1. The bulletin is intended as informational for student, faculty and staff and is not a newspaper. It is a vehicle for announcements and communication for the entire campus.
2. The bulletin will be assembled, edited, and published by the President's Office under the coordination of Sid Sheffield with assistance when needed by selected representatives from all segments of the College community.
3. This will be a weekly publication with items submitted by Tuesday at 5:00 p.m., printed Wednesday afternoon, and distributed Thursday morning. The bulletin will be distributed at the Student Services information desk, the cafeteria, *the book store*, faculty and staff mail boxes and/or departments, and other appropriate places.
4. Bulletin items will be collected at the Student Services information desk, the Information Window in Academic Administration, and the President's Office.
5. A form is available to facilitate wording of announcements and may be picked up at the three information collection areas.
6. Possible areas to be included are professional activities, meetings, formation of groups, publications, speakers and programs, and accolades.
7. The publication is not designed to include a want ad section.

PROFESSIONAL ACTIVITIES

Dr. Patsy Sampson, Associate Professor of Psychology, recently presented a paper at a Symposium - Trend in Pineal Research - sponsored by the Foundation for Medical Research in Boston, Mass. Dr. Sampson's study, The Pineal and Behavior in Rats, is part of an overall research project to study the role of the pineal gland in schizophrenia. As an interesting footnote, the day after the close of the symposium, one of the participants, Dr. Julius Axelrod, was announced the winner of the Nobel Prize for medicine.

Rodolpho Serrano, Assistant Professor of Education, attended the Southern Cooperative Education Laboratory, in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Selected institutions were invited to hear the presentations of the Oral Language Program, which deals with the teaching of English to mono-lingual persons.

Dr. Howard Zimmerman, Professor of Education, gave a talk on "Teacher Training for the Seventies" to the Kern Unit of the California Elementary School Administrators Association.
