### New energy in Leisure Village — and it's clean

#### By Patty Ecker

A group of Village volunteers is intent on looking into the future for all of us. However, you won't find crystal balls on their meeting table.

Rather, the new Clean Energy Committee is exploring ways to significantly reduce the cost of electricity for the Village. Members are studying graphs, photos, silicon panels and reports explaining how Leisure Village – its common buildings and eventually its residences – could become energy independent.

"It's not future science. Solar, wind and biomass power are real, and we want to find ways to lower energy costs permanently," explains Committee Chair Bob Ellis.

Committee members emphasize that they are investigating and learning.

"We are not committing to anything. Nor are we on a timetable," explains Don Marquardt, who proposed the committee and serves as its liaison with the Village Board of Directors. "This is not about political things like global warming. This is simple: Are there alternative ways to produce electricity that would reduce our electric bill?"

Exploring green energy for the Recreation Center is the initial focus of the committee. Currently, the electric bill for

Management Agency, which monitors and protects aquifers underlying the southern portion of Ventura County.

Both awards underscore the district's long-term efforts to increase water self-reliance and keep water rates affordable.

Hanna Huber is now arranging for a new seven-week class for the fall, and I urge you to consider attending it.

Why?

To prepare you to help yourself, your family and your neighbors in case of a catastrophic disaster. I thought, having been involved in several disasters already, I was fairly well prepared and had a pretty good idea of how to proceed in the aftermath, but I learned more in the CERT class. You will not be obligated to help anyone or participate in anything! Even if you haven't the time or inclination to get involved in one more thing, please consider this class for your own well-being.

Our instructor, Capt. Steve Lazenby of the Santa Paula Fire Department, gave us many little tips to enhance our safety at home, in our cars and even while traveling.

Do you know what floor in a hotel or office building is the highest a fire ladder can reach?

Did you know that you should not store your plastic water bottles directly on concrete because the chemicals in the concrete leach into the plastic bottle. I had been storing plastic water bottles on my garage floor, but now I know to place them in a container raised off the floor or on top of a little platform made from scrap wood.

The Homeland Security-sponsored free program of once-a-week classes for seven weeks covers disaster preparedness, fire safety, disaster medical operations, light search and rescue operations, disaster psychology, terrorism and CERT and ends with a disaster simulation.






### MPR gets projector

### Realtors Corner: Update on flood insurance issue

The Leisure Village Association may get a reprieve from the updated Flood Insurance Rate Maps, which were effective Jan. 20. The House recently approved a bill that reauthorizes the National Flood Insurance Program for five years. This bill was sent to the Senate. One of the most significant changes postpones the requirement that homeowners in newly mapped areas buy insurance.

Because of remapping, many Leisure Village homes were placed in a flood zone. Mortgage lenders have continued to contact homeowners regarding obtaining flood insurance. Some lenders have threatened to place flood insurance on homes in the designated Special Flood Hazard areas. Some lenders have declined to fund new loans due to their perception of insufficient flood coverage.

It is important for homeowners to understand that the Association is legally obligated to repair and replace any structures that may be damaged by flood, irrespective of any insurance policies. According to the Leisure Village Association's law firm, homeowners should not purchase flood insurance for the structure, as they have no insurable interest in the structure. Homeowners can purchase flood eontents coverage, but they should be aware of the probable high deductible.





### Gone with the wind

It fell with a loud thump. The 35-year-old pine tree gave in to the pressure of the wind and broke in two, landing on the roof of my Village 4 home, but causing no damage to the structure.


In less than an hour, the arborists — or tree crew - had cut down the broken and weakened branches and cleared the debris from the building.

Two days later, there was nothing left but a flat, round, brown patch of ground after the tree crew gouged out the 36-inch diameter stump and filled the hole with soil.

That tree had resisted the constant pressure of the wind for 35 years. It had received several trims and tweaks during its lifetime while growing more than 50 feet tall and providing my roof with shade and protection from hot summer blasts.

I liked that tree, even though, thanks to the wind, I had to regularly sweep pine needles and the yellow catkins it produced in the Spring from my driveway.

Originally there were six pine trees in the green space around my house. Now there is only one left. Like most of the mature trees along Leisure Village Drive West, the survivor is bent toward the East, away from the relentless wind. Some people might call it "artistic," I think it is handsome, and I hope it is resistant to that force of nature, the wind. which is also our gift, as well as the legacy of trees.



The expansion of recycled water use, a slightly above-average rainy season and our customers' conscientious water conservation efforts all contributed to achieving the required 15 percent allocation reduction mandated by the Metropolitan Water District.

### Imported water allocations continue


Despite a wetter rainy season this year, the supply of imported water will continue

to be restricted. Regulations on pumping in the Sacramento Delta have a greater influence than precipitation on the flow of water to Southern California.

"I cannot over-emphasize the need for area water users to maintain vigilance in their water consumption," said Eric Bergh, the acting general manager of the Calleguas Municipal Water District.



that complex is \$6,000 a month. Is the building suitable for solar panels that transform sun power into electricity for a fraction of the cost? A representative of a solar design company recently told the committee that it is and presented information about government incentives and rebates that could pay for most of the installation. Villagers asked questions about how much a system would cost, what it would look like and how long it would last.

Inspiration for the Clean Energy Committee came from the successful reclaimed water project that transformed the Village's irrigation system into an awardwinning environmental model. Also led by Bob Ellis, that process from investigation to approval and installation took years. It made Leisure Village a leader in California water conservation and has already

dramatically cut costs.

"Clean energy also could bring value to the Village," says committee Continued from 1 member and retired engineer Frank Seiden. "But no decisions can be made until all options - including wind and biomass — are explored."

Villager Ross Edmonds, who retired from GTE, adds, "I don't have a sense of urgency. I want to be sure we make the right choices at the right time for the right reasons."

Companies with expertise in all forms of clean energy production are last tourist trip allowed into Cuba being invited to make presentations to the committee. 

The Assigned topic for the July meeting was Candid Camera. The winners were: first place, Betty


Murray; second place, Marlene Votion; third place, Margaret Peterson. Honorable Mentions were awarded to Don Treadwell and John Mayer.


