Excellence at the CSU Media Arts Festival

CSUCI Art students have earned top honors and had outstanding success at the CSU Media Arts Festival which is sponsored by the CSU Chancellor's Office. CSUCI has competed with the other 22 CSU campuses and have consistently been nominated and won awards every year. In the Fall of 2004 CSUCI students garnered more nominations and won more 1st place honors than any other university in the statewide CSU system.

In Fall of 2005, CSUCI web design and multimedia students swept the Interactive Media category with 3 wins with their Flash-animated websites. CSUCI student Chris Paterson has won 1st place and the prestigious Rosebud award 2 years in a row. This talented art student has graduated and presently works as a Flash designer and animator at Disney on-line Interactive.

About the Media Arts Festival

The Media Arts Festival was established in 1991 to give talented students studying film, video, and interactive media within the 23-campus California State University system an opportunity to present their work for critical review. The Media Arts Festival expanded its mission to include helping students of the CSU bridge the gap between student and working professional. The Festival which is held on the campus of CSUCI, includes three days of seminars and events geared to helping students of the CSU become better prepared to work in the entertainment, web, multimedia and interactive media and film industries. Industry sponsors include Dreamworks, Warner Bros. Studios, Walt Disney Studios, the International Cinematographers Guild, the Entertainment Industry Development Corporation, Modern Videofilm, and Sony Pictures Imageworks.

Two First Place Wins In 2006

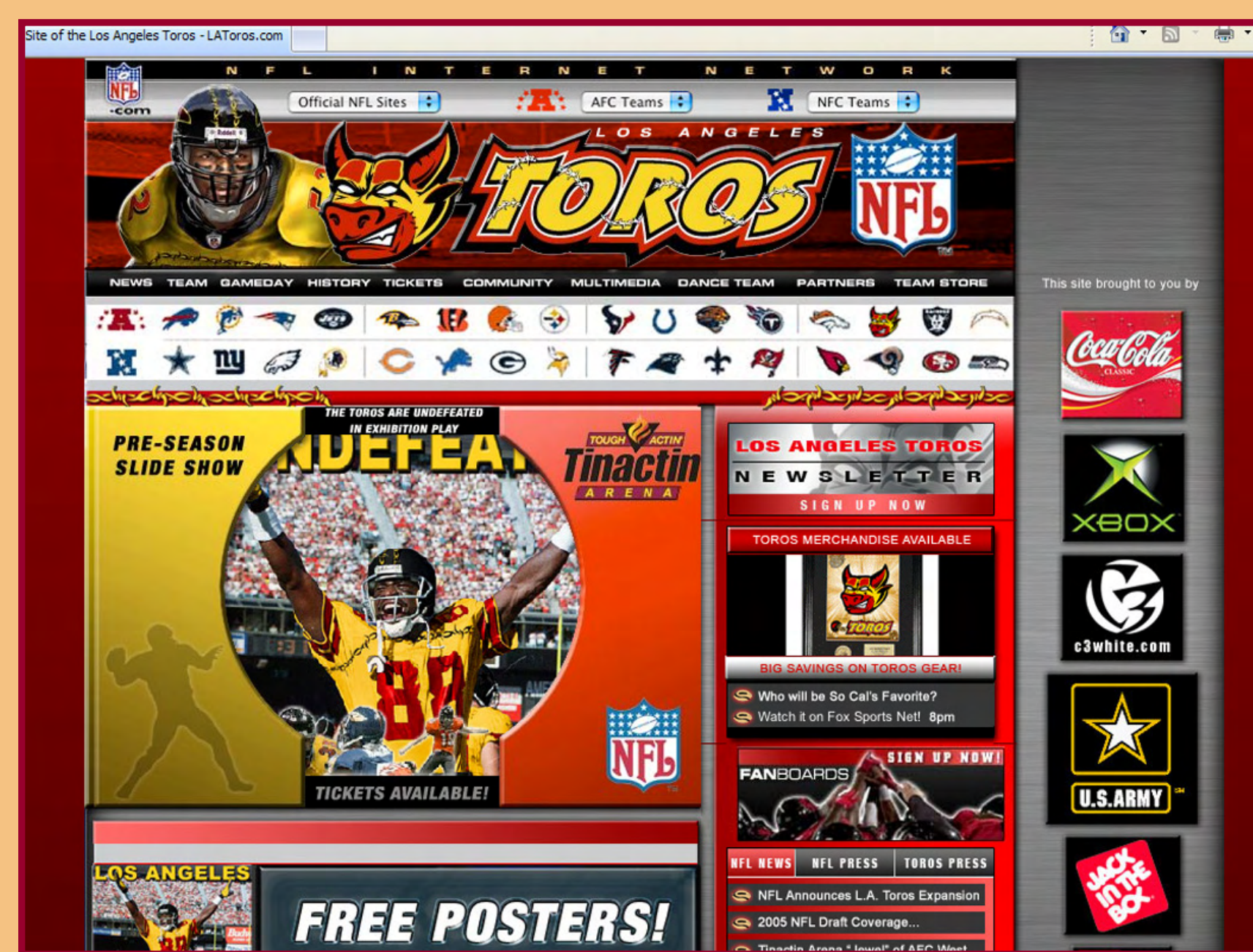

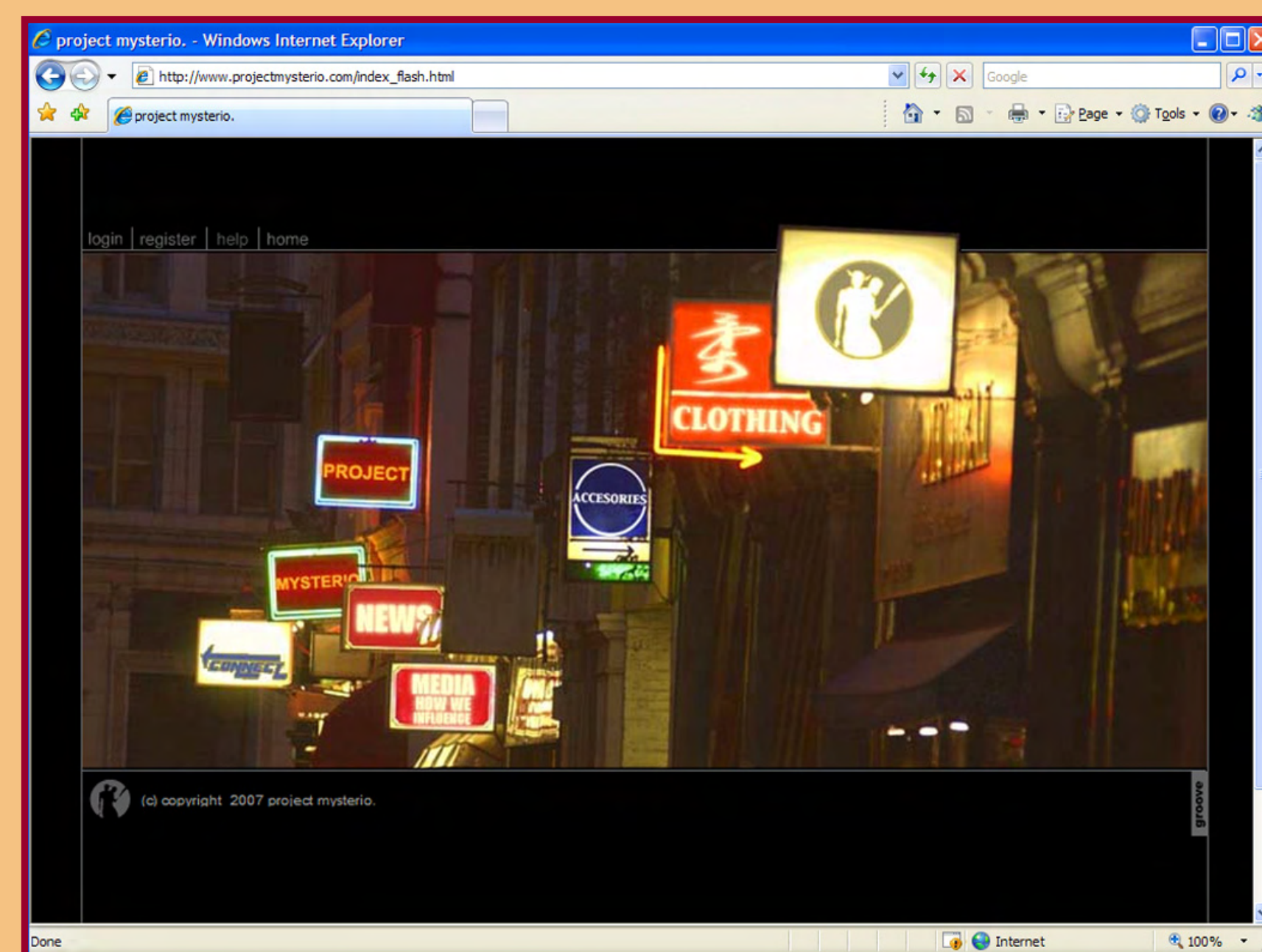
2006 1st place Rosebud Award winners with Asst. Professor Liz King
