





It is amazing to find that there still exist some of the strangest concepts toward the Mexican American among a minority of his fellow Americans. I'm speaking of both those with rudimentary education and those with a college background.

For instance, after the last Fiestas Patrias celebrations, in the course of discussions about various topics with well educated acquaintances, I was pointedly asked why 1) Mexican Americans pledged allegiance to Mexico instead of or together with allegiance to the United States, 2) why Mexican Americans stand and salute the Mexican Flag, 3) why we call ourselves as we do instead of American-Mexicans, and 4) why the Mexican National Anthem is played first at our functions rather than follow the Star Spangled Banner.

These unreasonable questions struck me like a ton of bricks especially when I found others to partially believe them. As best I could I informed them that it appeared that perhaps unconsciously they tended to group all Mexicans together forgetting that one is the emigrant or visiting worker, in many cases still rightfully faithful to their homeland, and the other is the US citizen by birth or naturalized - of Mexican descent who should not have to constantly defend his assertion of being an American.

Moreover: 1) strange as it may sound no subversive activity exists and all Mexican Americans pledge allegiance only to their country, the USA, 2) we stand and salute the Mexican flag out of respect alike as everyone else does to other foreign flags upon presentation during special occasions. 3) The Mexican National Anthem is played generally last although tradition observed at parades, fights, and civic functions permit foreign anthems to be played first, and 4) in our designation as Mexican Americans we differ nonewhatsoever as to other minority group names and feel no need to reverse the word-

ing. Furthermore, it is a name that was put upon us and which we appear to have accepted defensively. I would just as soon prefer to hear us proudly call ourselves Mexicans as we have no need to be ashamed, retreatful and defensive of our Mexican culture, heritage, and past. And the sooner we realize it, the sooner the rest of the community will accept it!!!

NEW COLLEGE GROUP FORMED - "SI"

A group of dynamic students headed by Armando Valdez have created a new collegiate action organization for the purpose of serving and being at the disposal of the community. This organization is called SI with the accent on "student initiative". It is presently in the process of incorporation at SJ State and SJCC with a view towards further expansion at other area colleges.

Composed of fulltime and part time students, SI is an autonomous coalition of young people who feel a strong concern for the problems of the local Spanish-speaking community. Aware of the low income rate, high unemployment and the low educational standard among the Mexican Americans and that there are many groups working on various programs in the area, SI believes it can provide the spearhead for an active approach to coordinating many efforts in the same direction at the same time.

"LORD JIM" FILM REVIEW

"The last thing a person has to fight for is his honor. One does not fight with as much ego for his material things as one does to restore personal integrity."

Upon this line of thought Joseph Conrad's novel and Richard Brooks film are based. Brooks adapted the novel for film use and directed it also. The film's cast includes:

PETER O'TOCLE - Lord Jim JAMES MASON - Jim Brown CURT JURGENS - Cornelius JACK HAWKINS - Marlow ELI WALLACH - The General DALIAH LAVI - The Girl

LORD JIM opens with a good introductory scene, that of a ship on the sea which is about to go down. The scene serves its purpose -- to attract the public's attention. But, then we hear a voice, a narration. Immediately a large percentage of the interest is lost. With the narration part of it we lose a very important scene. The spectator still thinking on the narration, loses the part which establishes JIM (Peter O' Toole) as a coward. From then on, the conflict isn't as great on the first fight for integrity - when he saves a ship from exploding. But even then we find that Jim's heroic action isn't heroic. He stayed on the boat because of the people's opinion. The people who were ready to brand him as a coward or as a hero.

Surely enough he wins the first battle, but it is not a great victory. For the enemy (the people) could only condemn him with their own moral law, or with their tongue.

There is another chance that comes to young Jim - he has the opportunity of saving the native indians of a certain village

who have been enslaved by a certain general (Eli Wallach). On and on goes the film. By this time the audience is wondering if the film is ever going to end. Jim gives the natives their freedom and as a result wins the title of Lord. This marks the climax in Jims struggling life. After this--downfall. He is fooled by a certain gentleman (played by James Brown) and as a result the chieftain's son is killed. This, he has to pay. According to the native's religious code of ethics, Jim must be killed. So he is killed. To the surprise of the audience, the girl who loves Jim smiles while he is being executioned. According to their religion it was good to die in that manner.



Only two people do exceptional in this film - PETER O'TOOLE and Frederick Young (director of photography).

Director Brooks is in the same category as Joseph Mankeweicz (Cleopatra). They seem to think that the screen is a page of paper.
