

Continued from February 5th Edition AGRICULTURE AND LABOR POLITICS

Dr. Ernesto Galarza from San Jose, who recently published a book entitled, "Merchants of Labor," indicated that we should waste no time and get down to business.

Question No. 1

Would the Governor create an Administrative agency with personnel of Mexican-American descent to represent and serve farm workers?

Answer: YES.

Governor Brown stated that his overall policy has been to employ domestic workers and has done nothing to renew the Bracero Act. His goal is to have every American employed in the state, and that this position be taken into consideration by Albert B. Tieburg, Director of Employment, who stated that all newspapers have consistently criticized him for refusal to renew the Bracero Act. He let it be known to our committee that if we recruited workers, that the workers would be employed.

Question No. 2

Would Governor Brown instruct on the basis of equality in employment?

Answer: YES.

Question No. 3

Would the Governor appoint a representative of Mexican American descent to an advisory committee to represent the Mexican American in labor employment?

Answer: YES.

Question No. 4

We, the Mexican American people requested someone who would loyally represent the Mexican American and support favorable legislation.

Governor Brown advised us to bring this request before Mr. Pitts. Dr. Ernesto Galarza then strongly retaliated that Mr. Pitts would not speak to our group.

No answer was given to the question.

Question No. 5

Would the Governor terminate the policies regarding the state law with regard to reporting labor conditions? Dr. Galarza stated that we have no objections personally to this policy, for it has been in operation for the past 20 years. Dr. Galarza received his answer from Governor Brown, which was satisfactory, and stated that a great historical problem had been solved.

Mr. Rodriguez stated that the Mexican-American people were seriously concerned about employment and offered his assistance in

eliminating the problem.

Mr. Edward Quevedo clearly stated that he represents a large percentage of Mexican-Americans and in his position as State Chairman of MAPA, and a TV Commentator, he must openly expose this problem to the public. Question No. 1

What have you, the Governor, done about placing Spanish speaking people on the staff?

Governor Brown stated that this problem would be considered by the Department of Employment. It was also recognized that the Negro American now surpasses the Mexican-American in skilled jobs. The question was also brought up as to why this problem had not been solved earlier. The Governor answered it was simply because this problem was never under pressure. Our leaders also inquired why jobless Mexican Americans from Arizona and New Mexico were not employed instead of importing braceros from Mexico. Mr. Al Tieberg, Director of Employment Department, stated this would endanger California Flood labor supply.

(Governor Brown disagreed with this and agreed with our leader. (Answer YES).

EDUCATION

Dr. Arturo Cabrera, holding a degree in teaching at San Jose State College, was concerned with the large number of youth dropouts among our Mexican American youth.

What can you, the Governor, do to aid the Mexican American youth in grasping learning techniques so he will be able to compete with the Anglo youth? Governor Brown replied -- you find the answer and we will do all we possibly can to help.

We requested a Mexican American representative to be appointed to the State Education Board. Answer: YES.
