March 7. 1879

Dear Boy-

Last night I received your telegram. I infer that Mr Van Tasselt had decided to make a change, and you wanted to know about re-renting the house. As you wrote you'd taken the house until the 15th of April. I don't see the sense in telegraphing. You might have known after all I've written you, that it was a matter not to be decided on the instant when I'd go back. I'll go back sometime if I live and that will be soon enough. Father thinks you are so lonely and miss us so much that we ought to go back this Spring.

I think as long as Mother needs me as
bad now as ever she did - it would be
wrong to leave her. Julia is too sick
to take care of herself and her baby
will be very sick this summer or I am
mistaken as to fifteen months old
and has only four teeth.

I will write you a longer letter tomorrow
about the house - you can give it up
whenever you think best - only I won't
have you sell the furniture - it's mine -
If Mother gets so she can go down stairs
or out I could go home as late as the
last of May - and if you did not
have the house we could trust to
luck and get another. If you are
sick or feel ill and want me of
course I'd go at once to you - You
can keep the money you'd send

one this month. I don't want it -
the children are well - my hand
is doing nicely - we all send
love. I telegraphed you today
Our return this Spring Doubtful
Just yourself about the house
