy. More energy efficient and conservation projects will be completed in the future, including installation of waterless urinals to conserve water.
- **Major Construction Progress:** The Broome Library and Santa Cruz Apartments construction is progressing on schedule. Progress on the library can be viewed through the University’s webcam on the library’s home page, <http://www.library.csuci.edu/>.

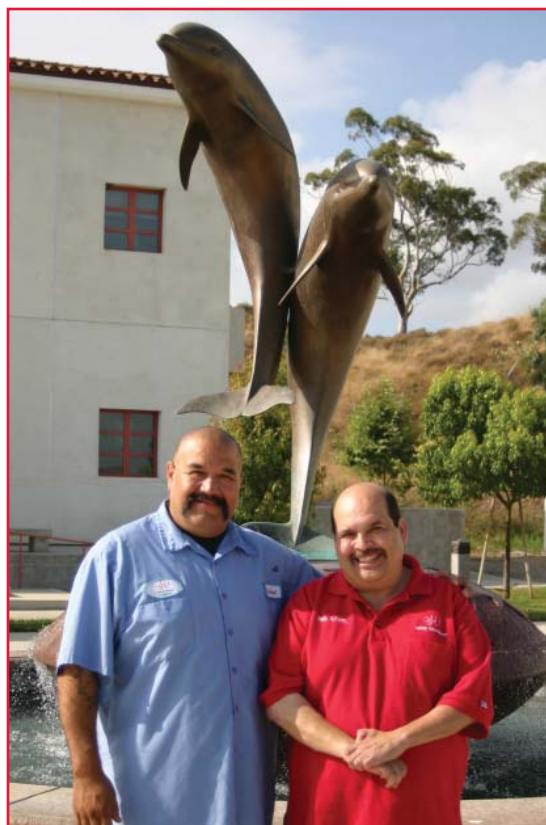
Nautical on Sale
