Recycling project is cooking over at plant operations

Recycling can pay off big. A recent R-113 freon recycling project initiated on campus by Dave Cowden, engineering manager, saved over \$16,500.

R-113 refrigerant will no longer be produced after 1995, but it is needed for the chiller that services the Library and Warren Hall. Long range planning is addressing the feasibility of replacing this unit, but until then, the Engineering Department needs to save as much R-113 as possible. Over the last few years, the chiller has generated ten-30 gallon drums of refrigerant and oil mixture. Cowden investigated the possibility of recycling the substance by heating the mixture and distilling the freon.

In addition to the \$16,500 that would have been required to purchase unused R-113, the campus would have paid over \$5,000 to dispose of the unrecycled waste substance through a hazardous waste hauler. This latter savings was offset by the cost of recycling which was \$4,860.

Internship program gets to the heart of its participants

Pizza with pesto, cilantro, roasted red onions and smoked chicken or capellini with tomatoes, garlic and basil—this is a sample of the heart healthy cuisine Linda Kijanka, a Cal State Hayward intern, has put together for "Heart of Montclair Restaurant Walk," a benefit for the American Heart Association.

Kijanka is one of eleven interns who participated in the Community Scholarship Program created by an anonymous foundation through Cooperative Education. Each student received a \$1,400 scholarship for working in non-profit community organizations during the summer.

She recruited seventeen restaurants to participate in the walk, which operates much like a progressive dinner with each restaurant offering a dish, drink or dessert. Tickets are \$20 and come with a passbook imprinted with the Walk logo, a map and a page for each restaurant. (They can be purchased by calling 510-632-9606).

"There was so much to do.... I was out in the field a lot, pounding the pavement, checking out menus, recruiting volunteers, recruiting restaurants, designing the tickets and fliers, learning how to use the computer, selling the walk, getting people excited about it, writing news releases, and writing copy for food news hours,"

University creates information center in downtown Oakland

Open house on October 14

The distance between Oakland and Hayward just got shorter. CSUH has opened an information center at 505 14th Street in the Oakland City Center. It is open weekdays 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and is designed to give Oakland residents and individuals working downtown a head start on enrolling at the University.

Individuals in the area "who can't get to Hayward during regular office hours can stop by the information center and take care of some of the paperwork before they even set foot on campus," says President Rees.

The public is invited to an open house on October 14 from noon until 3 p.m. featuring the CSUH jazz band, a Tae Kwon Do demonstration, a desert bar and information booths on financial aid, career development, student life, admissions and housing.

Mack Lovett, Associate Vice President, Instructional Services, who helped create the center, says it would not have been possible without the help of the City of Oakland. "Mayor Elihu Harris, who is a CSUH alum, made it possible for the University to have a presence in Oakland. The Information Center marks a new era of cooperation between the city of Oakland and CSUH."

At a reception in September each intern discussed his or her placement. The interns were clearly impressed by their experiences and for some it has changed their career goals.

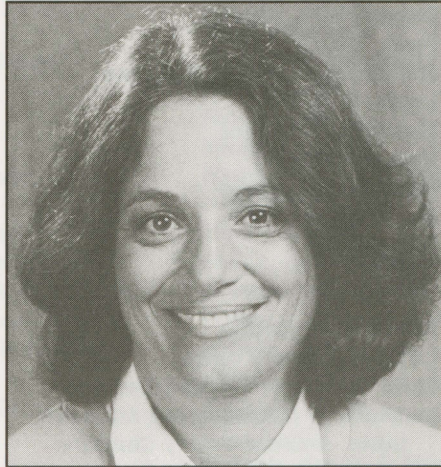

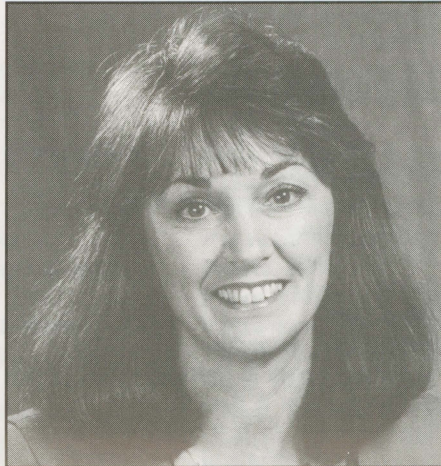

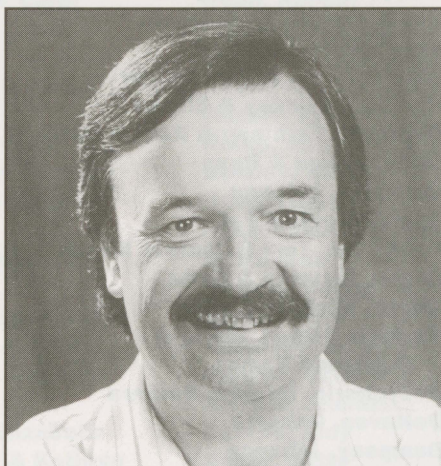
