Civility Work Group: time certain

Last year a student had hate speech written on their door. Mo and trumane created a program about civility and language towards higher ethical standards. If you are a Seawolf you will conduct yourself with integrity, respect, excellence and responsibility. Kicked this off with student leaders and peer mentors. They watched the training video. They had speakers on this topic at the student welcome. Students also learned where to report hate and violence.

Duane: Athletic council. Attendance policy

Ron Lopez read the policy aloud.

Duane: student athletes are not favored by the policy. The function of the policy is to help not favor students. Sometimes this policy misunderstood and not clear but this happens and is not intended.

Duane recaps the policy: Attendance is important. But there are legitimate reasons to miss class. Athletics is not just an officially approved activity it is a sponsored one. Athletics attracts students to the school so we need them. Absences are not excused, they are meant to be worked with. When there is conflict, there is a grievance process but this is hardly ever used. Some activities cannot be made up. If that lowers your grade it lowers your grade. Students must notify and request absences. They typically know of these in advance. Instructors are responsible for providing a clear statement on their syllabus for accommodating make ups if possible.

This issue of the policy is that one thing is listed as the campus policy and another is written in the catalogue- they are not the same.

Continued the conversation of the the Seawolf Integrity, excellence, respect and responsibility.

Scholarship - Ann not here, did it last year, not sure of this year.

Athletic council did not meet yet.

ATI- sandy explained ATI and then a discussion followed about services on campus and also students with autism. Possible trainings should be developed for staff and faculty.

Alcohol and Drugs- no report
