TO THE WORKING MEDIA . . .

Here is your copy of the 1980 CS Fullerton Football Media Guide, which we hope will supply you with the basic information needed in your coverage of this season's Titan football squad. It is our pleasure to welcome you again to games and practice sessions.

All requests for press, photo and broadcast credentials should be made to the Sports Information Department at least one week in advance. Passes will be mailed out if time permits or will be left at Will Call, which is located at the west side of Titan Field.

Each holder of an official press pass will be assigned a specific, labeled space in the press box and will be entitled to the full courtesies and complete service of the press row.

You will be furnished with a complete press packet before each game. Included will be a program, lineups, game notes and cumulative statistics. A running play-by-play account of all games will be distributed following each half along with quickie team and individual stats at the half. The final game packet will include a complete team and individual statistics and running play-by-play.

Spotters are available if requested well in advance and must be paid by those requesting this service.

Radio broadcast permission should be obtained in advance from the Sports Information Director. Arrangements for installation of broadcast loops should be made well in advance with Joseph Dusbabek, (714) 773-2421.

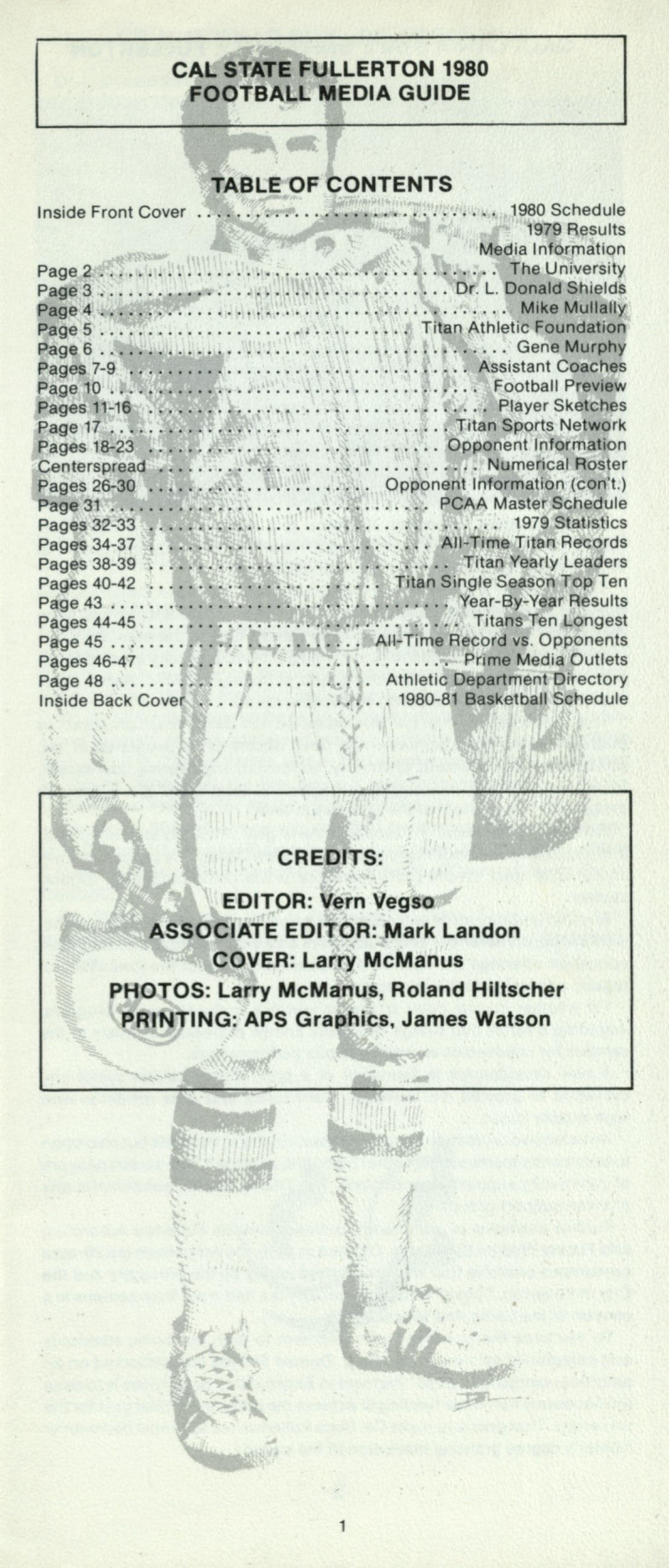

CAL STATE FULLERTON 1980 FOOTBALL MEDIA GUIDE

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CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON



California State University, Fullerton is a relatively young institution, having opened only two decades ago. However, it already has grown to 22,500 students and achieved national distinction.

The university's students come primarily from Southern California with many from other states and other nations. Most students commute each day to and from classes; many come to classes only in the evening.

Drawn from throughout the world, the 750-member faculty is noted for its commitment to effective teaching and scholarly activity. Research is actively pursued, typically with students involved.

The university enjoys full accreditation for its over-all program. In addition, national recognition has been accorded to programs in art, athletic training, business, chemistry, education, engineering, journalism, music, speech and hearing, and theater. All total there are 80 degree programs — 38 of them at the graduation level.

Reinforcing classroom instruction is the largest university level internship and cooperative education program on the West Coast. The program allows students to gain on-the-job experience while continuing their regular studies.

Another amenity is the extended education program. It provides classes, workshops, conferences and study tours on a year-round basis. Extended education offerings are open to the community without the formalities of regular admission to the university.

Yet another strong point is the university's cultural events program, including a series that brings nationally known professional artists to the campus for residencies as well as public performances.

A new development is formation of a professional caliber symphony orchestra to provide the university community and area residents with high-quality music.

An extensive recreation program aimed chiefly at students but also open to community members is another highlight, as is the 8,000-person network of community support organizations. The Titan Athletic Foundation is one of these support groups.

Further examples of community outreach are the Fullerton Arboretum and Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary. Opened in 1979, the Arboretum is a 25-acre on-campus preserve that was established jointly by the university and the City of Fullerton. Tucker Wildlife Sanctuary is a half-hour from campus in a canyon of the Santa Ana Mountains.

To reinforce the university's commitment to high academic standards and community service, President L. Donald Shields has embarked on an ambitious campaign called "Partners in Excellence." Its purpose is to raise the necessary non-state funding to achieve the president's chief goal for the university. That goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the foremost bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation.

DR. L. DONALD SHIELDS, PRESIDENT

Dr. L. Donald Shields became president of California State University, Fullerton in 1971. At the time he was 34, making him the youngest chief executive of a major state university in the nation.

Dr. Shields, who this year completed a six-year term as a member of the National Science Board, is the only person from the western United States currently serving on the National Commission for Cooperative Education.

Among his many other distinctions, Dr. Shields in May 1980 received the Distinguished Honor Scroll Award of the American Institute of Chemists. The award honored him for outstanding national leadership in science and education and for major contributions to the field of chemistry.

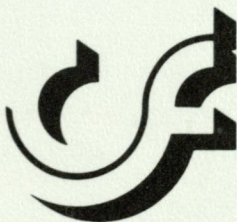
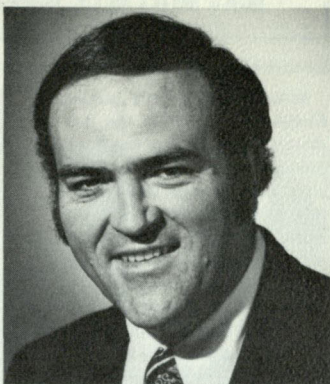
Dr. Shields received his undergraduate education at University of California, Riverside, then went on to earn his Ph.D. in chemistry from UCLA.

Dr. Shields joined the Cal State Fullerton faculty in 1963 as an assistant professor of chemistry. He became an associate professor in 1966 and a full professor in 1967. He was elected chair of the Faculty Council in 1967 and later that year became the campus' first vice president for administration. From October 1970 to May 1971, he was acting president of the University.

Dr. Shields has authored three books and numerous articles in professional journals. He had addressed or participated in professional meetings throughout the United States, and in 1967 represented the National Board in Vienna, Austria, at the first biennial international symposium at the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis.

Among Dr. Shields' community activities are having chaired the Disneyland Community Awards Committee, being a trustee of the World Affairs Council of Orange County, and being a director of Orange County Sports Celebrities.

Dr. Shields' foremost goal is to make Cal State Fullerton the most outstanding bachelor's/master's degree granting institution in the nation.



MIKE MULLALLY, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Mike Mullally, who guided Eastern Illinois from the doldrums to the forefront of intercollegiate athletics at the Division II level the past years, is the new director of athletics at Cal State Fullerton. He replaces Neale Stoner, who is now director of athletics at Illinois.



Mullally became athletic director at Eastern Illinois in August 1974, when the Charleston institution's programs were in disarray. In five of the following six years, Eastern Illinois had the nation's most outstanding Division II program, as

determined by polls conducted by University of California, Davis, among others.

In 1978 the Panther men won the national championship in football, made their fifth straight trip to the NCAA basketball tournament, finished second in wrestling and third in soccer.

The Panthers won the national championship in cross country in 1977 and the track title in 1974. They also compete in baseball (fifth in 1978), swimming (third in 1975), tennis and golf.

Before joining Eastern Illinois, Mullally served eight years at University of Oklahoma.

In 1973-74 he coordinated a stadium expansion project that raised \$4.7 million to add a 9,600 seat deck to Memorial Stadium, while in 1971-72 he coordinated a campaign that raised \$2.2 million needed to complete a \$6.1 million, 11,250-seat multipurpose arena.

While at Oklahoma, he also was a regional director for the Alumni Association (1973); assistant to the vice president for development and director of foundation and governmental support (1971-73); director of special student programs and assistant to the vice president for the university community (1970-71); director of residential programs — Greek housing (1969-70); and a graduate teaching and research assistant (1966-69).

He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees at University of South Dakota with the undergraduate work in political science and the graduate work in history. In addition he has taken doctoral studies in history at Oklahoma.

He is 41, married (Carole) and the father of three (Heidi, Edward and Matthew). They reside in Fullerton.

The Titan Athletic Foundation is a non-profit organization with the express purpose of aiding the athletic program at Cal State Fullerton. It is a group of individuals, not necessarily alumni, who have a genuine interest in athletics and the University.

It is community involvement for some, business involvement for others, or simply an interest in a fine sports program that has attained national recognition and respect the past few years.

The foundation supports the athletic program by providing funds for scholarships and grants-in-aid which insure an effective recruiting program that attracts the best student-athletics available.

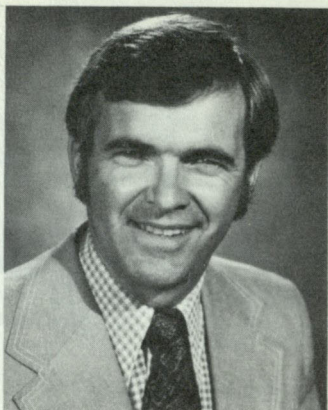
The Titan Athletic Foundation was founded in January 1973, and is the University's official athletic booster organization. In the TAF's first year approximately \$30,000 was raised and 150 members enlisted. Just seven years later the TAF raised over three hundred thousand dollars and has a membership of about a thousand.

Fullerton businessman Pierre Nicolas was the TAF's first president and was succeeded by Don Karcher, executive vice-president of Karcher Enterprises. Buck Johns, President of California Climate Control, became the TAF's third president in the summer of 1978.

GENE MURPHY, TITAN HEAD FOOTBALL COACH

Gene Murphy, who led the University of North Dakota to a 10-2 record and a number three national ranking among Division II teams during the 1979 season is Cal State Fullerton's new head football coach. He replaced Jim Colletto following the 1979 season, and is the fourth head football coach in the 10-year history of the sport at Cal State Fullerton.

Murphy, 41, compiled a two-year record of 15-7 at North Dakota. Last season the Sioux won the North Central Conference championship and advanced to the NCAA Division II playoffs. Murphy was named conference coach-of-the-year for his efforts.



Eugene V. Murphy was born August 6, 1939 in Jersey City, N.J. Following an all-sports prep career at St. Peter's High School (New Brunswick, N.J.), Murphy was recruited to the University of Minnesota. He earned all-state honors in football and baseball at St. Peter's.

He transferred from University of Minnesota to North Dakota in 1959, and in 1962 was an All-North Central Conference quarterback for the Sioux.

Following his graduation from North Dakota (in 1963, with a degree in social studies and physical education), Murphy began his coaching career as a graduate assistant for the Sioux.

In 1964 he coached football, baseball and swimming at North St. Paul (Minn.) High School.

He returned to his alma mater in 1966 as the offensive coordinator, a position he held until 1978 when he took over the reins of the North Dakota program.

In 11 years as an assistant at North Dakota, the Sioux won six conference championships and participated in three post-season bowl games (1966, 1972 and 1975).

Murphy also spent five summers (1967-71) as an assistant coach with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League.

He earned his Master's degree in secondary administration from North Dakota in 1977.

Murphy married the former Kathy Fischer, Sept. 25, 1964. They have two sons, Tim (13) and Michael (10). They reside in Anaheim.

1980 CAL STATE FULLERTON FOOTBALL PREVIEW

A new era begins this season at Cal State Fullerton, with Gene Murphy beginning his first season as the Titans' head coach. Murphy led North Dakota to the Division II playoffs in 1979. He replaced Jim Colletto, who guided CSF for five years.

What Murphy inherits is 28 of the Titans' top 44 players off last season's 3-8 team (later adjusted to 5-6 when San Jose State and Fresno State had to forfeit wins to CSF), including 11 starters (four on offense and seven on defense).

"I feel strongly that the nucleus of a good football team is here," says the first-year head coach. "Getting started late in recruiting didn't help our situation, but we were able to bring in some players who'll provide depth."

The key to the Titans' offensive fortunes appears to be the quarterback position. Murphy does not have a single experienced QB with which to run his Pro-Set offense, which, he says, will emphasize passing. He recruited three junior college (Ken Fuller, Bill Myatt and Tom St. Jacques) and one prep (Bob Caffrey) QB in the hope of filling the void.

The running game will be in the hands of seniors John Rayford (396 yards, four TDs) and George Griffin (256 yards, two TDs). Ken Jackson (5-11, 211) also returns. Rayford (5-10, 182) led the team in receiving with 21 catches last year. Griffin (5-9, 162) caught eight passes. Returning All-Conference center Harris Burnett (6-3, 251, junior) anchors the offensive line.

Defensively, the Titans will rely on a trio of All-PCAA players; middle guard Richard Aguilar (5-11, 229), safety Bobby Kemp (5-11½, 177) and linebacker John Bungartz (6-3½, 213). All will be seniors. Aguilar led the Titans in tackles and quarterback sacks, while Kemp intercepted five passes. Bungartz sat out last year with a dislocated elbow after earning All-PCAA honors in 1978. Doug Boswell, returning strong safety (6-0, 193, senior), gives the Titans a veteran defensive backfield. The DBs figure to be the strength of CSF's squad, especially when redshirt transfer Richard Terry (6-1½, 204), a starter at University of California two years ago, is added.

Murphy, despite the late recruiting start, was able to attract 30 recruits to CSF, including a pair of All-CIF prep stars — quarterback Bob Caffrey (Loara High School, Anaheim) and running back Bob Reynolds (Cabrillo High School, Lompoc). Caffrey (6-0, 170) passed for 1,963 yards and 32 touchdowns, hitting 145 of 261 passes (55.6%) last year at Loara High School. Reynolds (5-9, 180) rushed for 1,880 yards and scored 20 TDs last season at Cabrillo High School.
