The November ballot





am glad to see that the thermometer sign relating to the campaign called "Kultivation Kwarters" has been removed from the AR. However, the notice regarding the campaign to raise \$2,000 to "finish the planting in front of the Recreation Center" is still appearing on LVTV every day, indicating that this collection of "Kwarters" is an ongoing project.

I was under the impression that the Board had decided this was not an approved purpose of the Planned Giving Committee. If the money already collected can't be returned to the contributors, the Planned Giving Committee could give it to the Village to add to the landscape budget as a donation. Or is the Board going to allow LVTV to show the advertisement for "Kultivating Kwarters" until they collect \$2,000?

Why is it necessary to have a fundraiser to pay for the maintenance of the common area in front of the Recreation Center? Article III, Par. 3.3 of "Covenants and Restrictions" provides that it is the duty of the Association "to maintain and otherwise manage the Common Areas" in the Village. I think it is demeaning to put cans in the Rec Office and the Main Office to collect "Kwarters" to pay for keeping up the appearance of the front of the AR. If money is needed to do this, then the money should come from the Association dues.

Are we in such financial straits that we have to collect "loose change" to keep up our beautiful Village? I think a bad precedent is being set by using this method to "help beautify the Village."

Will this set a trend to use cans to collect loose change to pay for other maintenance necessities? If "about \$2,000" is needed to pay for this work, then add 10 cents to the monthly dues so each owner can equally share the expense — 10 cents x 2136 houses x 12 months = \$2,563.20. Isn't that the way all the maintenance expenses are supposed to be financed?

I, for one, am embarrassed to see this method being used for this purpose. Seems to me we are creating a "nickel and dime" mentality!

cian with the movie studios and television for many years and worked with Dinah Shore. Tennessee Ernie Ford, Lawrence Welk and Herb Alpert, just to name a few. He appeared in many films, including "The Stripper" with Joanne Woodward and "Say One For Me" starring Debbie Reynolds, and he was the rehearsal drummer for Fred Astaire. He was well-respected in the industry by so many.

Jack went into the Army in 1943 and returned to Hollywood in 1945 at the end of the war. A great deal of his time after the war was spent organizing USO tours in Asia and Alaska. He continued with his Bongo and Conga drums and wrote and recorded instruction manuals, which were very well received. By many of his fellow workers and by people in the industry, he was known as Jack "Bongo" Burger.

In 1960, he entered college at CSUN and received a bachelor's degree in anthropology and government history. His accomplishments never stopped. Jack also had many other talents, which included woodworking, and he was an accomplished painter in oils.

Jack and his wife, Marie, were married on Jan. 28, 1968, and they moved to the Village in 1994. They had a wonderful 40

years together.

Jack was active in the Village and started the Writers Club, setting up the present rules and keeping the club going. All the members have a deep appreciation for the way the club was set up, and the camaraderie still exists today.

Jack's sister, Beverly

Wallace, also lives in the Village, and she was a great influence in his life.

So, we said goodbye to Jack Burger, but those who knew him will remember his mischievous ways, his quick wit and his ready smile. If only all of us could make a life so worthy of celebration.



What's cookin' in the Village

This is a new column for tasty recipes by residents of Leisure Village.

We kick it off with the world's best German Potato Salad, by Gudi Amerikaner, V. 32. No matter how much she makes, we never get enough!

Gudi's Potato Salad

Red or white new potatoes (2 per person) Salt and garlic salt to taste

Onion Cucumber (peeled) Radishes Dill weed

Vinegar (Gudi likes wine vinegar) Vegetable oil

Boil potatoes till done; not mushy! Drain and let cool. Peel and slice about 1/8 to 1/4 inch thick. To make vinegar mixture, mix 1 part vinegar to 3 parts water. Heat and pour over potatoes. Add oil, stirring until "slippery." Thinly slice cucumbers and radishes. Let them sit for a while: then drain. Dice medium onion. Taste potatoes to make sure they are to your liking. Season to taste with salt and garlie salt. Add onion, cucumber, radishes and dill weed. Add crisp bacon pieces, tomatoes, green peppers or anything else you like!

"There are no set quantities of ingredients," says Gudi. "You have to experiment. If you taste too much oil in the potatoes, add some water and pour off the excess liquid."

Medical guidelines send mixed message to older patients

For the last few years I have been treated for a gastrointestinal problem that is monitored by periodic colonoscopies. I'm sure that those of you who are familiar with this test well know how difficult, uncomfortable and unpleasant it is, especially the preparation.

The compensation, however, has come afterward in the doctor's comforting words, "Everything looks fine."

The last time I underwent this procedure, I heard even more comforting words from the doctor: Now that I was turning 80,

a colonoscopy would no longer be necessary.

My immediate reaction was a combination of gratitude and relief; later on, I began to have other reflections.

Certainly I would not miss having to go through this test, but what else did not having to go through it mean? Did it mean that the test results after this time didn't matter any more? That, after 80, these health problems no longer warrant the same attention or worry as at an earlier age?

Did it mean that because I have already lived more than my "three score and 10" allotted years, I should not be worrying so much or wanting so much to have more years?

Did it mean that the test was not worthwhile or cost-effective given the reality of the medical market and my stage of life? Did it mean that adding years to older patients' lives was not as desirable or necessary as to younger people's lives?

I agree that medical treatment needs to be pragmatic as well as compassionate in factoring in circumstances and resources. I understand that there are different

standards of wellness that I should expect and accept now that I'm older, which may also mean different standards of treatment to expect and accept.

And I do believe that the intent of such medical policy — on the part of most of the profession in general and certainly my doctor in particular — is consideration for vulnerable elderly patients.

Yet in spite of all that, I'm uncomfortable with a treatment policy that sends such a mixed message to us older patients, even if unintentional, i.e. that at the same time as we are presumably being protected, we are also being diminished. It may well be that this medical policy is necessary and wise, but I wish doctors would realize how this can make older patients feel.

It's as if they are devaluing the remaining years of our lives because there are so few left - whereas, for us, those remaining years are precious because there are so few left.



Quakes can trigger fires; be prepared

The potential for fires following severe earth-quakes is extremely high. Among the causes are burning candles, lighted cigarettes and pipes and electrical short circuits.


More than 500 fires were reported after the Loma Prieta earthquake. Fortunately, most of those fires were extinguished by individuals who discovered them or by vigilant neighbors.

In a major earthquake emergency, fire departments cannot respond immediately to all requests for aid. Normal channels for reporting fires also will be disrupted.

Every residence should have a fire extinguisher for emergency purposes. Family members should also know how to use their fire extinguishers. Type ABC, which is suitable for all fires, is recommended. Each new fire extinguisher comes with easy-to-read instructions on proper use. Fire extinguishers must be recharged by a qualified fire service company after use

— Re-establishment of the Purchase Research Committee will be ready for review at the September Board meeting.


— Motion to not allow a dog run/dog park to be built was passed by a 3-to-1 vote.

Car keys can serve as security alarm

Here's a great idea: Put your car keys beside your bed at night. If you hear a noise outside your home or someone trying to get in your house, just press the panic button for your car. The alarm will be set off, and the horn will continue to sound until either you turn it off or the car battery dies.

This tip came from a Neighborhood Watch coordinator. The next time you come home for the night and you start to put your keys away, think of this:

It's a security alarm system that you probably already have and requires no installation.

Test it. It will go off from nearly everywhere inside your house and will keep honking until your battery runs down or until you reset it with the button on the key fob chain.

It works if you park in your driveway or garage. If your car alarm goes off when someone is trying to break in your house, odds are the burglar or rapist won't stick around. After a few seconds, all the neighbors will be looking out their windows to see who is out there, and, sure enough, the criminal won't want that.

Also remember to carry your keys while walking to your car in a parking lot.
