PRESS ROOM: Room 162 in the eastern wing of the gymnasium serves as the press room for Titan basketball. Five telephone lines are available -- two at all times and three after the conclusion of radio post-game shows.

PRESS TABLES: Primary beat reporters and broadcasters will be located on the south side of the playing floor, adjacent to or behind the scorer's table. Auxiliary media seating and scout seating will be available at tables along the base line.

GAME SUMMARIES: Will be collated and distributed in Room 162 of the gymnasium building. Halftime box scores, play-by-play accounts and final box scores will be provided.

PRESS/PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective "home" SIDs. Photo credentials must be worn in plain sight at all times. Photographers may shoot only from the designated areas behind both baselines.

PARKING: On Monday through Thursday evenings, parking is available by:

- a) Using Lot A at State College and Yorba Linda Boulevards or Lot B off State College Boulevard and paying \$1.50 upon entry for a daily permit, or:
- b) Obtaining a complimentary pass upon presentation of news credential to the Visitors Information Booth located on the south side of campus, northwest of the intersection of Commonwealth and Nutwood Avenues.

At other times, ample free parking is available in Lot B, immediately west of the gymnasium. BROADCAST SPACE: One table is allocated to each team's designated commercial radio station. Each holds three persons comfortably across the working counter with one cramped seating space available to the rear.

TELEPHONES: There is one telephone at the press table -- (714) 773-3970 -- which must be kept free for messages, out-of-town scores, etc. Additional telephones CANNOT be installed at the press table due to the physical limitations of the building. Please call if you have special telephone needs.

LOCKER ROOMS: Located off the hallway on the north side of the playing floor. John Sneed will conduct his post-game interviews in the equipment manager's office just outside the Fullerton players' locker room, which is CLOSED to the media. Players will be brought to the office area upon request after a reasonable cooling-off period.

SCOUTS: Requests should be made at least one week in advance. Seating is limited.

The University

California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing. The main campus is located in Fullerton and a Mission Viejo campus was opened in August, 1989. The latter offers only upper-division and graduate courses.

Classes were offered at Fullerton for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement — for five students — took place in 1960.

The University's 24,500 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes, although nearly 400 now live on campus in residence halls opened in 1988.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 775-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The University is fully accredited and enjoys national recognition for both its array of traditional academic programs and a growing list of independently accredited professional programs, including art, athletics training, business, chemistry, communications, computer science, dance, education, engineering, music, nursing, public administration, speech and hearing and theater. All told, there are 87 degree programs —41 of them at the graduate level — plus a wide variety of credential and certificate programs.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is an internship and cooperative education program that allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours without the formalities of regular admission to the University.

Still another strong point is the University's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students, but also open to community members, is another highlight, as is the network of community support groups, including the Titan Athletic Foundation.

Further examples of community outreach are the Ruby Gerontology Center, which serves as an educational and research facility for the study of aging and a meeting place for the Continuing Learning Experience support group.

Through a series of joint ventures started in 1979 with the establishment of the Fullerton Arboretum and continuing with the 1989 opening of the Marriott Hotel, the University and the city of Fullerton are working to complete an on-campus sports complex in 1992. Already in use are two lighted softball fields. When the main part of the sports complex is finished, it will include a stadium for football, soccer and other activities plus a pavilion for baseball.

To reinforce the University's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State conducts comprehensive fund raising. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great institution.



Administration



Dr. Milton A. Gordon, President

Dr. Milton A. Gordon was selected the fourth president of Cal State Fullerton by The California State University Board of Trustees and assumed his duties on Aug. 6, 1990.

His university leadership includes serving as vice president for academic affairs at Sonoma State University for four years, as dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Chicago State University for more than eight years and as director of the Afro-American Studies Program at Loyola University of Chicago for six years.

President Gordon also taught at the Illinois Institute of Technology and in the Chicago public schools and served as a mathematician at the University of Chicago's Laboratories of Applied Sciences.

He is a member of the board of the California Coalition for Mathematics and a member of the Orange County Community Foundation, the California State University Growth Plan Commission, the CSU Commission on the Older, Part-Time Student, the California Admissions Advisory Council, the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education.

The President has a Ph.D. in mathematics from the Illinois Institute of Technology, an M.A. in mathematics from the University of Detroit and a B.A. in mathematics and secondary education from Xavier University of Louisiana.

Director of Athletics

Bill Shumard achieved a "lifelong professional goal" on June 14 when he was appointed Director of Athletics at Cal State Fullerton, effective Aug. 1.

Shumard, 40, most recently had served as an assistant athletic director at USC for three years after a 13-year career with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

"I always hoped I would have the opportunity to work at Cal State Fullerton," he said. "Because of where we live (Brea), and having children in the process of growing up, this is where I set my sights. I'm a graduate of the Cal State system (Long Beach State, 1972) and my desire was to get back to this level.

"An athletic department run with ethical and financial responsibility can mirror a successful university. It can bring people to the university in myriad ways. I believe there are 65,000 Cal State Fullerton graduates living in the Los Angeles area. We've got the opportunity to use this to bring them back to campus. If we have a program that is competitive and makes an honest effort at moving athletes toward graduation, I think that's a lot to stand up and cheer about."

In his first three months at Fullerton, Shumard had hired a director of broadcasting and sales and a director and administrative assistant for the Titan Athletic Foundation. He also reworked the football schedule to give the Titans their first two games of the 1992 season in their new on-campus sports complex.

Shumard was part of a five-person team at USC that raises \$7 million per year. His recent projects included supervising 12 regional Trojan Club support groups and staging a dinner in the Los Angeles Coliseum for 3,000 persons to highlight the university's athletic centennial celebration. He also was program coordinator for the Sports Management Institute, a joint venture of the athletic departments and business administration schools of USC, Notre Dame and North Carolina.

Shumard's Dodger career began in 1975 as an assistant in public relations and publicity. He became Director of the Speakers Bureau in 1977 and was appointed Director of Community Services in 1981. The title was enlarged in 1983 to include Special Events as he supervised a staff of 15 employees responsible for game and community promotions and all publications as well as coordinating the activities of the Dodger Alumni Association. He also served as co-chairman of Dodger Stadium's 25th Anniversary Celebration, liaison to the 1987 Tournament of Roses Parade, Director of Protocol for the 1984 Olympic Baseball Tournament and on the administrative staff of three World Series, five National League Championship Series and three All-Star Games.

His first athletics position was as Sports Information Director at his alma mater in 1972 and 1973. He spent the next two years at Cal State Los Angeles where he was an assistant professor in journalism and physical education, was advisor to the campus pep groups and served as manager of the Athletic News Bureau.

Shumard's athletic career terminated as a freshman quarterback at Compton Junior College, where he obtained his Associate Arts degree in 1970. Bill and his wife, Kim, live in Brea. He has three sons -- David, 20; Matt, 16; and Mike, 13.

The Titan Athletic Foundation, or the T.A.F. as it is usually called, is a non-profit volunteer organization established solely for the purpose of generating financial and other support for the Cal State Fullerton athletic department.

Membership is open to everyone and the current rolls include not only alumni, faculty, staff and students but also a great many friends of the university, area businesses and respected community leaders.

Gifts received by the T.A.F. are used to provide a quality education for deserving studentathletes. Because the state of California is forbidden to allocate funds for the purpose of scholarships, the fund-raising efforts of the TAF are critical to the success of the entire athletic department. Gate receipts, road game guarantees and television income are insufficient to cover the full range of needs facing a quality and competitive intercollegiate athletic program on the Division I level.

The Spring, 1991 fund drive directed by Larry Slagle was the most productive yet with more than \$505,000 in cash pledged for 1991-92 scholarship aid.

Past presidents have included Kevin Forth, Ken Henderson, Don Karcher, Buck Johns, Pierre Nicolas, Larry Slagle, Jim Woods, Bud Steffen, Den Hood, Don Outlaw and, most recently, Bob Ling.

Larry Zucker assumed the role of Executive Director of the TAF on Nov. 11. He was hired on Oct. 11 as Associate Athletic Director for Marketing and Development.

Zucker, 32, was responsible for significant increases in fund-raising and marketing and advertising revenue in his two and a half years as an associate athletic director at Cal State Bakersfield. Previously, he intiated the first corporate sponsorship program at the high school level in the United States and became the assistant commissioner for the California Interscholastic Federation's Southern Section.

"Larry was a pioneer in developing corporate sponsorships," said Director of Athletics Bill Shumard. "With the imminent utilization of our new sports complex, we see greater opportunities in marketing and advertising. Larry's background and knowledge of the southern California market fit our situation perfectly."

A 1981 graduate of the University of Redlands, Zucker obtained a master's degree in 1991 from Cal Poly Pomona in physical education with an emphasis in athletic administration. Between 1980 and 1989, he established the nation's first corporate support foundation for the CIF-SS. He raised more than \$2 million in support of more than 500 high schools.

Nickname and Mascot

"What exactly is a Titan?"

"Why do you have an elephant for your mascot?"

Those are two of the first questions that pop into the minds of media and fans when a Cal State Fullerton athletic team makes its inaugural visit. While the relatively young institution carved out of the Orange County citrus groves may be too new for many traditions, here are the recognized legends.

"It was the students' decision in a vote," explains Dr. Ernest Becker, founding Dean of Students, of the nickname 'Titans.' "More than a hundred names were suggested, and the Student Council took on the job of narrowing the list down to a few for the

purposes of an election. The vote was close, with Titans narrowly prevailing over Aardvarks and Rebels."

It was a unique student body at the outset, all upper division students until 1963. There were 453 of them, mostly female, in 1959, the first year of classes at what was then known as Orange County State College. They voted to organize as a student body and to assess themselves a fee of \$10 per semester.

"Even when it was decided that 'Titans' would be the nickname, there was confusion as to

what it represented," said Becker. "I was thinking of a large mythological figure from Greek history, not unlike Tommy Trojan, but with perhaps straighter, more modern lines. In the same vein, the original dormitories were named Othrys Hall. There were others, however, who related the name to the Titan missile then in prominence."

Nothing official was done about a mascot because no one knew quite what to do. Until, of course, the "First Intercollegiate Elephant Race in Human History."

What began as a practical joke turned into probably the biggest "happening" on the campus to this day. The "gag" attracted elephants from universities around the nation and even Oxford from England. A crowd estimated at

more than 10,000 people turned out on "Dumbo Downs" as the hastily graded field became known that spring afternoon in 1962.

To publicize the event, a circus-like elephant called Tuffy the Titan was used and it began appearing on sweaters and notebook covers around the campus. With no other mascot, the elephant was unofficially adopted. Several revisions in the caricature have been made in recent years to create a more tenacious Tuffy, or Titus as he also was called in an attempt to make him Greek.

The mascot outlived the race. In 1963, one elephant charged the crowd causing minor injuries and an early sign of a now-common liability insurance crisis nipped a tradition in the bud.

The origin of the school colors also bears discussion. The students voted for royal blue and white when they chose Titans, but the athletic equipment manager at the time thought orange was an appropriate color on uniforms for a school known as Orange County State College. The

unofficial color was "adopted" and finally was formally acknowledged by the Athletics Council in 1987.

When Lynn Eilefson was appointed athletics director in 1982, he furthered the cause of orange because of its uniqueness and brightness compared to the wide variety of blues. Thus, the "Orange Crush" booster group was born and the color remains prominent in most team uniforms.

And, finally, there is the matter of the school's name. As mentioned earlier, the name originally was Orange County State College. It's also been Orange State College and later California State College at Fullerton or California State College, Fullerton. The change to university status necessitated a further change to California State University, Fullerton, but the school's address could not be changed from 800 N. State College Boulevard. And that's only the start of the confusion.

To out-of-staters, the picture clouds quickly because most don't realize there are two distinct systems of higher education in the state — the University of California and the State University system. So, the school has been called everything from Cal-Fullerton to UC Fullerton to California State Fullerton State to simply Fullerton State. The preferred moniker is Cal State Fullerton, with no hyphens or commas, which is what most of the more than 80,000 graduates recognize. But since there are only two other major institutions known as Titans (University of Detroit and Oral Roberts University), just call Fullerton teams the "Titans!"

History of Titan Athletics

Obstacles and adversity. Grass-roots support and coaches with "sandwich board" signs. Stunning upsets and courageous performances. All have been a part of Cal State Fullerton athletics as "Titan Pride" has taken limited resources to athletic successes disproportionate to such a young institution.

How many universities can claim national championships in seven different sports, a star major league third baseman, men and women basketball players in the Olympics, two rookies in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team - men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan Five advance to within one victory of the "Final Four" as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which includes a women's national title in 1970, Coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team and a 1991 Kodak All-America in Genia Miller, was accelerated in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice. Coach George McQuarn's teams were usually factors in the PCAA race and had national Top 20 rankings and a victory over the nation's No. 1-ranked and undefeated team to their credit. Fullerton, which has seemingly specialized in last-second wins under current Coach John Sneed, also has competed twice in the post-season NIT Tournament while the women have recently been in both the WNIT and the NCAA fields. In 1991, Miller was No. 2 in the nation in scoring.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Former coach Dick Wolfe won three college division titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and had recent teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. His 1987 squad was ranked No. 1 in the nation led by



former Chinese Olympian Li Xiao Ping. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished sixth or better in the nation virtually every year and won the national title in 1979 One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-America and star of the Disney film, "Lefty," while more recently Tami Elliott won 10 All-America awards before suffering a fractured vertebra in her senior season.

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. He won the College World Series again in 1984 with players such as CWS Most Valuable Player John Fishel. The Titans won their first six-team regional and finished third in the CWS in 1988 under the direction of Coach Larry Cochell, who in 1990 guided them to a Big West title, a regional championship at Texas and a sixth

trip to Omaha in 1990. A total of 16 Titan products have played in the major leagues and now Garrido is back from a 3-year stint at Illinois. He punctuated his return with a share of the 1991 Big West title despite losing his old diamond to construction for the new sports complex.

Women have sparkled on the Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making seven trips to the College World Series and 12 consecutive regional appearances. The Titans brought home their first NCAA Championship in 1986 and often have been ranked No. 1 in the country.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert. Football has been burdened by the lack of a "home" stadium until now but the Titan gridders have had their moments.

Dick Coury was the inaugural coach in 1970 and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Div. I were endured. The program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy in the 1980s and the new stadium complex should add more luster.

Head Coach John Sneed



Fourth Year Career & at CSUF: 43-43 Long Beach State '73

John Sneed begins his fourth year as head coach at Cal State Fullerton where he has gradually placed his personal trademark on the basketball program.

While posting a .500 record at Fullerton at 43-43, Sneed has picked up the playing pace with more open-court defensive pressure and a less deliberate offense. He has launched a successful "Playmakers" booster group that supports fifth-year scholarships and drastically improved the program's graduation rate. It's been a hectic pace since he was handed the reins in November of 1988 when George McQuarn suddenly resigned three weeks before the season opener.

Sneed officially was named head coach on March 11, 1989 when he signed a 3-year contract. The appointment after an open and thorough nationwide search came the day after the conclusion of an "interim" 1988-89 season that saw him bring renewed energy and excitement to Titan basketball.

After three years as an assistant at Arizona and San Diego State and eight years under McQuarn at Fullerton, Sneed was thrust into the head coaching role on Nov. 3, 1988. What he lacked in time was compounded by other shortcomings — no returning starters, a roster of barely 10 healthy players and no chance to hire another assistant coach.

The Titans overcame the obstacles and produced a thrilling 16-13 season. Picked to finish ninth in the Big West Conference, they tied for fourth and gained the semifinals of the post-season tournament. They went 8-2 in games decided by 3 points or less and were 5-1 in overtime games including their first win over UNLV in six years. The 1989-90 team, with basically the same personnel, had less good fortune in close games and finished 13-16 including 6-12 to finish seventh in the Big West. Last year was supposed to be a rebuilding year and the Titans were picked eighth (media) and tenth (coaches) in the pre-season polls. But they jelled quickly and finished 14-14 while finishing in a tie for sixth place.

"A lot of people stood behind me that first year in a difficult situation, and I am thankful to them," said Sneed, 43. "The faculty, administration and fans... everyone was very positive and gave me a lot of help. I was fortunate to get the opportunity. A lot of assistants never get that chance."

Sneed has paid his coaching dues. He began at Verbum Dei High School in Los Angeles as an assistant to McQuarn. After two years he succeeded McQuarn and immediately won the 1974 CIF Championship and Coach of the Year honors when he guided the Eagles to a 30-2 record and the mythical national championship by National Sport News Service. He followed that up with two more Camino Real League titles with 28-1 and 23-5 seasons for a three-year prep record of 81-8 (.910).

He went to Arizona as an assistant to Fred Snowden for the 1976-77 season which saw the 21-6 Wildcats compete in the NCAA Tournament. He was at San Diego State under Tim Vezie for two years. The 1977-78 Aztecs won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association title but were eliminated in the post-season tournament by Cal State Fullerton.


After 11 years as a college assistant, Sneed has special compassion for the assistant coach and his chances of becoming a head coach.

"The goal I had for a number of years was to be a Division I head coach," he explained. "Sometimes you don't get that opportunity, because it's not like a player, who can walk on to show his ability. A coach never has that opportunity."

Sneed has earned good marks from the academic community.

"One of my priorities has been to improve the academic situation at the university," said Sneed. "We have been working very hard at that, to bring about a change in attitude in our athletes and to raise our graduation rate. We're not going to complete that immediately, but we are off to a good start. We had three players on the honor roll in the Spring semester and a fourth just missed. Full realization of our goal will be over a longer period of time."

Sneed and his wife, Rose, live in Anaheim with 4-year-old daughter Ashley.

Dan Dion

Third year St. Mary's ('76)

Dan Dion returns for a third year on the Titans' coaching staff for the 1991-92 season.

Dion, 37, was an assistant to Coach Neil McCarthy for seven years—three at Weber State (1982-83 through 1984-85) and four (1985-86 through 1988-89) at New Mexico State. The Aggies posted a 70-54 record during his tenure and annually were in the top half of the Big West standings. Dion also played

for McCarthy at St. Patrick's High School in Vallejo and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Weber State in 1976-77.

Dion was an All-Big Sky Conference selection as a sophomore at Weber State before transferring to St. Mary's, where he was team captain. He served as head coach for five years at St. Patrick's, where he had scored more than 2,000 points in an illustrious prep career.

"Dan is a quality addition to our staff," said head coach John Sneed upon his April 19, 1989 appointment. "I've known Dan for several years. He is a hard worker with great knowledge on and off the floor."

Dan and his wife, Karen, have a 9-year-old daughter, Lindsay, and live in Anaheim.



Mike Bokosky

First year Fort Lewis College ('78)

Mike Bokosky is the newest addition to the Cal State Fullerton basketball program after he ended a long association with UC Irvine and veteran coach Bill Mulligan.

Bokosky, 36, played under Mulligan in community college, from 1974-76, and was his No. 1 assistant at UC Irvine from 1980-91. As the recruiting coordinator at UC Irvine, Bokosky signed to national letters of intent five current National Basketball Association players in Tod Murphy, Scott


Brooks and Bob Thornton of Minnesota; Tom Tolbert of Golden State and Eric Leckner of Sacramento.

First year Cal State Fullerton ('84)

Leon Wood is easily the most recognizable name in the history of Cal State Fullerton basketball and he begins his coaching career with the Titans in 1991-92.

The school's all-time leading scorer and assist man, Wood, 29, was the point guard on the 1984 U.S. Gold Medal-winning Olympic basketball team and played six years in the National

Basketball Association with five teams. He was a first-team All-America in 1984 by *The Sporting News* and was the tenth player selected in the 1984 draft by Philadelphia with its second pick (after Charles Barkley) on the first round. He last played professionally for Ranger Verese in Italy in May before undergoing surgery for bone spurs and a bone graft on his left foot.

"Leon will be an asset in many ways for our program," said Head Coach John Sneed upon the Aug. 1 appointment. "It's great to get one of our alums on our coaching staff, which is something Leon always has wanted to do."

Wood began his college playing career at Arizona in 1979-80 after a brilliant prep career at St. Monica's High School in Santa Monica, where he set the CIF career scoring record. At Fullerton he never missed a game in three years, scoring 1,876 points and handing out 744 assists in 91 games. His 319 assists in 1982-83 were a single-season collegiate record at the time.

Wood and his wife, Tia, and 2-year-old daughter, Whitney, live in South Pasadena.

Academics Coordinator



Alison Cone

Ninth year Washington State ('75)

Alison Cone is in her ninth year at Cal State Fullerton as Academics Coordinator, assisting student-athletes in reaching their academic goals. She organizes the tutorial programs, sets up study halls and conducts advisement sessions with each athlete.

Cone previously served as assistant athletics director and advising and eligibility coordinator at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

A native of Washington, Cone earned her bachelor's degree at Washington State and her teaching certificate at Central Washington. She coached tennis, basketball, track and soccer at Auburn High School and basketball and volleyball at Green River Community College in Washington.

Cone worked on her master's degree at Dominguez Hills, where she also lectured in physical education classes and served as women's tennis coach for the 1982-83 season. She is single and lives in Fullerton.

Season Preview

Three returning starters, the addition of an exceptionally quick guard from the redshirt ranks and two summer-arriving front-line prospects give Cal State Fullerton a solid foundation to build upon for the 1991-92 season.

"We have a good nucleus returning with five of the top eight from last year, a quality redshirt in Aaron Sunderland and the two new big men," said Coach John

Sneed, who is entering his fourth season running the Titan program.

"We will have depth on the perimeter and the inside positions. We are not as experienced inside, but we have some potential there. And, there are not a lot of experienced big men in the conference. We will try to complement this inside strength with our abilities to defend and play a quick, up-tempo game.

"My primary concern is that we have several people -- Sunderland, Sean Williams, Kim Kemp, Todd Satalowich and Dijon Bernard -- who have not

played at this level who must contribute for us to be successful."

Guard Joe Small, a second-team All-Big West Conference selection, and forward Agee Ward, the Big West's second best rebounder in conference play, are the top returnees. Small was the team's top scorer at 21.8 points per game and Ward was the No. 3 scorer (12.6) and No. 1 rebounder (8.1).

"Aaron is a good ballhandler who can really push it," said Sneed. "He is quick with the ball and has quick feet for defense. He passes really well and, because he was able to practice with us last year, should make a significant impact."

Forward Bruce Bowen, the third returning starter, and lettermen Kevin Ahsmuhs, J.D. Green and Greg Vernon are other key returnees.

"J.D. came on strong at the end of last season," said Sneed. "We might work him into the the power forward spot when we want to go to a small lineup."

The last two roster additions were Williams, a 6-10 center from Connors State JC in Oklahoma, and Satalowich, a 6-7 sophomore power forward who transferred from Missouri after sitting out two years due to a back injury. Williams averaged 12 points and 8 rebounds as a forward while Satalowich was a highly recruited prep out of Rock Bridge High School in Columbia where he averaged 22 points and 12 rebounds.

Other newcomers trying to contribute are former San Jose City College teammates Kemp, a forward, and Brian Wood, a point guard; Ventura College guard Bernard and incoming freshmen swingmen Ray Hooper from University High in San Diego and Chauncey Woolridge from Santa Ana High School. Center Jason Kerian and walk-on Andre Toliver complete the squad.

Kemp helped San Jose CC into the quarterfinals of the state championship tournament in 1989-90 while averaging 14 points, 9 rebounds and 3 blocked shots. He has been compared to former Titan star Tony Neal for his aggressive rebounding and defending. Wood was a freshman guard on that team and last year averaged 22 points and 6 assists at both shooting and point guard.

Bernard is a perimeter scoring threat who will try to approach the success of the last Ventura JC transfer to Fullerton -- Cedric Ceballos, now of the Phoenix Suns. Hooper and Woolridge are promising newcomers who should have the luxury of easing their way into Division I competition.

The Big West Conference is in its fourth year of existence since changing its name from the Pacific Coast Athletic Association prior to the 1988 football season. The name is seen as a simpler, more accurate description of the league's 11 member institutions -- Cal State Fullerton, Fresno State, Long Beach State, New Mexico State, San Jose State, UC Irvine, UC Santa Barbara, Hawaii (women's sports only), UNLV, Pacific and Utah State. Beginning next academic year, the University of Nevada will move from the Big Sky Conference to the Big West with Fresno State departing for the Western Athletic Conference.

When the league was formed in 1969, it consisted of seven charter members, all of which were located within in the state of California. In its 22 years of existence, however, the conference has expanded to include universities from states which are not on nor even near the Pacific Ocean in Utah, Nevada and New Mexico.

Basketball success among Big West institutions has been growing over the years and reached its apex in 1989-90 when UNLV won the NCAA championship in convincing fashion over Duke yet couldn't even claim sole possession of the Big West championship. New Mexico State tied the Rebels for the regular season title and actually was the No. 1 seed in the post-season tournament in Long Beach. The league's third-place team, UC Santa Barbara, went on to beat Houston in the first round of the NCAA tourney and help the Big West top all other conferences in tournament play with a .778 percentage (7-2).

Last year, UNLV was ranked No. 1 in the nation all season until losing to Duke in the semifinals of the Final Four. New Mexico State again was ranked nationally, but Cal State Fullerton was the only other team to avoid a losing overall season.

1990-91 in Review

If the 1990-91 Cal State Fullerton men's basketball team was surprising to the preseason media experts, it was downright shocking to the Big West Conference coaches. The media predicted the Titans would finish eighth in the standings while the coaches doomed them to last place. Instead, the Titans finished in a tie for sixth and were one of only three teams in the Big West to avoid a losing overall season.

Coach John Sneed predicted his team would be able to replace the departed 1-2 scoring punch of Cedric Ceballos and Mark Hill with better balance and he was partly right. There was better balance, with five players averaging 9 or more points, but one man stepped forward to dominate.

Guard Joe Small, a transfer from College of the Sequoias in Visalia, proved to be one of the premier jump shooters on the West Coast as he replaced the perimeter firepower with even better numbers (75 of 193) than Hill (70 of 186) in 3-point field goal shooting. His 21.8 points per game threat created enough room for second-year inside players Aaron Wilhite and (continued on pg. 65)

The Titans opened the 1990-91 season on the road amidst the excitement of a new regime in Beaumont, Texas. New coach Mike Newell had his Cardinals primed for their home debut after a 1-1 tournament showing at Alabama-Birmingham and the home team's stronger finish ruined Fullerton's season opener.

Hitting unexpectedly well from the outside, the Cardinals parlayed the play of freshman point guard Atiim Browne with that of center Darvl Reed to lead most of the first half but never by more than five. The game swung with the outset of the second period as Lamargot off to a 10-2 sourt for a 9-point lead at 58-49. But the Titans came back on the 3point scoring of Joe Small and Wayne Williams, and forged a tie at 71-71. But Terry Bridgeman hit a 3-pointer with 8:12 to play to launch an 8-0 Lamar run and the Titans never caught up again.

Foul trouble in the first half forced the Titans out of their man to man defense and what began as a battle between two pressing defenses turned into a secondhalf shooting contest over zones.

Just as Lamar avenged an embarrassing loss a year ago in Titan Gym, the Tulsa Golden Hurricane played up to their namesake at home as they threw a defensive frenzy at the stunned Titans. Aggresssive Tulsa play from the outset took Fullerton out of its offense and contributed mightily to 29 turnovers, the most ever by a Titan team.

Fullerton, which fell behind 6-0 to open the game and saw Joe Small receipt for two personal fouls in the first 1:18, trailed only 12-8 at the 14:20 mark of the half. But it didn't score again until Aaron Wilhite's baseline jumper at the 5:58 mark, at which time Tulsa owned a 31-10 lead after a 19-0 run. Nothing the Titans tried could cut substantially into the Tulsa lead. The closest they could get was 17 points at 33-16 and the halftime deficit was 21 points. The margin grew to as many as 32 points at 81-49 with 4:42 to play.

The Titans committed 17 turnovers in the first half or three more than Tulsa had the entire game.

Titan Gym proved the right venue for Fullerton to get into the victory column but it wasn't easy against a scrappy Butler team that was completing a 3-game road trip and would beat Notre Dame at home two nights later. Not until Bruce Bowen blocked Jermaine's Guice 3-point field goal attempt at the final buzzer could the Titans breathe easily.

Butler, which trailed, 72-61, at the 5:53 mark, scored 11 unanswered points to tie the score at 72-72 with 2:45 to go. Guard Darin Archbold scored the last 9 of those points on his way to game honors with 31 points. Aaron Wilhite broke the tie with a pair of free throws and Joe Small hit a bucket for a 76-72 lead at 1:29. Archbold converted two free throws at 0:53 to make it 76-74 before Small hit two of four foul tries for a 78-74 lead. Archbold made it 13 consecutive points with the final Butler basket at 0:07 but Wilhite, who had a career-high 11 rebounds, hit a free throw at 0:05 and Bowen rejected Guice's try.

Agee Ward, who did not start because of a thigh bruise, had a career high 25 points and added 12 rebounds in only 23 minutes. He had 16 of those points in the first half, when Fullerton rallied from a 12-4 deficit. Butler had its last lead of the game at 33-32 with 3:09 to go in the half.

The Titans ran their winning streak to three in a row with a second consecutive road victory in a building where they had won only once in five previous tries.

There were numerous obstacles, not the least of which was a 4-1 Pepperdine team that had beaten UC Santa Barbara and Fresno State. There also was the unusual Tartan floor, a home crowd, a wide disparity in the number of fouls called on the teams (CSF 17, Pep 5 at 7:33 of second half) and a failure to reset the 45-second clock that cost the Titans possession in the final minute of regulation.

Fullerton's seemingly annual flu siege struck earlier in the year than normal yet it wasn't strong enough to stop the Titans from winning their fifth game in a row.

Portland, which brought a 1-6 record into Titan Gym where it had logged a pair of 1-point victories in recent years, gave the weakened Titans all they could handle. Shooting well from every spot on the floor, the Pilots might have pulled the upset were it not for 20 turnovers, 13 in a first half they won, 41-40.

They had led by as many as 13 points at 39-26 with 3:58 to go. At that juncture, Coach John Sneed took a timeout and the Titans responded with a 14-2 burst until intermission.

Joe Small's 3-pointer put CSF ahead to stay at 60-59 with 12:05 to play. The Titans led by as many as 9 at 71-62 at 8:18 but the Pilots came back to cut it to 1 on four occasions. Bruce Bowen, who had a career high 21 points, scored 14 of Fullerton's final 24 points. Ron Caldwell had probably the biggest bucket down the stretch, putting back a missed Wayne Williams free throw for two points and an 85-81 lead with 40 seconds to play.

A 30-9 run over the final 8:42 of the half left Fullerton with a23-point halftime lead and Chapman never got closer than 16 points in the second half despite liberal substitution by Coach John Sneed.

"Our goals were to play a strong first half, get everyone in the game and have a Merry Christmas," said Sneed after his team's record went to 6-2.

Joe Small had 18 of his 29 points in the first half, hitting 4 of 5 3-pointers.

There was a post-season tournament atmosphere in Titan Gym on a Saturday afternoon with Prime Sports televising the game back to Denver and about half of the 3,729 fans in attendance rooting for Colorado State on their way to the Freedom Bowl football game that evening. The Rams would get only a split, losing to Fullerton on a Joe Small bucket at the buzzer before surviving a 2-point conversion try by Oregon at 1:01 to go.

Coach Boyd Grant, who twice lost to Fullerton on buzzer-beating shots during the 1984-85 season with Fresno State, saw Small miss a long jumper but get his own rebound and drill a shot from the top of the key. CSU had tied the game at 60-60 on a bank shot by Lynn Tryon with 25 seconds to play.

Fullerton held the biggest lead of the game at 6 points with 18 minutes to play but the Rams were up 55-50 with 3:10 to go. Fullerton opened the Big West Conference schedule in the unfriendly confines of Selland Arena but rode a remarkable second-half performance by Joe Small to its eighth consecutive victory, tying the second longest winning skein in school history.

It was a game of protracted spurts and Fullerton had the most impressive and most timely.

The Bulldogs erupted first, leading 13-5 three minutes into the game. The Titans overtook them with an 18-4 run for a 23-17 lead. The teams sparred for five minutes before the Bulldogs erased a 35-27 Titan lead with a 12-6 spurt to narrow the halftime deficit to 41-39.

Fullerton bounced back from its loss at UNLV with a determined effort against Utah State as Big West newcomers Jay Goodman and Joe Small put on a shooting display.

Neither team was able to put together a sustained spurt after Fullenton gained the early upper hand at 17-10. For the third game in a row, the Titans faced a more rested opponent. New Mexico had not played since a win at Fresno State on Monday night while the Titans had played four minutes of a game against Long Beach State, suspended when Kevin Cutler shattered a backboard with a dunk. And, the Titans were minus their centers in injured Aaron Wilhite and suspended Ron Caldwell.

But the Titans did have Wayne Williams, who couldn't start on Thursday against Long Beach, and he helped stifle the aggressive Aggies' defense and the Titans rode their best shooting night of the season to a remarkable upset victory over the nation's No. 21-ranked team.

It was remarkably easy. The Titans trailed only briefly at the outset and took the lead for good at 11-10 on Bruce Bowen's basket. It triggered a 14-2 run that left the Titans ahead, 23-12, and sparked them to a 42-33 halftime bulge.

The Aggies' rally never materialized. In one of the most exciting games ever in Titan Gym, the Titans completed only their third season sweep of Fresno State and scored 100 points in a conference game for the first time.

Fullerton shot better than 50 per cent from the floor for only the second time all season but 23 turnovers, mostly against a full-court Long Beach State press, doomed the Titans, who had won in the Campus Gym the past two years.

Bill Mulligan's final appearance in Titan Gym as the UCI coach elicited a pregame plaque presentation from football coach and friend Gene Murphy and he also captured a victory, his sixth in 11 tries at Fullerton.

Fullerton never trailed in the game which was only tied once at 2-2. The Titans had a 10-point edge at 18-8 about 8 minutes into the game and the halftime edge was 9. UCSB made one strong run midway through the second half, turning a 45-34 deficit into a 47-44 game that forced a timeout. Out of that, the Titans went on a 9-0 run with Greg Vermon responsible for the final five points that built the lead back to 56-44 and UCSB never got closer than 10 points again.

The win clinched a spot in the tourney for Fullerton, but the Titans would need he ip on the final Saturday to avoid a third game with UNLV unless they could upset the Rebels themselves.

There would be no upset of the nation's top ranked team as UNLV became the first team since the 1979 Indiana State club of Larry Bird to go undefeated through the regular season. But the Titans got help from New Mexico State, which beat Fresno State and, when the smoke from all the tie-breakers had cleared, Long Beach State got the No. 8 seed and the unfortunate third meeting with the Rebels.

A typical full house in Titan Gym saw the Rebels struggle in the early going and actually trail on several occasions, the last time at 10-9 on J.D. Green's jumper with 14:59 to go in the half. The Rebels went ahead to stay on one of Larry Johnson's seemingly unstoppable inside moves and the lead grew to 13 at 34-21 before a 7-0 run cut the gap to 6. UNLV extended a 12-point halftime lead to 18 in the first 90 seconds of the second half and the contest was over.

Joe Small, who was held to a season low of 11 points in Las Vegas, had more luck this time and totaled 27 points to become only the sixth Titan to go over the 600-point mark for the season.

For the first time in seven years, the Titans did not win their first game in the Big West post-season tournament and, also for the first time in seven years, they were not eliminated by UNLV.

Attendance: 1,500

Pacific parlayed a red-hot 3-point hand of Dell Demps in the first half with an effective zone defense in the second half to gain the semifinals against Fresno State, which beat New Mexico State.

Fullerton played one of its best halves of the years in gaining a 43-36 lead at intermission. The Titans' defense produced 7 steals and many led to fast-break baskets as they hit 16 of 19 shots from inside the 3-point circle. Pacific, which led early, 13-5, got half its points of the half on six 3-pointers.

But after intermission the Tigers went to a zone defense that totally disrupted the Titans' offense. Joe Small had only one shot until the closing minutes when the fired up a couple of desperation 3-pointers. He ended up with a season's low of 9 points.

Aaron Wilhite and J.D. Green missed curlew the night before the game and were held out of the starting lineup.

Agee Ward to average in double figures in scoring and combine for almost 16 rebounds a game.

Point guard Wayne Williams had another solid season running the offense and Bruce Bowen and J.D. Green combined for about 17 points a game to approach Ceballos' average of 23.1. San Diego Mesa College transfer Kevin Ahsmuhs provided some help inside on the boards as Sneed went with only 7 or 8 players virtually every game.

The season opened as predicted with a pair of losses, a close one at Lamar and a blowout at Tulsa. A narrow home win over Butler, which would win its next game at Notre Dame, got the Titans going and back-to-back road wins at San Francisco and eventual WCC champion Pepperdine put Fullerton on a roll. The Titans followed with relatively easy home wins over Mississippi Valley State, Portland and Chapman College and then beat highly regarded Colorado State on a buzzer beater by Small.

Fullerton opened Big West play with a rare win at Fresno State as Small took over the game in the second half. The 8-game winning streak equalled the second longest in school history but came to an abrupt end two nights later at No. 1-ranked UNLV. Back home for games Nos. 3 and 4 on the conference schedule, the Titans ran their record to 10-3 overall and 3-1 with wins over Utah State and San Jose State.

But then came the slump that seems to annually plague the Titans in January. They lost in overtime at Pacific and less competitively at San Jose State in a game that saw Wilhite suffer a knee injury that would sideline him for five games, four of which the Titans lost. The exception was the shocker of the year and the one that would give the Titans the No. 6 seed in the post-season tournament over Fresno and Long Beach State. The Titans upset No. 21-ranked New Mexico State, 89-81, in a game they led by 17 points with 2 minutes to play.

Wilhite returned on Feb. 7 against Pacific and, not coincidentally, the 4-game losing streak ended abruptly as the Titans nipped the Tigers, 77-74, and beat Fresno State in overtime, 100-98, in their highest scoring conference game ever. Just when things seemed to be picking up the Titans lost two tough road games at Las Cruces and Long Beach to finish 1-8 on the road in conference play. The losses were compounded by a rare home loss to UC Irvine that jeopardized their chances of competing in the tournament, but they bounced back with a convincing effort against UC Santa Barbara that clinched a tourney berth.

A home loss to UNLV and an opening-round defeat to a red-hot Pacific team in the Big West Conference Tournament left the Titans at the .500 mark -- 14-14.

Prior to his stint at Weber State, O'Hara worked two years for Eastern Washington University on KEWU. He also covered regional high school and junior college events for three years on KMWX in Yakima, Washington, and also did Northwest League minor league baseball.

O'Hara replaces John Rebenstorf, who left during the summer after a decade with the Titans to become the play-by-play voice of UCLA football and men's basketball on KMPC.

"His broadcast experience coupled with his ability to sell has prepared him to do several key things for our department. With the impending dedication of our new on-campus playing facilities, marketing and sponsorship opportunities have never been greater for Cal State Fullerton."

Briggs has worked on Titan football broadcasts for the past four seasons after stints with UC Irvine basketball and Edison High School football. The University of Nebraska graduate is a successful insurance broker.



Cal State Fullerton has been well represented at the professional level despite the relative youth of the intercollegiate basketball program.

Seven Titans were drafted in the past eight years and several more players have signed as free agents. The Titans hit it big in 1984 when two players made National Basketball Association rosters -- guard Leon Wood with Philadelphia and center Ozell Jones with San Antonio. Each was subsequently traded more than once. Wood completed a 6-year career with Sacramento on Christmas Eve. 1990.




