

RAMON NOVARRO CONTINUED...

Then in 1949 RKO released The in England in 1928, was rewarded Big Steal, revealing a droopy-eved Robert Mitchum, a token leading idol. lady in Jane Greer and a very familiar face behind a desk as a Mexican police chief who wasn't nearly as dumb as those Americans gave him credit for. It was Ramon's final major contribution to motion pictures and he was excellent in the part.

He looked older but there was no getting away from the old charm. Inactivity had made him camera-conscious but it was a subtle little cameo and the former star enjoyed himself in the role while publicly lamenting that "The glamour is gone. Now all

the stare are alike.

Age had not staled nor custom withered that infinate charm which had made Ramon Novarro an authentic Hollywood great. Like so many of his fellow thespians Novarro was a larger-thanlife image in an era when the moviegoing public wanted their pictorial legends on a higher celestial plane than themselves.

Novarro was intensely proud of his silent screen heritage. He loved the universal adoration. The Ramon Novarro League, formed

by visits from its spruce little

"I visit those loval ladies every time I go to Europe." His eyes crinkled. "Difference now is that when they swoon over me-somebody has to help them up!"

Appearances on television in Dr. Kildare, High Chapparal and Bonanza kept that handsome Mexican face in the public eye. A whole new career was in the

offing.

Encouraged by this unsurge in his sagging fortunes, Novarro embarked upon a new venture. He would write his autobiography. By the end of October 1968 "From Ben Hur to Bonanza" was developing on schedule. But by Halloween Eve it didn't matter anymore. At least, not to Ramon Novarro.

Paul Robert Ferguson (23) and his brother Thomas Scott Ferguson (17) were new arrivals in California, Paul, with three tenous marriages in his tacky background, had blazed the trail from the Chicago suburb of Round Lake five months earlier, to be followed shortly by young Tom. The pair made Novarro's ac-



quaintance with the express intention of relieving the 69 year-old screen luminary of \$5,000 which, they'd learned from other pennyante hustrlers of their own stamp, was stashed in a safe behind one of the numerous paintings adorning the walls of Novarro's den. The house itself, a \$150,000 Spanish-style mansion amid the verdant luxuriance of Canyon, was a refuge to which the reclusive actor had withdrawn some years before. He never married.

Novarro, cultured, gentle and courtly, was sufficiently motivated to invite the two young primitives into his home on the night of October 30, 1968.

With their collective feet under the table, the Fergusons lost no time. Primed with generous quantities of their host's ample liquor stock, they began their quest for

the money.

At 8:30 on the morning of Halloween the semi-retired actor's secretary Edward Weber found the battered, nude body face up on a bed, hands bound with electrical cord. The killers had ransacked the place in a voracious frenzy, but all they'd got was \$45 from Novarro's weekly unemployment compenstaion payment.

During police investigations the Ferguson's name came up in conversation and the brothers were arrested one week later. Predictably, each accused the

other of the slaving.

The Fergusons were indicted and the trial set for July 28, 1969.

One week before the trial opened young Tom "confessed." The younger brother confided to in Pagan Love Song. a fellow denizen of the city jail that he alone was responsible for Mr. Leslie Stuart Carter the death of Novarro. "Paul didn't 1247 Driftwood Pl., Brea, CA know anything about it," he (714) 529-8285



claimed. "He had passed out in

the living room."

But Tom's assumption of guilt was short lived. He admitted that the whole ploy was suggested by Paul as far back as the night of the murder. The idea was that Tom, technically a minor, faced a mere short term as a juvenile offender while poor old Paul was a candidate for the gas chamber.

The trial lasted seven weeks. A jury of seven men and five women deliberated less than two days. The Fergusons were convicted and each received a life

"Ben Hur" lies in the family plot in windswept Calvary Cemetary, East Los Angeles, next to his parents. His old friend and rival Rudolph Valentino is close by in Hollywood Memorial Park.

Ramon Novarro's resting place is marked by a simple stone set in teh ground, dedicated by his brothers Jose and Eduardo Samaniego. "Beloved brother - Ramon Novarro — 1899-1969." That's all it savs.

Those movie fans who thrilled to Novarro's Ben Hur reel rather let down by the relative obscurity of that Calvary plot. Almost as if they expected to find a chariot there. Or at the very least a piped-

LUIS VALDEZ OF THE SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY



The grape picking season was over and the six members of the Valdez family were stranded in the small San Joaquin Valley town of Stratford. Their pickup truck was broken down and on blocks. The family could not move to the next harvest until the truck was repaired.

A school bus stopped outside their temporary home — a labor camp — so the four children went

to school that fall.

Luis, 6, was given the role of a monkey in the first grade production of "Christmas in the Jungle." He never forgot the pageantry of the play — the elaborate set made with real palm trees, the festive music and his colorful monkey costume, which was in better condition than his own clothes. He rehearsed every day after school.

But the day before the firstgraders' opening night, Luis' father fixed the truck. The family headed for the next harvest and

Luis missed the show.

Luis Valdez never forgot that

first play.

"I spent my childhood trying to make up for missing that Christmas show. And maybe," he says with a shrug, "I'm still trying to make up for it. That longing to participate stayed with me and in a way pushed me to devote my life to the theater."

Valdez's theatrical The play have been realized. Valdez wrote in 1977, Suit," broke attendance records in Los Angeles, played on Broadway and negotiations for film rights are underway. He is the founder and director of an internationally known theater company - El Teatro Campesino. He won an Emmy for a television play and the Teatro received an OBIE award for an off-Broadway production.

The son of migrant workers, and a former resident of one of San Jose's poorest barrios, Valdez, 39, realizes his success was achieved against long odds. But today, as he commutes between San Juan Bautista, his home and the Teatro's base, and negotiations in Los Angeles for the movie rights to "Zoot Suit," he is reluctant to admit self-satisfaction.

"I guess my relatives are impressed — they sure come out of the woodwork in L.A. when "Zoot Suit' was on," he laughs, throwing back his head. Valdez is an animated man and an adept adept storyteller. He frequently punctuates his stories with a jab from his ever present cigar or a

deep laugh.

"There was a big focus on me, but the play was important because it wasn't just me, but in a way all Chicanos who were ac-

cepted."

Valdez was heartened when he saw the audiences at "Zoot Suit." In addition to the Beverly Hills matrons, he says, the crowd was composed of Chicanos from East Los Angeles. Cab drivers and factory workers sat beside those with season boxes.

"For the first time a great number of Chicanos were able to dress up and og downtown to the theater. It introduced an awful lot of people to the theater. And it gave many Chicano actors significant roles. I feel very good about that."

Valdez was born in the San Joaquin Valley and attended school sporadically, in whatever town was closest to the fields his parents worked. When he was in the fifth grade his father moved the family to a labor camp in San Jose and decided to stay through the winter.

"It was a dangerous choice," Valdez says. "Most migrants kept moving, looking for work. But my dad decided there were more opportunities for the kids in San Jose. So he took his chances with year-round farm work in the orchards around San Jose."

The family later moved to a barrio realled Sal Si Puedes "get out if you can"), one of East San Jose's poorest neighborhoods.

Valdez worked on summers and weekends in the prune orchards and bean fields in San Jose. But his parents instilled in the children the importance of education as an escale from Sal Si Puedes.

"I always brought a lot of books home from school, but when I got back to the neighborhood, I had to hide my books or the local



gang, The Blue Velvets, gave me a hard time.

"Some of my teachers at James Lick High School tried to discourage me. They thought it was impractical for a farm worker's kid to want to go to college."

But Valdez earned a Bank of America scholarship and enrolled at San Jose State in 1958.

"I remember sitting in a calculus class at 7:30 in the morning during my first semester and thinking that this is as far away as I can get from the life of the farmwoyker." Valdez has a far away look and smiles faintly. "I was feeling good about being in a warm classroom learning, instead of pruning trees in the cold."

Valdez wrote a one act play in college and won \$75 from the San Jose Theater Guild.

"It was amazing to me to get hard cash for something on paper. For the first time I thought, 'Maybe it's possible . . . maybe I can pull this off."

Before he graduated he wrote a full-length play, "The Shrunken of Pancho Villa." It was performed at San Jose State and opened up several possibilities after graduation.

A WOMAN OUGHT TO KNOW



QUESTION:

I'd like to get involved in politics and perhaps even run for women I'm convinced could bring a more humane perpublic policyspective into making. When did you hear a male candidate campaign for decent day care for children? Who speaks up for more housing, public buses and shelters for battered wives? What are the chances of success for women in politics in the '80's?

Q.M., Santa Rosa

ANSWER:

Better than ever before! All indications point to an increase in women in public office in the next decade. An important gain occurred when the Democratic party recently granted the demand of women party members that half the delegates to the 1980 Democratic presidential convention be women. The climate is changing in the Republican party, too.

Women, especially younger women, are thinking more in terms of issues than of traditional party loyalties and their concerns are humanitarian, a recent Redbook poll of over 4,500 people shows. The highest priority of the women polled was for increased government spending for the elderly and for developing greater self-sufficiency in energy supplies. They wanted less money spent on U.S. national defense and on military and economic aid. Both men and women agreed that a high priority should be to elect more women to Congress. Other priorities were programs for rape victims and battered wives, day care centers, and adequate housing for all.

If you decide to enter public life, you will find new sources of help through a variety of organizations for women. The National Women's Political Caucus, Women in Politics and the Women's Campaign Fund are some of the new organizations formed to provide women candidates training and expertise in campaigning, fund-raising and organization

The issues you have named are winning issues and you should find a lot of across-the-board support from women, and from men,

The Paul Masson Champagne Marathon, now in its eighth running, will field 5,000 runners on Sunday, January 27, 1980, at 7 a.m.

The 26 mile, 385 yard race, which has grown from 210 marathoners in 1972, to 2,500 last January, will be specially honored this year as the site of the 1980 AAU Championship, which will be awarded in four categories: Men's open, Women's open, Men's Masters and Women's Masters. This is also the first time since 1938 that all four

of the championships have been held in the same location. Significantly, this designation will bring runners from many countries to compete for record-breaking times.

Starting and ending at De Anza College, the race is a full-service event, with pre-race clinics and a special high-carbohydrate dinner the night before the race. Further information may be obtained by writing Mr. Dan O'Keefe, 20032 Rodriquez Ave., Cupertino, CA 95104. The entry fee is \$3 and in-

cludes a race T-shirt.

A strong field of world class runners is anticipated for this year's race with Russ Pate, Herb Lorenz and Paul Thompson already committed. At last year's Champagne Marathon, Jay Helgerson announced that he would run one marathon a week for a year; he will complete his extraordinary feat in this year's run. Toshido d'Elia, at 49, the oldest runner to run a marathon in under three hours, has also entered the race along with Paul Masson, an 11-year-old marathoner who

finished first in his class at the 1979 New York Marathon. Masson the athlete is no relation to Masson the winemaker.)

Entry to the race is by preregistration only. Registration is \$3.00 and closes on January 7, 1980. All sub-three hour runners will be awarded plaques; all subthree; thirty hour women will be awarded plaques. All runners will receive a T-shirt. 




