In talking with a client recently, it was her understanding that federal tax law allows a seller of a primary residence an exemption from capital gains tax up to \$250,000 for a single person and up to \$500,000 for a married couple. She asked a very astute question, "What is the exemption amount if one of the spouses passes away?"

I posed that same question to a certified public accountant. The explanation to me is that if the home was the couple's primary residence — and depending too on how title is held — then the appraised value of the property at the time of death

becomes the cost basis for the home. So, if it is appraised for \$500,000, then there would be no capital gains tax to the remaining spouse. The same is true if it is appraised for \$1 million — no capital gains!

That information was quite important to my client in the continuation of her estate planning.

I am confident that there are limits and restrictions to these provisions of the Internal Revenue Service code, and you should always consult with your qualifed CPA and/or attorney before making personal estate planning decisions.

How to get the tax rebate

Seniors need to be aware that those who would not normally have to file a tax return need to fill out only a couple of lines on their tax return for 2007 to get their rebate checks under the economic stimulus package signed into law a few weeks ago.

Those receiving Social Security and/or veterans' benefits need to file form 1040 or 1040A to note only their names, addresses, Social Security numbers and the amount of that income on line 20a of Form 1040 and 1040A. Low-income filers may be able to use Form 1040EZ to simply note that they earned income of at least \$3,000.

Low-income and moderate-income taxpayers can get help from VITA, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance, at (800) 906-9887. Filers who are 60 or older can call AARP Tax-Aid program at (888) 227-7669.







More about bionic teeth — dental implants

By Dr. Saj Jivraj, DDS Second in a series

What can go wrong with dental implants?

There are really not too many things that can go wrong with dental implants. They can fail to integrate into the bone and come out. They can fracture and break. There can be problems with the connection between the implant and the prosthesis. There can be an infection or an inflammatory condition in the soft tissue and sometimes in the bone as a result of the implant placement. There can be damage to the nerves in the lower jaw, and there can be damage to the maxillary sinus or

the nasal cavity.

All of these complications are rare and usually account for less than 5 percent of all dental implant treatments. These complications can usually be easily corrected.

Whom should you see?

Before implants, you went to either your general dentist or, if you wanted a specialist, to a prosthodontist. It's the same today.

If you want to replace missing teeth, talk to the people who do that job and they will be glad to discuss the use of dental implants in that process. If you decide that dental implants are for you, then your general dentist or

prosthodontist will refer you to a qualified surgeon, usually either an oral surgeon or a periodontist, for that phase of treatment.

How long after a dental implant is placed can it be used to anchor my new teeth?

The original protocol states that we must wait three months in the lower jaw and six months in the upper jaw before we can begin to construct the new dental prosthesis that will be supported by the implants. In recent years, however, there has been a movement to sort of speed up this process.

Earnest was employed by John Hancock, who owned several thousand acres in the La Brea Tar Pits area. Earnest managed 300 acres planted with barley and oats hay.

At age 14, Mary started driving her parents' Model-T Ford. In her 20s, she upgraded to a Model-A.

Mary's higher education began at UCLA in 1929, and in 1933 she was a member of UCLA's first graduation class. Her degree was in home economics and education. She taught fourth through sixth grade in Castaic, Torrance and West Los Angeles. Retiring in 1972, she received an Outstanding Elementary Teacher of America certificate.

During school summers and after retiring, Mary traveled to many countries; England, to visit family; Africa; Egypt; France; Switzerland; Italy; Norway; Sweden; Finland; Tokyo; and Hong Kong, all of which added to a very well-rounded life.

During World War II, Mary was a very active member of AWVS, American Women's Volunteer Services. In the '50s, Mary's family moved from Los Angeles to Oxnard.

Mary's activities included the Women's Club, Garden and Golf Clubs.

Sing-a-long Group






