

PRESS CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only. Requests should be made as far in advance as possible. "Visiting" media may make their requests through their respective SIDs. When time permits, credentials will be mailed.

PHOTO CREDENTIALS: Will be issued on a per game basis only and must be worn in plain sight at all times. NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the field and the team areas and these rules will be strictly enforced.

PARKING: Free, ample and close to western grandstand with press box. No credential or pass required.

PRESS BOX: Is limited to working members of the press, radio, television and others whose duties require use of the press area. No one will be admitted without proper credentials (spouses included). Refreshments will be provided. Play-by-play reports by quarters, halftime and final statistics, scoring summary and post-game quotes will be distributed throughout the press box, which is located on the west side of Santa Ana Bowl.

TELECOPIERS: One will be available on a page-by-page, first-come first-served basis.

BROADCAST SPACE: One booth per team. Additional needs will be handled on an individual basis.

TELEPHONES: One pay telephone and one usually busy Fullerton SID phone available in main press box level. Additional private phones must be ordered through Pacific Bell by calling (818) 576-3204.

INTERVIEW ROOMS: None available. Interviews must be conducted outside the locker room areas.

SCOUTS: Professional scouts will be issued tickets in the grandstands. Scouts from opposing schools will be issued press box passes if space permits in accordance with NCAA rules but only if requested at least five days in advance.



Cal State Fullerton Campus



California State University, Fullerton is a broadly based liberal arts institution that also offers many professional studies such as business administration, education, engineering and nursing.

Classes were offered for the first time in 1959 and the first commencement -- for five students -- took place in 1960.

The university's 23,000 students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes: many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its overall program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, communications, music, nursing, speech and hearing, and theater. All told there are 85 degree programs — 41 of them at the graduate level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is one of the largest university level internship and cooperative education programs on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Still another strong point is the university's cultural events program. It includes a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances and the Cabaret Repertory Theater Company, which performs regularly in Brea.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups. Another is Continuing Learning Experience, which has spearheaded the fund-raising campaign to build a gerontology center on campus.

Further examples of community outreach are joint ventures with the City of Fullerton. One resulted in the Fullerton Arboretum, which opened on campus in 1979. Another produced lighting for the baseball field and adjoining soccer fields, while a third yielded two lighted softball fields. The university and city are now moving ahead with plans for an inn/conference center on campus as well as a sports complex.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community services, Cal State has embarked on a comprehensive fund-raising campaign. Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to make a very good university a great university.

History of Titan Athletics





Obstacles and adversity. Grass-roots support and coaches with "sandwich-board" signs. Stunning upsets and courageous performances. All have been a part of Cal State Fullerton athletics as "Titan Pride" has taken limited resources to athletic successes disproportionate to such a young institution.

How many universities can claim national championships in six different sports, a star major league third baseman, men and women basketball players in the Olympics, a rookie in the Super Bowl and the subject matter of a Walt Disney feature film?

The tenor was set by the first Titan intercollegiate team — men's basketball. In only their second season, the Titans of coach Alex Omalev advanced five rounds into the NAIA national playoffs in 1961-62.

Sixteen seasons later, the entire nation watched another "cinderella" Titan five advance to within one victory of the final four as Bobby Dye's 1977-78 team won the Pacific Coast Athletic Association post-season tournament and then beat nationally ranked New Mexico and USF to gain the finals of the Western Regional.

The basketball tradition, which included coach Billie Moore and star Nancy Dunkle on the women's 1976 Olympic team, was continued in 1984 as Leon Wood helped the men

to a gold medal before he became a first-round NBA draft choice.

Gymnastics has brought Fullerton more fame. Coach Dick Wolfe won three college division national titles (1971, 1972 and 1974) and has had recent Titan teams in the Top Ten at the Division I level while winning 10 PCAA titles in a row. Lynn Rogers began the women's program in 1976 and the Titans have finished fifth or better in the nation every year including the national title in 1979. One-armed Carol Johnston was an All-American and the star of the Disney film, "Lefty."

Baseball exploded on the national scene with the arrival of coach Augie Garrido. He broke the USC monopoly in the western regionals in 1975 and won the national title in 1979 behind the play of Tim Wallach, now of the Montreal Expos. And he won the College World Series again in 1984 with players soon to be seen in the majors.

Women have sparkled on Fullerton diamonds, too. Coach Judi Garman founded the softball program in 1980 and the Titans have been a powerhouse, making five trips to the College World Series in six tries with a pair of second-place finishes to their credit.

There have been national titles in men's cross country and women's fencing and individual standouts like golfer Martha Wilkerson and runner Mark Covert. But football is the name of the game in intercollegiate sports and the Titans have won their share on the gridiron as well.

Dick Coury was the inaugural coach and he built an instant winner at the Division II level. The Titans were 27-16-1 over the first four years under Coury and successor Pete Yoder before the growing pains of moving up to Division I were endured. But the program came of age under the guidance of Gene Murphy and football is another top-flight Div. I program of which Fullerton students, alumni, faculty, staff and the community can be proud.

Administration



Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb, President

Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb was appointed the third president of Cal State Fullerton on July 8, 1981. Her selection was the culmination of a nationwide search begun in November, 1980.

Dr. Cobb had served as dean of Douglass College at Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey, since 1976. There she also held the rank of professor of biological sciences. Prior to her Douglass appointment she was dean of Connecticut College and professor of zoology for seven years. Previously, she was professor of biology at Sarah Lawrence College in New York.

Born in January, 1924, Dr. Cobb is known for her work in cell physiology, her promotion of the advancement of women in scientific fields and her activities on behalf of minorities. She is the first black woman to head a major public university on the West Coast.

Cobb earned her bachelor's degree from Talladega College in Alabama and her M.S. and Ph.D. in cell physiology from New York University. She also holds 14 honorary doctorates. She is the mother of a son, Jonathan, who is a graduate of the Cornell University Medical School.

Titan Athletic Foundation

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization that exists solely to aid the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals with a genuine interest in athletics, the University and the community and it responds by providing funds for scholarships to attract the best student-athletes available.

Athletic Department



Ed Carroll, Athletic Director

Ed Carroll completed a rapid climb through the ranks of the Cal State Fullerton athletic department when he became director of athletics on July 1.

University President Dr. Jewel Plummer Cobb made the appointment on May 28 after a nationwide search and Carroll, 34, immediately ushered in an era of "positive thinking" for Titan athletics.

"One of my top priorities will be to enhance the image of our athletic program by stressing positives," says Carroll. "We must use the power of positive thinking to overcome our limitations and build our program to greater heights."

Carroll began his Fullerton athletic career as a wrestler. In 1972 he served as team captain and was selected the "Most Outstanding Wrestler" in the California Collegiate Athletic Association championship meet. He later served as an assistant to former head coach Don Matson.

Carroll earned bachelor's degrees in history and physical education from Fullerton as well as a secondary teaching credential. He taught physical education classes at Fullerton and earned a master's degree in recreation administration from Long Beach State.

After serving in various capacities for the Fullerton recreation program, Carroll left briefly in mid-1980 to serve as a recreational sports programmer and doctoral intern at Indiana University. He returned to Fullerton in November, 1980 as an assistant athletic director. From October, 1981 to April, 1982 he was acting athletic director and also acting director of the Titan Athletic Foundation. He then served as an associate athletic director for business affairs under athletic director Lynn Eilefson, who left in January, 1985 for a similar post at San Jose State.

Head Coach Gene Murphy

During the 1982 football season, reporters unfamiliar with the situation were asking about the status of Gene Murphy, then in his third season as head football coach at Cal State Fullerton.

"Is his job in jeopardy?" they asked during the latter stages of a 3-9 season which came on the heels of 4-7 and 3-8 campaigns.

During the 1984 season, the same media members were again asking where Murphy was coaching next, but for a different reason.

"How can Fullerton keep him?" they inquired after the popular Irishman had led the Titans to 7-4 and 11-1 (12-0) seasons. "What bigtime school is he going to?"

In the fifth year of a five-year agreement, Murphy, 46, wisely listened to the market-place.

"I do NOT want to leave Fullerton," he said after the season concluded, "but I would be committing professional suicide if I didn't listen to other offers."

Murphy listened while Titan followers held their collective breath. He turned down Utah and he turned down Oregon State and early in January signed a new contract at Fullerton.

"I'm a Titan," he said emphatically. "It wasn't a difficult decision to stay. We're going

to have a good football team this year and I think the program, with the improvements that have been made, will sustain itself.

"Heck, with the effort given by last year's players and the coaching staff, Idi Amin could have fielded a winner at Fullerton."

The improvements were most welcomed but still hardly fit in the "luxury" class. The administration provided an additional coaching position, a secretary and brought the Titans' scholarship levels closer to the Division I maximum. Added to the weight training facility, office complex and fall training camp arrangement provided by the coaches themselves, the Titans have moved within one giant step of a visibly competitive program -- an on-campus stadium.


"That's the final piece in the puzzle," said Murphy. "We are very pleased with our arrangement at the Santa Ana Bowl, but playing on campus in our own facility would be the ultimate."

Negativism is a word not found in the Murphy dictionary. More than anything else, Murphy brought "Titan pride" to the program and the improved self-image has helped the coaches and players cope with some of the obstacles unknown to other Division I programs. "That's us" has become a rallying cry for the Titans when something goes wrong -- just a minor detour toward the common goal.

"What we have is 'Titan Family'," says Murphy with fatherly pride. "You win with people. We put up with a lot of adversity but we do it together and I think it has made us stronger. It's something you have to experience to properly appreciate.

"I've said it many times but I sincerely believe it. No one can match our staff of assistant coaches. We work together, they don't work for me. And it takes a special kind of person to play football at Fullerton."

Murphy came to Fullerton to "throw the football" and his early teams featured wideopen aerial assaults and more than a bagfull of trick and gadget plays, all known collectively as the "squirrel derby" offense. The 1983 Pacific Coast Athletic Association

A GLOSSARY OF MURPHISMS

As a native of New Jersey, nurtured in the upper midwest, employed in Canada and now working and living in southern California, coach Gene Murphy has developed a language all his own. In the interest of better communication, here is a glossary of often-used words and phrases:

"Hail damage in the attic" — questionable mentality or lack of common sense

"Joisey" - his native state of New Jersey

"Jordanians" — his kicker, either punters or placekickers

"Keeper" — a player who will contribute to a winning program

"Munchken" - small, tiny person . . . usually a defensive back

"Norp" - someone from North Dakota

"Sandy Koufax" — a "no-hitter" . . . a player afraid of physical contact

"Smash-mouth" — an offensive style of football conducive to the upper midwest that makes Woody Hayes look like a riverboat gambler . . . up the gut & in your face

"Snuse" - smokeless tobacco

"Sorp" - someone from South Dakota

"Squirrel derby" — Murphy's offense, featuring lots of motion and passes to all receivers . . . end arounds, flea flickers, fake punts and other trick plays

"Stallion" - a notch above a keeper

"That's Us" — all encompassing exclamation when something goes wrong away from the gridiron: late bus...bumped from airliner...locked stadium...photo day bleachers lost...kicked out of Anaheim Stadium morning of game

"Yewper" - someone from northern Michigan

championship team was built around a stubborn and ball-hawking defense and strong special teams play. Last year, the Titans put it all together: more running to balance the always strong passing game, tremendous special teams play and an aggressive defense that was No. 2 in the nation behind Washington in creating turnovers. Unpredictable is probably the safest way to label Murphy's coaching style.

PCAA Coach of the Year honors were bestowed on Murphy in 1983 and last season he topped that, earning United Press International West Coast Coach of the Year laurels.

"Those awards are nice, but it's the coaches and the players who deserve the credit," said Murphy.

Born Eugene Vincent Murphy on Aug. 6, 1939 in Jersey City, New Jersey, Murphy was an all-sports star at St. Peter's High School in New Brunswick and earned all-state honors in football (quarterback) and baseball (shortstop). His late father also was a coach and matched wits with the likes of Vince Lombardi at the prep level.

Recruited to the University of Minnesota by assistant Ray Malavasi under head coach Murray Warmath, Murphy soon found himself sitting on the bench behind Gopher star Sandy Stephens. He transferred to the University of North Dakota and as a senior was

the All-North Central Conference quarterback.

After attaining his bachelor's degree (physical education) in 1962, Murphy served one year as graduate assistant and then coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul High School before returning to UND, where he stayed 16 more years -- the first 14 as an assistant and eventually offensive coordinator and then the 1978 and 1979 seasons as head coach.

While he was offensive coordinator, the Sioux won six conference championships and participated in three post-season bowl games (1966, 1972 and 1975). As head coach, he won the conference title in 1979 and was named conference coach of the year. The Fightin' Sioux went 10-2 and were ranked as high as No. 3 in the Division II national rankings. His 1978 team was 5-5, giving him a two-year mark at UND of 15-7.

"I was very comfortable at North Dakota, too comfortable," Murphy explains. "I needed a challenge and came to California to see the sun. I've had more fun coaching at

Fullerton than ever before."

Murphy spent five summers (1967-71) as an assistant "guest" coach with the Saskatchewan Rough Riders of the Canadian Football League. During his Fullerton tenure he also has turned down opportunities to return to the Canadian League.

A holder of two master's degrees (physical education in 1963 and secondary administration in 1977), Murphy served as Fullerton's interim athletic director for much of 1981.

Murphy has two sons. Tim, 19, is beginning his sophomore year at Cal State Fullerton and works in the athletic department equipment room. Michael, 15, plays football at Esperanza High School in Anaheim.

SEASON PREVIEW

Merely approaching the success of the past two seasons will be a significant accomplishment for Cal State Fullerton football in 1985.

The Titans have come further in two years than any other Division I program in the nation, given where they were and how far coach Gene Murphy has elevated the program. The transformation:

-- Fullerton went into the 1983 season on a string of nine losing seasons with a cumulative on-the-field record of 27-62-1.

-- Fullerton goes into the 1985 season on the heels of two league championships, a bowl game appearance, a national Top 20 ranking and, in most people's minds, an unbeaten 12-0 season.

"I said we would be as good as Cal State Fullerton could be in 1983 and 1984 and it's testimony to the efforts of the players and the assistant coaches how well we did," said Murphy. "Now the challenge is to sustain the program at this level."

Graduation took a big bite out of the Titans, who beat every team on their schedule that fielded eligible players. The only blemish on the 11-1 on-the-field slate was a 26-20 loss at Nevada-Las Vegas, which later forfeited two seasons' worth of victories due to the use of seven ineligible players. The PCAA council awarded Fullerton the 1984 PCAA title in May and changed the official records to 12-0 overall, 7-0 in PCAA play.

OFFENSE

QUARTERBACK — No one expects Damon Allen's large shoes to be filled. Two players who have spent two years in the system are vying for the job. The frontrunner is **Kevin Jan**, who played briefly in 1983 but sat out last year for this opportunity. He starred at Pierce JC and at Granada Hills High School took over for graduated John Elway. Whit Brown redshirted in 1983 and was Allen's back-up in 1984. Three impressive incoming freshmen will vie for the No. 3 spot and the likely traveling squad berth. San Diego products **Carlos Siragusa** and **Tony Dill** and El Toro High's versatile **Rod Gatlin** all show promise.

RUNNING BACK — Despite the loss of four-year letterman Roy Lewis, this position is a strength. Returning are 1984's leading ground gainer in Burness Scott and the No. 2 man in 1983 in Rick Calhoun, who also is one of the nation's top kick-off return artists. Both are legitimate breakaway threats as well as punishing inside runners. Backing up this tandem are untested but quick transfers and redshirt freshmen led by Oregon transfer Eric Franklin, San Francisco CC product Thamar Moore and Ohio product Keith Bowman.

FULLBACK — Todd Gerhart stepped out of his Titan blue and orange and into the backup job for the Denver Gold this past spring so there will be a new face. Reserve **Bo White** and freshman redshirt **Bill Jaquish** are the top candidates to replace Gerhart, a four-year letterman.

WIDE RECEIVER — The "corpsmen" return for their senior year and you might see some more single back sets to get at least a trio of the quartet of James Pruitt, Allen Pitts, Wade Lockett and Corn Redick into action simultaneously. Redick has the best career stats and was a second-team All-PCAA pick last year but Murphy loses little with substitution and keeps these potential game-breakers fresh. There is talent in reserve, too, in apprentices Todd White and John Gibbs.

TIGHT END — Experienced speed and youthful size summarize this position where **Bob** Kent is the No. 1 man after splitting time for two years with Marvin Williams. Former quarterback **Jim Thornton** is the back-up but don't be surprised to see either of two impressive freshmen gain playing time: **John Smith** or **Bill Brennan**.

INTERIOR LINE — The Titans' improved offense of the past two years started up front and line coach Larry Manfull has most of his "Hogs" back. The glaring exception is two-time All-PCAA pick Daren Gilbert, the No. 2 choice of the New Orleans Saints in the NFL draft. Returning is All-PCAA strong guard Mark Stephenson and 1984 starters Hank Goebel, Dave Martinez and Joe Florentine. Also back is 1983 starter Darryl Titsworth, who sat out last year. Lettermenin reserve include Larry Waldo, Phil Benson and Kelly Gogerty with Ed Gillies tabbed to replace Gilbert. Backing up Gillies is another potential Gilbert in freshman redshirt Mike Oliver.

DEFENSE

ENDS — Three veterans return in the persons of **Sean Foy** and **Mark Chisom** on the strong side and **Ted Hinton** on the weak side. Hinton moves into the starting spot vacated by senior Eric Emery and Defensive Scout Player of the Year **George Pritchard** becomes his back-up.

TACKLES — Four of five 1984 regulars return. Colorful quotemaker **Ron McLean** assumes the leadership role of departed Andre Pinesett. He will be backed up again by **Ruben Lizarraga**. On the other side young **Jeff Taylor** and **Tom Tatum** provide the beef.

NOSE GUARD — The returning tandem of Jim Baioa and Carlos Adley had a great 1984 season and countered the loss of 1983 PCAA Defensive Player of the Year Joe Aguilar. Junior college transfer Chip Dickerson will provide the back-up if needed.

LINEBACKERS — This position was hit hardest by graduation. Junior college transfer Bryan Riggs and freshman redshirt Jeff Hipp are the probables on the "weak" side with lettermen Bob Oeh and Russ Maybury vying for the starting role on the "strong" side. Converted defensive end Greg Williams and freshman redshirt Bill Windhorn are the reserves but freshmen Bill Bryan and Stan Bowers have the physical talent to make an immediate impact.

CORNERBACKS — With All-American candidate **Mark Collins** on one side, the emphasis switches to the other side of the field where freshman redshirt **James Howard** had a great spring to pass lettermen **Vernon Norwood** and **Reggie Hill** in the battle for graduated Steve Belardi's spot. Versatile **Kelly Ross** is Collins' back-up.

SAFETIES — Both starters are new but not without considerable game experience. Mike Romero replaces Duane Henson at the strong side with Randy Gonzales in reserve. Fighting for Mark Pembrook's job at free safety are letterman Tom Phillips and Trent Baker.

SPECIAL TEAMS

KICKERS — New faces for 1984. Washington transfer **Len Strandley** has as good a leg if not better than four-year placekicker Greg Steinke, but can't do much better in the clutch. **Jim Sirois** has the potential to be the best Titan punter yet but will be challenged by 6-foot-5 freshman **Kurt Bloedom** in their battle to replace Vince Gamache.

RETURN MEN — **Corn Redick** was first-team All-PCAA as a punt returner and **Rick Calhoun** was second-team as kick-off return man at 30.5 yards per effort, which would have led the nation with two more returns to qualify. Outstanding special teams play has been a Murphy trademark for five seasons.





On the Road Again

Willie Nelson's early 1980s hit became the Titan football theme song as coach Gene Murphy took his team to most of the airports in the western United States. In his first five seasons, Murphy is 11-7 (12-6 with forfeit) at a combination of four home sites, 17-22 (18-21 with forfeit) on the road and 0-1 on a neutral site. The 18 home games represent only 31 per cent of the 58 total games, which included one streak of 10 consecutive road contests (last six of 1980 and first four of 1981).

But it has been worse. In Fullerton's first five years of Division I play, the Titans played only 17 home games including just two each in 1978 and 1979. The home record was 8-9 while the road mark was 9-29 (11-27 with forfeits).

The totals: 35 home games and 78 away from home in 10 years.

Wayne Welk to Describe Titan Football on KWOW

Wayne Welk debuts as play-by-play announcer for Cal State Fullerton in 1985. All home and road games will be carried live on KWOW (1600 AM), the most powerful AM station ever to carry Titan football.

Welk and partner Bob Olson of ROWW Enterprises are packaging Titan football and men's basketball as part of a regional "network" that included at press time the men's basketball programs at San Jose State, St. Mary's (CA), Gonzaga, Loyola-Marymount and Santa Clara.

For the past nine years, Welk has served as the voice of St. Cloud State University in St. Cloud, Minnesota. Previously he served in a variety of roles in California as the sports information director at Long Beach State and UC Irvine and the broadcaster for Cal Poly San Luis Obispo (1972-74) and University of the Pacific (1974-75).

Welk and his wife Sharon and children Tom, 22, and daughter, Sherri, 19, live in Palm Springs. KWOW is based in Pomona and plays "all oldies all the time." Its 5,000 watt signal covers all of Orange County and extends west to downtown Los Angeles, north to the San Bernardino mountains and east beyond Ontario.



Review of 1984

Cal State Fullerton enjoyed its most successful football season ever in 1984, posting a record of:

- 12-0—PCAA: "Based on PCAA Council action, the 1984 championship was awarded to Cal State Fullerton and the final standings were re-ordered as follows: CS Fullerton, 7-0/12-0; . . .
- 11-1—NCAA: "The game will remain recorded as it was reported on-field. Therefore, you should not change the score or your won-loss record... it also does not change your coach's win-loss record. Clarification is made by asterisk and footnote."

Either way, it was a sensational year, marred only by the post-season forfeiture controversy by Nevada-Las Vegas and the lack of a bowl bid despite the ensuing awarding of the PCAA championship.

Only national champion Brigham Young University kept Fullerton from compiling the nation's longest winning streak (10 games on the field) and its best overall record. Still, the Titans were noticed.

- By the media: United Press International, ESPN and Sports Illustrated all had the Titans ranked in the nation's Top 20. Los Angeles radio and television stations found good copy in Fullerton as did major metropolitan newspapers. On one afternoon, 13 Titan players were conducting media interviews before practice.
- By the professionals:

 As of June 30, at least 15 Titans were under contract or had been drafted by the National Football League. Daren Gilbert was a second round pick of New Orleans and Mark Pembrook a sixth round choice of the New York Giants, surpassing the previous high Titan pick (Bobby Kemp in the 8th round by Cincinnati in 1981).
- By the fans: Fullerton enjoyed its first sellout home crowd in history when more than 12,000 overflowed Santa Ana Bowl for the final home game against Fresno State.
- By the honors teams:

 Gene Murphy was selected UPI's West Coast Coach of the Year; Damon Allen was selected one of the nation's top ten quarterbacks and played in the Senior Bowl in Mobile, Alabama; Daren Gilbert played in the East-West Shrine Game in Palo Alto and a total of five Titans earned All-American honors.

Whereas the 1983 team captured the first league title, played in the first bowl game and scored first-ever wins over San Jose State and Utah State, the 1984 contingent carried on with ground-breaking success. The Titans won for the first time in eight trips to Hawaii and captured wins in their first trips ever to Ft. Collins (Colorado State) and Las Cruces (New Mexico State). But unlike 1983, when the Titans barely won many of their seven victories, the 1984 team learned how to put opponents away. They outscored the opposition, 337-211, and all but two of their victories came by eight points or more.

Turnovers played a major part of the success and the lone failure. Fullerton finished a narrow second to the University of Washington in turnover margin with a plus 27 to the Huskies' plus 28. The third place team (Rutgers) was a considerable distance back at plus 16. The Titans' 27 pass interceptions tied for the national lead and set a PCAA record. But against UNLV, Fullerton lost the ball four times and gained no turnovers.

The Titans' record book took a pounding, particularly the single-season standards. Thirteen individual and seven team single-season marks were erased not counting the five PCAA and one NCAA records revised. Another 12 individual career marks tumbled including five by Allen.

The Titans' best-ever season coincided with the senior campaigns of the first recruiting class of Gene Murphy. Players forced into action as freshmen and sophomores survived the physical beatings of 1981 and 1982 and returned the pleasures in 1983 and 1984. Gone but never forgotten are four-year players Damon Allen, Eric Emery, Todd Gerhart, Daren Gilbert, Duane Henson, Roy Lewis, John Nevens, Mark Pembrook, Terry Smoot and Greg Steinke along with five-year stalwarts Larry Baker, Steve Belardi and Andre Pinesett.

On more than one occasion in the past, the Titans had played well in Hawaii only to come out on the short end of the scoreboard. But in 1984, Fullerton would not be denied and the Titans won for the first time in eight tries on the islands, 21-13, in a game that wasn't as close as the score would indicate.

An offense that was going to make several dents in the Titan record book before the year was out began to roll, piling up 328 net yards. The Titans scored the first two times they had the football, driving 65 and 95 yards. The latter drive consumed 7:58 of the clock on 14 plays. Penalties stopped the next two Fullerton possessions and left the halftime lead at 14-3.

Hawaii, which repelled a 67-yard Titan drive to open the second half, came back to score behind the passing of Rafael Cherry. The Rainbow Warriors drove again to a first down at the Fullerton two-yard line. But a goal-line defense forced a field goal that left Hawaii short of the lead at 14-13 and the Titans soon iced the game following a pass interception by Eric Emery.

The defense allowed the explosive Warriors only 264 yards. Twice they broke up Cherry passes on fourth down in the waning minutes to preserve the victory.

The return to Santa Ana Bowl after an eightyear hiatus marked the opening of the home portion of the 1984 Titan schedule and Fullerton responded, albeit late, to earn a victory for the homecoming party, 28-7.

The visiting Idaho Vandals gave the Titans all they could handle, even after starting quarterback Scott Linehan went out with a shoulder injury early in the second quarter. Before Linehan was hurt, he threw an 11-vard touchdown pass to give Idaho a 7-0 lead that would hold up through the half.

Fullerton didn't cross midfield until midway through the second quarter and when it did, disaster was waiting. First, Damon Allen fumbled. Second, he threw an interception. The third time, the Titans allowed the clock to expire after they had tried two plays from the Idaho one-yard line.

Fullerton tied the score on its second possession of the third quarter with a 34-yard Allen to Allen Pitts pass and a 40-yard Corn Redick reverse setting up the score.

The outmanned Vanguards waned in the final quarter, which saw Allen and Pitts team up for a 25-yard touchdown pass on the first play. Allen threw for two more scores and the Titans ended up with 516 yards of total offense and the defense forced seven turnovers including five pass interceptions.

The Titans avenged a humiliating 31-0 loss to Facific in Stockton in 1982 with their biggest point production ever against a Division I opponent in a 41-31 win over the Tigers.

Fullerton put its unblemished 8-0 overall record and 3-0 PCAA marks on the line at Veterans Stadium in Long Beach and the offense outdid itself against the 49ers.

Long Beach State outgained Fullerton, 482 to 369 yards but Doug Gaynor threw three interceptions to none for Damon Allen and that tilted the scales in the Titans' favor.

The 49ers scored just before the end of the half but the Titans responded with a time-consuming 88-yard drive late in the third quarter for a 28-12 lead and a 70-yard advance made it 35-12 with 8.45 to play.

Gaynor got hot and threw a pair of touchdowns and two-point conversion passes to make it 35-28 with 2:20 to play. The Titans recovered the on-sides kick and then put the game away on Gerhart's run and a third interception of Gaynor by John Nevens.

Carrying the responsibility of their first national wire service ranking (No. 20 by UPI), the Titans put their 9-0 record on the line against an explosive 6-2 Fresno State team. It took a 48-yard Greg Steinke field goal and a pass interception at the goal line AFTER the final gun had sounded to pull out a 20-17 victory and keep the record spotless.

The Titans were forced to play from more than one score behind for the first time all season when quarterback Kevin Sweeney pushed the Bulldogs into a 14-3 second-quarter lead. The Titans pulled within 14-10 late in the first half when Damon Allen hit Allen Pitts to cap a 56-yard drive.

Big defensive plays kept the Bulldogs from getting further ahead. Mark Collins intercepted Sweeney at the Fullerton three-yard line to stop one drive and a sack by Scott Weller forced a field goal that left only a 17-10 deficit going into the fourth quarter of the first home sellout (12,121) in Fullerton history.

The crowd came alive when the Titans drove to the Bulldog 20 but the drive stalled and Steinke missed a 46-yard field goal. The crowd really came alive when the Titans completed an 80-yard drive to tie the game with 5:16 to play and they went crazy when Fresno State failed on a fake punt play at the Titans' 43 with 4:21 to play. That set up a short drive to Steinke's gamewinning field goal.

What turned into a controversial off-season could have been avoided by the Titans when they took their 10-0 overall record and 5-0 PCAA mark into the Silver Bowl in Las Vegas for the showdown with the University of Nevada-Las Vegas.

The nation's No. 2 team in turnover margin at the end of the year was an uncharacteristic victim of its own mistakes as the Titans turned the ball over four times to none for the hosts in a 26-20 loss that ended with the Titans desperately trying to score from the UNLV 13yard line.

Fullerton fumbled away the opening kickoff and played catch-up the rest of the night. A rare Damon Allen interception near the UNLV goal line left the halftime score UNLV 17-7 and the Rebels made it 20-7 before Allen ran for a touchdown on the last play of the third quarter. A goahead touchdown run by Allen four minutes later was nullified by a penalty that forced a field goal and another penalty forced the Titans deep into their own territory where a short punt set up the clinching 37-yard touchdown drive for UNLV.

Fullerton responded with a drive that got close enough for a Greg Steinke field goal that set the stage for the recovery of an onsides kick and the

last ill-fated attempt.

Fullerton tried to muster its shattered enthusiasm by calling its final game of the season at Las Cruces against New Mexico State "our bowl game" but it wasn't quite the same. With rumors of UNLV's pending forfeitures and slim chances of an invitation to the Freedom Bowl or other game, the Titans had to rely on senior pride for motivation.

The defensive unit responded best, chalking up the first shutout in the Gene Murphy era with a 20-0 win over the ground-oriented Aggies. New Mexico State passed for only 31 yards while Fullerton punter Vince Gamache threw for 35 yards in a contest that was in hand all the way.

Several individual season and career records were broken in the game but Rick Calhoun's chances to lead the nation in kickoff returns was thwarted -- first by the Aggies' on-sides kick to start the game and then the shutout which eliminated further Aggies kickoffs, leaving Calhoun two returns shy of the minimum.

Fullerton went 50 yards in nine plays for a touchdown after the aborted on-sides try and got a 38-yard Greg Steinke field goal two possessions later. A blocked field goal and a fumble inside the Aggies' seven-yard line left it 10-0 at the half. The Titans got the ball three times in the second half at midfield or in Aggie territory but it took a fake punt and fake field goal to help score the final 10 points of the game.

New Mexico never advanced beyond the Titans' 41-yard line.

Santa Ana Bowl



Cal State Fullerton football is making its home again in the Santa Ana Bowl.

Officially named "Eddie West Field - Santa Ana Stadium," the 12,000-seat facility served as the Titans' home during portions of the 1971 through 1975 seasons while Fullerton was alternating home dates with Anaheim Stadium. Last year the Titans returned on a "temporary permanent" basis and won all four home dates to run their Santa Ana record to 15-9.

Located on Flower Street between Sixth and Civic Center Drive in central Santa Ana, the "Bowl" is only nine miles south of the Cal State Fullerton campus and it boasts tradition as one of the first stadium sites in Orange County. It was dedicated on Apr. 27, 1932 and has played host to a wide variety of athletic and entertainment events while undergoing numerous facelifts and remodelings. It is the home field for Santa Ana College and all Santa Ana High Schools.

The current structure was built in 1963. It was re-dedicated in 1981 in memory of Eddie West, the long-time sports editor of the Orange County Register.

The two-tiered, enclosed press box can handle two radio play-by-play crews in separate booths, numerous film crews on the roof and approximately 30 writers and statisticians on the lower level.

Plans are underway to raze the stadium to allow construction of an NBA-style arena.

Youth Sports Complex

The long-awaited dream of a permanent-on-campus football facility for Cal State Fullerton is "in sight" again after more than two years of delays due to litigation brought by a student group and neighborhood group.

The joint venture involving the State of California, the University, the City of Fullerton and the Hilton Hotel chain is designed to provide the Titans and all of northern Orange County with adequate football, soccer and baseball fan facilities.

State land will be used to house the Hilton Hotel with the land-lease funds being directed to maintain the youth sports complex. The University is required to provide the "front" money with the City of Fullerton funding the majority of the project.

Home Field History

The need for a permanent, on-campus facility was never more obvious than in 1983 when the Titans were forced to move the playing site of two of their three home games on 24 and four hours' notice due to "rain clauses" in their Anaheim Stadium contract.
