A graduate course of apparently similar content and competency development taken at another institution may be reviewed by the Administrative Services faculty for the purpose of determining its equivalency to a seminar specified in the CSUF, School of Education program. The determination of equivalency may require an oral and/or a written examination by the Administrative Services faculty.

Students who have questions about the program requirements or possible equivalents taken at other institutions are invited to confer with a member of the CSUF, School of Education Administrative Services faculty.

Pupil Personnel Services Credential

A program of preparation for the *Pupil Personnel Services Credential* is offered through the Department of Advanced Studies, Department of Psychology, or the School of Social Work. The program which leads to the counseling credential has been approved by the Commission for Teacher Preparation and Licensing under provision of the Ryan Act for the Advanced Studies and Psychology tracks. The credential to be issued through the Social Work track is in the process of receiving approval by the Commission.

The School Psychologist Credential program is subject to approval by the Commission for Teacher Preparation and Licensing.

The final granting of all *Pupil Personnel Services Credentials* is subject to approval by the University offering the program.

Application for Admission to the Pupil Personnel Services Credential Program

Following are minimum requirements which must be met for acceptance into the *Pupil Personnel Services Credential Program*:

- a. Application for admission to the *Pupil Personnel Services Credential Program*
- b. Application for admission to graduate standing.
- c. An undergraduate transcript(s) verifying completion of a B.A. or a B.S. degree from an accredited institution, with a grade-point average of 2.5 overall, or 2.75 in the last 60 units of undergraduate course work.
- d. A graduate transcript(s) verifying completion of units past the undergraduate degree.
- e. Three letters of recommendation from instructors, work supervisors, or other persons in a position to make an evaluation of the candidate.
- f. Documentary evidence verifying successful work experience (when applicable).
- g. An autobiography including stated goals, motivation, and potential for professional contribution.
- h. A physical and mental health clearance verified by the CSUF Health Center.
- i. A statement verifying no criminal conviction that would preclude the issuance of a *Pupil Personnel Services Credential*.

Admission Dates

- a. November 30 for admission during the spring semester.
- b. April 30 for admission to either the summer session or fall semester.
